The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled meeting at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the Historic Courthouse on Main Street, Hendersonville.

Those present were: Chairman Tommy Thompson, Vice-Chairman Charlie Messer, Commissioner Grady Hawkins, Commissioner Mike Edney, Commissioner William Lapsley, County Manager Steve Wyatt, Assistant County Manager Amy Brantley, Attorney Russ Burrell and Clerk to the Board Teresa Wilson.

Also present were: Engineer Marcus Jones, Finance Director J. Carey McLelland, Management Assistant Megan Powell, Environmental Programs Coordinator Rachel Kipar and PIO Kathy Finotti –videotaping, and Deputy Ken McCraw as security.

CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

Chairman Thompson called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

Commissioner Messer made the motion for the Board to convene as Cane Creek Water & Sewer District Board. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

MINUTES

Draft minutes were presented for CCWSD Board review and approval of the following meeting(s): February 1, 2016

Commissioner Hawkins made the motion to approve the minutes of February 1, 2016 as presented. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

<u>FLETCHER ACADEMY SECOND PROPOSAL - EXPAND MUD CREEK INTERCEPTOR PROJECT</u>

On February 1, 2016, the Board directed staff to continue negotiating the original offer from Fletcher Academy, Inc. (FAI) to extend the District's Mud Creek Interceptor and provide sewer service to their campus. A letter from FAI dated August 11, 2016 contains their follow up offer increasing their proposed contribution to the project to \$1,025,000. Staff recommends Board approval of the revised offer.

Staff requests the Board give direction to staff to develop an agreement with Fletcher Academy based on their second proposal to contribute \$1,025,000 to the District's Mud Creek Interceptor project from Riverstone subdivision to Fletcher Academy campus.

Staff informed the Board of funding that may be eligible from a State wide Bond referendum set aside for sewer projects. Staff was directed to apply for the grant.

Commission Edney would like a request to the citizens with the easement for greenway.

Commissioner Lapsley made the motion that the Board direct staff to develop an agreement with Fletcher Academy based on their second proposal to contribute \$1,025,000 to the District's Mud Creek Interceptor project from Riverstone subdivision to Fletcher Academy campus subject to commitment of the state grant. The motion passed 4-1 with Chairman Thompson voting nay.

Dear Mr. Jones:

As you know, Fletcher Academy, Inc. (FAI) submitted a letter in January offering to partner with the Cane Creek Water & Sewer District in the construction of the proposed Mud Creek Interceptor. The Cane Creek Board of Directors considered this offer at their meeting on February 1, 2016. At that meeting, one of the Commissioners suggested a counter offer that the District pay for the cost of the Mud Creek Interceptor to Hendersonville Road and FAI pay for the remaining portion. They also indicated that CCWSD could participate in the cost of upsizing the interceptor beyond Hendersonville Road and then to submit to the Cane Creek Board of Directors a new proposal.

Since that meeting FAI has continued to evaluate options for wastewater treatment and disposal. Additionally, FAI has confirmed (to the extent possible), the required connection fees to both CCWSD and MSD based on current published rates and existing water meter sizes. Those connection fees are estimated to be \$286,224.00.

FAI has also continued to explore the options of constructing a new treatment facility to replace the existing system. NCDEQ has provided firm speculative limits for the discharge. Based on these limits, we are comfortable that a new facility could be constructed for the budget presented to you with our initial letter.

Taking all of this into consideration, FAI still believes it is in our best interest and the best interest of the greater community to connect to the public system. So after much study and reflection, FAI would like to reaffirm our interest in connecting to the Cane Creek system. In the spirit of cooperation, we also agree to increase our proposed contribution to \$1,025,000.00. This does not include the connection fees referenced above.

Please understand that this proposal, combined with the connection fees, is a significant financial commitment for FAI, but we do believe it is the best solution for all involved. If this proposal is acceptable, FAI would like to meet with County and CCWSD staff to establish the financial arrangements and details of the agreement.
