#### BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 5, 2017

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled meeting at 5:30 p.m. in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the Historic Courthouse on Main Street, Hendersonville.

#### **CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME**

Chairman Edney called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

#### INVOCATION

The invocation was provided by County Manager Steve Wyatt.

#### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag was led by Haley Hargus of the Barnyard Bandits 4-H Club.

#### PROCLAMATION - CONSTITUTION WEEK

Commissioner Grady Hawkins stated the Henderson County Board of Commissioners is requested to proclaim the week of September 17 - 23, 2017 as Constitution Week in Henderson County, and ask our citizens to reaffirm the ideals of the Framers of the constitution had in 1787 by protecting the freedoms guaranteed to us through this guardian of our liberties.

Commissioner Hawkins read the proclamation aloud.

Commissioner Hawkins made the motion that the Board adopt the Proclamation designating the week of September 17 - 23, 2017 as Constitution Week in Henderson County. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

#### **INFORMAL PUBLIC COMMENTS**

- 1. Brenda Coates is an owner of property on Lake Osceola. She would like for the Board to consider purchasing the lake and add a special use tax for the people who live around the lake. The lake area is used by many walkers. Much repair has already been done and the remainder of work could be done as a group effort with a possible committee to resolve issues.
- 2. Chris Walters spoke in regard to the Constitution Week Proclamation just adopted. He feels more study of the Constitution is needed, as it is not being followed, especially the 13th and 14th amendment. He asked the Board to not forget the Preamble.
- 3. Bobby Moffitt spoke against the Rezoning Application #R-2017-02. He is concerned about safety and feels the additional heavy trucks will be a hazard. Flooding and run-off continue to be a major issue.

- 4. Ken Fitch thanked the Board for sponsoring the eclipse event. It was a great community event with much enthusiasm and special for families.
- 5. Pat Wagoner is the Chair for the Partnership for Economic Development. The Board of Directors have voted unanimously in favor of the rezoning application. Industrial Zoning will bring much benefit to Henderson County.
- 6. Ryan Casto is the owner of Mountain Showcase and they are looking to grow. At this time there is no industrial zoned land available. The Crest Road site is excellent. His company has no plans to subdivide. They have spoken with neighbors, provided business cards, and want to be a good neighbor.
- 7. Chip Gould is a member of the Partnership for Economic Development. The Economic Development Fund was created for industrial zoning. He asked the Board to vote in favor of the rezoning.

#### County Financial Report/Cash Balance Report – July 2017

The July 2017 County Financial Report and Cash Balance Report were provided for the Board's review and approval.

The following are explanations for departments/programs with higher budget to actual percentages for the month of July:

- Non-Profit Contributions payment of 1<sup>st</sup> quarter Board approved non-profit contributions to agencies
- Information Technology payment of annual software/hardware support maintenance contracts

- EMS purchase/encumbrance of new replacement ambulances approved in the budget
- Economic Development a \$125,000 NC One Grant Fund payment to Raumedic, Inc. in July
- Mental Health 1<sup>st</sup> quarter Maintenance of Effort (MOE) funding payment to Vaya Health

The YTD deficit in the Fire Districts Fund is temporary and is due to several departments needing additional funds to make required payments to meet outstanding obligations in July. The YTD deficit in the Revaluation Reserve Fund is due to the purchase/encumbrance of new vehicles approved in the budget and the payment of software support maintenance, implementation and installation contracts.

The YTD deficit in the Emergency Services Headquarters, the Law Enforcement Training Center (LETC), the Hendersonville High School and the Edneyville Elementary School Projects is due to the payment of architect fees for these projects from appropriated fund balance in the Capital Projects Funds that will be reimbursed from future financings.

The YTD deficits in the Recreation Parks Improvements Projects and the Artificial Turf Field Projects is due to these projects being paid from appropriated fund balance in the Capital Projects Fund primarily from proceeds received from the sale of the Bent Creek property as approved in the prior year's budget.

The YTD deficit in the Westfeldt Park Project from project expenditures to date will be reimbursed from grant funds appropriated in the prior year's budget. The remaining project reimbursement has been requested and is expected to be received in FY2018.

#### Motion:

#### Gerton Fire & Rescue Apparatus Replacement

At the May 16, 2017 Meeting of the Fire and Rescue Advisory Committee, Gerton Fire & Rescue presented a proposal to purchase a 2001 KME Pumper /Tanker, and a 1999 New Lexington Pumper to replace a 1976 Pierce Pumper and a 1986 American LaFrance Pumper.

As part of the budget process the Fire & Rescue Advisory Committee has unanimously approved the purchase of the trucks.

Gerton Fire & Rescue respectfully request the Chairman sign the letter provided to Home Trust Bank.

#### Motion:

I move the Board authorizes the Chairman to sign the letter to Home Trust Bank on behalf of Gerton Fire & Rescue.

#### Mills River Fire and Rescue, Inc. Tax Exempt Loan Agreement

At the May 16, 2017 Meeting of the Fire and Rescue Advisory Committee, Mills River Fire & Rescue presented a proposal to purchase a new Engine/ Pumper as part of their FY 17-18 budget. The total amount financed will be \$571,000 at a fixed interest rate of 2.45% for 7 years. Mills River Fire & Rescue held a public hearing to discuss the loan agreement on July 10, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. at their department.

As part of the budget process the Fire & Rescue Advisory Committee has unanimously approved the

purchase of the truck.

Mills River Fire & Rescue respectfully request the Board of Commissioners adopt the resolution as provided, for the financing with First Citizens Bank.

#### Motion:

I move the Board approves the resolution to First Citizen's Bank on behalf of Mills River Fire & Rescue.

#### Community Foundation Grant - Fund Transfer Request

In February 2017, the Library was awarded a grant from the Community Foundation in the amount of \$16,720. The grant period is from Feb 2017 – Jan 2018, thus covering 2 county fiscal budgets. A portion of the grant was expended during FY17, with the remaining \$11,688 to be expended during F&18. The grant funds currently reside in the general fund and will need to be moved into the Library budget to be expended.

#### Motion:

I move that the Board approves the budget amendment to move the remaining grant funds into the FY18 Library budget.

#### Set Public Hearing for Rezoning Application #R-2017-04, Donald Jones

Rezoning Application #R-2017-04, which was initiated on June 26, 2017 requests the County rezone approximately 19.96 acres of land (thereafter the "Subject Area") from a Residential One (R1) zoning district to an Industrial (I) zoning district (see attached map). The Subject Area is located off of Crest Road.

The Henderson County Technical Review Committee reviewed the rezoning request at its July 18, 2017 meeting and found that the application had met the technical requirements laid out in the Land Development Code. The Henderson County Planning Board reviewed the rezoning request at its July 20<sup>th</sup> and August 17<sup>th</sup>, 2017 meeting and voted to send forth a favorable recommendation.

Before taking action on the rezoning request, the Board of Commissioners must hold a public hearing.

Planning Staff recommends that the Board of Commissioners schedule the public hearing for Monday, October 2, 2017, at 5:30 PM.

#### Motion:

I move that the Board schedules a public hearing for rezoning application #R-2017-04 for Monday, October 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2017, at 5:30 PM.

# FY2018 Rural Operating Assistance Program (ROAP) Application to the North Carolina Department of Transportation

The Henderson County Planning Department Staff has prepared the grant application regarding the FY 2018 North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT) Rural Operating Assistance Program (ROAP) in the amount of \$189,510. Henderson County's FY 2018 allocation remained the same from FY17.

The County receives these grant funds annually and passes them through to Western Carolina Community Action (WCCA), the NCDOT designated Henderson County rural transit provider. WCCA provides transit services according to specified performance standards and supplies the required matching funds for the grant. The grant funds provide for senior and disabled transportation programs, transportation for a WorkFirst education program, and continuation of public transit service to Edneyville, and demand response transit for citizens who live in other rural areas of Henderson County.

Henderson County submits the application on behalf of the operator, Western Carolina Community Action (WCCA). No County funds are required for this program.

#### Motion:

I move the Board approves the Certified Statement and authorize staff to execute all required

documents for the FY 2018 ROAP grant application.

#### **Edneyville and Dana Fire Tax District Revisions**

During November 2016 the Board of Commissioners reviewed a request from the Boards of Edneyville Fire & Rescue and Dana Fire & Rescue to exchange fire districts of certain properties. This exchange would enhance services and improve response times to these properties. At the request of the Board County Staff conducted additional due diligence and resubmitted the proposal in January 2017. The Board requested Representative Chuck McGrady to introduce a local bill to allow the transfer of these parcels.

Staff worked with Rep. McGrady's staff and Mr. Burrell to develop and introduce a local bill with would allow the proposed changes. The adopted bill allows the Board, upon request of both Fire Districts, to transfer parcels between districts upon resolution.

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners is requested to adopt the Resolution as provided, for the Edneyville Fire & Rescue/ Dana Fire & Rescue District Boundary Exchange.

#### Motion:

I move that the Board adopt the Resolution for the Edneyville Fire &Rescue/ Dana Fire& Rescue District Boundary Swap.

#### Request for Pawnshop License - Pulled for a future agenda

Teresa Galloway has applied, on behalf of herself and Robert Dennis Lewis, Jr., pursuant to §20-5 of the Henderson County Code, for a license to conduct the business of pawnbroker within Henderson County, at 5360 Hendersonville Road, Suite 129, Fletcher, NC 28732. This is the first application for a license at this location. She has supplied the documentation for such license, and will submit the \$50 annual fee upon approval.

Under your ordinance, there is an annual renewal of this license by staff, if granted by the Board. §20-6 requires that such applications be brought "for consideration by the Board of Commissioners at a regular scheduled meeting".

#### **DISCUSSION/ADJUSTMENT OF DISCUSSION AGENDA**

Commissioner Messer made the motion to adopt the discussion agenda with the addition of a closed session. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Chairman Edney made the motion to accept the reappointments of Warren Scott to position #1, Jennie Giles for position #2, James Jackson to position #3, John Boyd to position #5, and Leon Pace to position #7 by acclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

3. Environmental Advisory Committee – 1 vac.

Commissioner Thompson nominated Evelyn Warner for position #2. Chairman Edney made the motion to accept the appointment of Evelyn Warner to position #2 by acclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

4. Henderson Tourism Development Authority – 1 vac.

Commissioner Hawkins nominated Biren Patel for position #9 as the Chamber of Commerce suggested appointment. Chairman Edney made the motion to accept the appointment of Biren Patel to position #9 by acclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Thompson nominated Philip Ellis for position #12, Chairman Edney nominated Tricia King for position #13. Chairman Edney made the motion to accept the appointment of Philip Ellis to position #12 and Tricia King to Position #13 by acclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

9. Senior Volunteer Services Advisory Council – 1 vac.

There were no nominations at this time and this item was rolled to the next meeting.

#### AMERICAN RED CROSS – HURRICANE HARVEY UPDATE

Alli Trask, Executive Director for the American Red Cross Asheville-Mountain Area, provided the Board with an update on Red Cross efforts related to Hurricane Harvey.

As of Monday night, 32,000+ people have sought refuge. There are 3100 workers on ground with others to follow. Over 807,000 meals and snacks have been served. Two-hundred and fifteen vehicles have responded. Mental Health and Health assistance is being provided. The emergency app has been and continues to be a huge success and is a great way to keep in touch with families.

The American Red Cross is already preparing for Hurricane Irma, which is now a category 5. The Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico are expected to be hit tomorrow. They will be ready for 120,000 evacuees by the weekend.

The American Red Cross is requesting financial assistance and blood donations. Some donated items have come in with expired dates.

Emergency Management & Rescue Coordinator Jimmy Brissie stated a North Carolina team departed last Thursday. It is a collaborative effort of 18 people from this area, and 98 people total from North Carolina. Since this is the largest team they are considered the Rapid Intervention Team. The team left tonight and is headed back. The team will begin looking at Irma next.

Commissioner Lapsley asked Manager Wyatt if we had an estimated cost for sending the team to Texas?

County Manager Steve Wyatt feels we will be eligible for FEMA reimbursement. It may be 30-60 days before we know the full cost.

Commissioner Thompson requested that the Henderson County volunteers and Red Cross volunteers be invited to a Board meeting to allow for personal recognition.

#### **CONTINUED DISCUSSION ON REZONING APPLICATION #R-2017-02**

John Mitchell stated Rezoning Application #R-2017-02, which was initiated on May 15, 2017 at the request of applicants and owners, who requests the County rezone approximately 37.4 acres of land (thereafter the "Subject Area") from a Residential Two Rural (R2R) and Community Commercial (CC) zoning districts to an Industrial (I) zoning district. The Subject Area is located off Crest Road.

On August 7<sup>th</sup>, the Board of Commissioners held a public hearing. Following public comment, the Board voted to close the public hearing. After some discussion, the Board voted to table the item. The public hearing was noticed according to the LDC and General Statues. Since the public hearing has taken place and been closed, the Board may take action on the item.

If approved, State law requires that the Board adopt a written statement of consistency with the County Comprehensive Plan (CCP). A draft resolution was provided.

John Mitchell stated that he, Commissioner Edney, Marcus Jones, and Autumn Radcliff had met with Steve Cannon with NCDOT. An email was sent asking them to do a specific detailed study of water being deposited, and the NCDOT was very responsive. Their engineer felt it was addressed, but there is a ton of water.

Commissioner Thompson has visited the site and feels most of the run-off is coming from Asheville Packaging. There are approximately 13-16 water catching basins going into one ditch. The run-off is bad and needs to be looked at by NCDOT. Mr. Thompson noted that Asheville Packaging was built before Erosion Control was put into place.

John Mitchell stated the packaging plant is grandfathered in. Staff has been out to the property many times lately, and all ordinances will be enforced.

Commissioner Hawkins would like for the Board to continue to address the problem with NCDOT.

Chairman Edney feels the new company will have to do more than previous companies in order to meet erosion control measures that were not in place before.

Commissioner Lapsley reminded the Board that at its last meeting the Board had recused Commissioner Lapsley from Participating in the discussion and vote on this matter because of a business relationship he has with one of the applicants.

Commissioner Messer made the motion that the Board adopt the resolution regarding the consistency with the CCP and, he further moved that the Board approve rezoning application #R-2017-02 to rezone the Subject Area to an Industrial (I) zoning district based on the recommendations of the Henderson County 2020 Comprehensive Plan and other supporting information. The motion passed 4-0 as Commissioner Lapsley had abstained from voting.

#### FUNDING OPTIONS FOR EDNEYVILLE ELEMENTARY GRAVITY SEWER

Marcus Jones stated during the Board's August 7, 2017 meeting, staff was directed to study the funding options for a proposed gravity sewer to serve Edneyville Elementary. The following options were developed: service district tax, general fund tax, assessment, and reimbursement. Also, staff investigated temporary service to the school between the opening of the school and the completion of the gravity line.

Staff is requesting direction from the Board regarding which sewer option to serve the new Edneyville Elementary school as well as the method of funding. As a reminder from the August meeting, the wastewater options are as follows:

- 1. On-site system: \$700,000 (\$200,000 additional funds)
- 2. Pump Station with force main: \$1.5 million (\$1.0 million additional funds)
- 3. Gravity Sewer: \$4.5 million (\$4.0 million additional funds)


# Gravity Sewer Funding Options for Edneyville Elementary Presentation Outline: Summary of gravity option

- Option 1: General Fund Allocation
- Option 2: County Service District
- Option 3: Assessment
- Option 4: Reimbursement
- Option 5: Negotiate Cost / Revenue Sharing with Hendersonville
- Partial Funding
- Temporary Sewer Service

#### Summary of Gravity Sewer Option

- Cost: \$4,500,000 or \$454,000 annual debt service for 15 years
- Length: approximately 25,000 feet (4.7 miles)
- · Connection to Hendersonville system: Clear Creek near North Henderson High School
- Can be turned over to Hendersonville for ownership or retained by County
- Tentative Layout on next slide (route subject to change during design, permitting and right of way phases of project)
- All the funding options apply if owned by the County or Hendersonville.
- The current zoning on the parcels along the gravity route will allow for the residential development of up to a maximum of 10,766 multi-family units.

Proposed Gracity Sewer Layout



#### Option 1 - General Fund Allocation

• \$4,500,000 allocation from the County's general fund, or pay debt service with annual allocations from the general fund


 This option places the funding responsibility on property owners across the entire County based their property's tax value.

• The debt service impact the County's tax rate: 0.034 cents / \$100 for 15 years

#### Option 2 - County Service District

Requirements to create a County Service District:

- 1. Prepare a report on the proposed district with the following:
  - 1. A map of the district
  - 2. A statement attesting that the district is in need to a greater extent than the rest of the County and meets statutory standards
  - 3. A plan for providing the services in the district
- 2. Make report available for public inspection for at least four weeks before holding a public hearing.
- 3. Hold Public Hearing within at least one week of notice with a mailing to all property owners at least four weeks prior to hearing.
- 4. Adopt a resolution establishing the district to take effect at the beginning of a future fiscal year.
  - Statutory authority: GS 153A-16.1
  - District Boundaries typically would be defined by the outline of the basin that the gravity line serves, see map on next slide.
  - Additional tax rate for District to cover debt service: 6 cents / \$100 for 15 years.



#### Option 3 - Assessment

- Statutory authority: 153A Article 9
- Upon completion of sewer construction, apply an assessment for benefitting property owners.
- Typically the assessment is based on the linear footage of the line within the owner's property.
- Example, for approximately 35 owners the average assessment would be about \$130,000.

#### Option 4 - Reimbursement

- Similar to the Assessment option but payment would occur when the property owner connects to the sewer line.
- Typically, the reimbursement obligation has a limited term (example, 10 years)

#### Option 5 – Negotiate with Hendersonville

Negotiate cost / revenue sharing option with Hendersonville

various options

#### Partial Funding

- Project <u>not eligible</u> for CDBG Grant for school infrastructure due to expanding capacity of wastewater flow. It is intended to replace failing systems.
- Contribution from Justice Academy sewer fund:
  - Better facilitate future pump station at the Academy
  - · State communicated that plant should be replaced with pump station at end of plant life

#### **Temporary Sewer Service**

- Estimated duration of temporary service: 1 to 3 years depending on progress of right of way acquisition
- Temporary use of old septic system: Wastewater engineer has tentatively reported that the State will likely require the addition of pre-treatment at a cost of up to \$300,000 with \$10,000 annual operating cost. However, he is investigating the possibilities with the State and hope to have more definitive answers by the Board meeting.
- Install holding tank and "pump and haul"
  - Initial Cost: less than \$10,000
  - Annual Cost: \$30,000 to \$50,000

Commissioner Hawkins is in favor of an onsite system at the school.

Chairman Edney is concerned with capacity at Sugarloaf and Edneyville with growth.

Bo Caldwell feels there is room for growth with movement of certain programs.

Commissioner Lapsley does not believe that the construction of the gravity sewer line will automatically lead to rapid development of the area being served. He cited the recent gravity sewer line that the City constructed to North Henderson High School.

#### Staff Direction

Commissioner Thompson feels we should contact the City of Hendersonville for options. Collect solid figures as it applies to the Justice Academy for both gravity and pressure systems. Collect School Board projections based on 20,000 over 20 years and how it will affect the population in schools

Commissioner Lapsley stated that he was concerned about building a sewer line to the Edneyville School and turning it over to the City. If that is done, the users (in the County) would relinquish any voice in the operation or rates charged by the City for the service.

The Board made the decision about the Etowah Sewer System that saved the City \$1m that could be applied to this project. The City's policy with regard to customers outside of the city limits, is to annex the property into the city limites at some future date. This puts the customer in an awkward situation.

Commissioner Messer feels we need to talk with the State, collect numbers to extend to the Justice Academy, and continue discussions with the City.

Commissioner Hawkins would like for the Planning Board or Engineer to reach out the the community of those affected to get their input.

Chairman Edney feels a gravity line would be best to prepare for growth. He feels a new comprehensive study needs to be completed.

County Manager Steve Wyatt understands the Board is looking for a detailed impact study. This is not something he can get quickly, probably 60-90 days at least. He will provide a progress report at the next meeting.


#### OFFER TO PURCHASE LAKE OSCEOLA

As directed by the Chairman, the offer to purchase Lake Osceola is presented for Board's consideration.

Should the Board be interested in pursuing the purchase, staff is available to perform a detailed due diligence investigations and report back to the Board. Mr. Todd Leoni will be present to present the offer and answer any questions from the Board.

The following is from an email from Mr. Leoni,

"This email shall serve as my intent to offer Henderson County the exclusive right to purchase Osceola Lake and its right title and interest in the lake including but not limited to full riparian rights that are now vested in my ownership subject to my own use of the lake as well. I have owned the lake for almost 30 years and grew up learning all kind of water sports and fishing on this lake as a little boy. It is very special to me and It is my intent to offer the lake to the county so they can offer it as a public lake. As you know, to build a lake like Osceola today could cost upward of 15 million dollars. I am interested in offering it to the county for 3 million provided that it is maintained as a lake forever, that the county maintains it and manages it and opens it up to the public. I am also the owner of the Mountain lake Inn in North Lakeside Drive and it is vital to my business as well. Being not quite 2 miles from the center of town, I think it would be a great asset for the residents of Hendersonville and especially the visitors including fisherman, bird watchers, bikers, walkers and many other uses. The lake has provided many amenities for many people for many years. I am upgrading the Dam and it will be in full compliance when I turn it over to the county. I will have a much more detailed narrative when I am heard September 5th."



Mr. Leoni stated many people thought they had rights to the lake that did not. It was the intention of the contractor. It is State mandated that the dam be brought up to compliance. He has already spent \$1m to repair the dam. Mr. Leoni is offering the sell to the County so that others may enjoy walking, boating, swimming, etc. He feels it would be an asset to the community. There are 32 acres of lake that he would like to remain as a lake forever.

Chairman Edney told Mr. Leoni that he would be in touch with him. No decision was made.

#### CONDITIONAL LETTER OF MAP REVISION (CLOMR) REQUEST BY NCDOT

Natalie Berry, Project Engineer, stated on August 17, 2017 Mark Shown with the Hydraulics Unit of NCDOT in Raleigh contacted the Henderson County Floodplain Administrator in regards to replacing an existing bridge at the intersection of Hooper Lane and Mills River in the Town of Mills River due to deficiencies. The subject bridge is located at the border of Town of Mills River and Henderson County jurisdiction, and in the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) designated special flood hazard area (SFHA).

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This project proposes to replace the existing bridge with one that is larger in size and will increase the flood water elevation by 0.2 feet on properties located in Henderson County. For affected parcels of land, see map provided. One of the affected parcels is located outside of the special flood hazard area prior to replacement and would be included after replacement.

NCDOT has four (4) alternatives to the current design that would not affect the adjacent property owners, which are included as part of this item.

Before NCDOT can proceed with construction, a community official must sign an acknowledgement form either in agreement or disagreement with the project. In addition, the community must send notification letters to those affected properties making them aware of the potential increase. The acknowledgement form and a sample letter are included in this packet for information.

It was consensus of the Board to wait until after Natalie's meeting with Mills River to make a decision.

This item will return to an agenda at a future date.



The Board heard discussion on the Resolution, and no action was taken.


#### **CHARTER OF FREEDOM MONUMENT**


