#### BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MONDAY, MARCH 7, 2016

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled meeting at 5:30 p.m. in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the Historic Courthouse on Main Street, Hendersonville.

#### CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

Chairman Thompson called the meeting to order, welcomed all in attendance.

#### INVOCATION

The invocation was provided by County Manager Steve Wyatt.

#### **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

The Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag was led by Rebecca Pereira, from the Nebula Navigators 4-H Club.

#### <u>RESOLUTION IN MEMORIAM – DR. GEORGE JONES</u>

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners is requested to adopt a Resolution in Memoriam for Dr. George Alexander Jones, who passed away on February 12, 2016. Dr. Jones was born in Saluda in 1920. He founded the Henderson County Genealogical and Historical Society and worked tirelessly to preserve the Henderson County Historic Courthouse.

Chairman Thompson read the resolution aloud.

Commissioner Hawkins made the motion that the Board adopts the Resolution of Memoriam for Dr. George Alexander Jones. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

#### RECOGNITION

Chairman Thompson recognized and introduced Dot Case and her AB Government class from North Henderson High School.

Chairman Thompson recognized and introduced Seth Hendricks of Troup 610. Mr. Hendricks was in attendance working toward his Star Merit Badge.

#### **INFORMAL PUBLIC COMMENTS**

1. District Attorney Greg Newman – Mr. Newman explained he came before the Board in February asking for help finding additional office space at the 1995 Courthouse. He thanked the Board for their quick response and his new space on the ground floor. The plan being presented tonight is a great plan and staff did a wonderful job.

Dennis Justice – Mr. Justice asked the Board to reconsider their vote supporting Connect NC, send a grant to help the State's Hemp Commission, and send a letter to the Governor opposing the toll road on I-77 and other toll roads. #### Financial Reports – January 2016

The January 2016 County Financial Report and Cash Balance Report were provided for the Board's review and approval. The following are explanations for departments/programs with higher budget to actual percentages for the month of January:

- Facility Services planned maintenance project expenditures incurred through January
- Fire Services payment of annual worker's compensation coverage premium for the fire departments
- EMS the purchase of three new ambulance units approved in the budget
- Rescue Squad 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter approved non-profit contribution payment
- Soil & Water Conservation contracted services payment (\$125,000) on a grant-funded streambank restoration project
- Economic Development economic development incentive payments paid in December
- Agri-Business operational expenditures to be covered by Agri-Business program fees to be transferred in
- Mental Health 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter MOE payment made to the Smoky Mountain Center in January

The YTD deficit in the CDBG – Dodd Meadows Project Fund is temporary and due to a timing delay between the expenditure of grant funds on the project and the subsequent reimbursement of expended funds from the Division of Community Assistance.

The YTD deficit in the Public Transit Fund is due to operational expenditures running slightly ahead of revenues through January.

The YTD deficit in the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Fund is from the transfer of the remaining funds available to the County's General Fund due to completion of participation in this federal program by the Sheriff's Department. Final ICE Program participation and funding ceased as of December 31, 2014.

The YTD deficit in the Westfeldt Park Project is due to the payment of project expenditures and the subsequent reimbursement of grant funds from the NCDENR – Recreational Trails Grant Program.

The YTD deficit in the Cane Creek Water & Sewer District Fund is due to ongoing expenditures for multiple sewer capital projects. A total of \$2.478 million in fund balance, primarily for these capital projects, was budgeted to balance this Fund and cover these capital expenditures in the current fiscal year.

#### Henderson County Public Schools Financial Report - January 2016

The Henderson County Public Schools January 2016 Local Current Expense Fund / Other Restricted Funds Financial Report was provided for the Board's information.

#### Motion:

I move that the Board of Commissioners approves the Henderson County Public Schools January 2016 Financial Report as presented.

#### Food for Fines Amnesty Campaign

Since 1958, National Library Week has been observed each April by libraries across the country. This year's observation will be held April 10-16 across our library system. Our focus throughout this weeklong event will be to promote the use and support of library services to both current and prospective library card holders.

Library staff is proposing the launch of a Food for Fines amnesty campaign, to be held annually during National Library Week. This amnesty campaign will provide opportunity for library patrons to donate canned or non-perishable food items in exchange for fine forgiveness. One unit of donated food will waive up to \$1 of overdue fines on one account. Please note that Food for Fines will not apply to lost/damaged items or collection agency fees — only fines associated with overdue materials. Collected food items will be distributed to Henderson County food pantries.

A Food for Fines amnesty campaign will encourage delinquent library patrons to once again become patrons in good standing, which will in turn benefit our local community.

#### Motion:

I move that the Board approves the annual Food for Fines amnesty campaign as presented by library staff.

## Set Public Hearing for Land Development Code (LDC) and Noise Ordinance Text Amendments (TX-2015-01)

With the adoption of the Land Development Code (LDC) on September 19, 2007, the Board of Commissioners directed staff to prepare annual updates to the LDC to prevent it from becoming outdated. This annual review is intended to prevent the need for a large overhaul of the entire code in the future. Trends and new issues are regularly emerging that require periodic updates to LDC text.

The proposed text amendments included: sign amendments based on recent court rulings, clarifications to the code for boards and committees, creating uniform setbacks, reduce requirements for accessory residential dwellings and amendments identified by the Sherriff's Office which include a new temporary use for special events and amendments to the noise ordinance.

The Henderson County Planning Board has been discussing the draft text amendments for several meetings and voted to send forward a favorable recommendation on the attached draft LDC and Noise Ordinance text amendments (TX-2015-01).

#### Motion:

I move that the Board sets a public hearing on the proposed Land Development Code and Noise Ordinance Text Amendments (TX-2015-01) for Monday, April 4, 2016 at 5:30 p.m.

#### Policy on newspaper notice advertisement process

Current Board policy requires the placement of legal notice advertisements mandated by North Carolina law to be placed by the sponsoring department of Henderson County government. The Board has directed specific procedures for certain of the notices (advertisement for the annual tax notice, specific placement authorizations for others) but has not examined its policy for publication in over ten years, during which period the market has significantly changed.

The Board is requested to allow a request for proposals ("RFP") for all required notice publication for all County purposes, based on a cost for a standard advertisement (pricing models "per inch" are inexact for comparison across newspapers, given the difference in print formats between local newspapers meeting the required standard for legal publication).

#### Motion:

I move that the Board permits the County Attorney to request proposals for all required notice publication for County purposes from newspapers meeting the standard for legal publication within the County.

#### USDA Grant Amendment - Old Fairgrounds Site Development & Grading Project

For the subject project and in order to receive the additional funding for the Appalachian Regional Commission grant (administered by US Department of Agriculture), staff requests Board approval of the resolution and for the Chairman to sign the Letter of Intent and Request for Obligation of Funds. The letter from Pam Hysong, Area Director for USDA provides details for the funding and required documents.

#### Motion:

I move that the Board approves of the following for the grant amendment with the US Department of Agriculture for the development of the Old Fairgrounds site: Resolution to Accept Amendment, Letter of Intent to Meet Conditions and Request for Obligation of Funds.

#### Resolution supporting NCDOT receiving funds for the Summerwind Project

The North Carolina Department of Transportation (NCDOT), requests approval of the Resolution supporting NCDOT receiving funding for the Summerwind Project. KDS (Kiln Dry Systems) is located in Etowah/Horse Shoe and expanding their facility with an investment of \$1.4 million, and the creation of additional 19 jobs with an average salary in excess of \$50,500.

The existing gravel road, Summerwind Drive, is not sufficient for the needs of the KDS commercial truck traffic. NCDOT has approved a request for Economic Development Funds in the amount of \$180,000. The anticipated project overrun of \$130,000 is expected due to a utility pole relocation exceeding the original estimate by \$20,000 and the replacement of a private waterline at a cost of \$110,000.00

NCDOT is requesting \$111,000 from the Senate and House Contingency Funds, with the remainder to be funded

by NCDOT Economic Development Funds. The total funding is approximately \$310,000.00.

No county funds are being requested.

Motion:

I move the Board approves the Resolution in support of NCDOT receiving funding for the Summerwind Project.

#### **DISCUSSION/ADJUSTMENT OF DISCUSSION AGENDA**

Chairman Thompson made the motion to approve discussion agenda as presented. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Chairman Thompson made the motion to accept the reappointments of Steve Dozier to position #2, John Porter to position #4, and Michael Earle to position #8 by acclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

4. Hendersonville Business Advisory Committee – 1 vac.

Commissioner Hawkins nominated Tom Cooper for position #1.

Chairman Thompson made the motion to accept the reappointment of Tom Cooper to position #1 by acclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

5. Hendersonville City Zoning Board of Adjustment – 1 vac.

Commissioner Messer nominated Aaron Black for position #1.

Chairman Thompson made the motion to accept the appointment of Aaron Black to position #1 by acclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

6. Historic Resources Commission - 1 vac.

Commissioner Lapsley nominated Walter Ray Bryson, Jr. for position #5.

Chairman Thompson made the motion to accept the appointment of Walter Ray Bryson, Jr. to position #5 by acclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

7. Industrial Facilities and Pollution Control Financing Authority – 1 vac. Commissioner Messer nominated Kelly Leonard for position #5.

Chairman Thompson made the motion to accept the reappointment of Kelly Leonard to position #5 by acclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

8. Juvenile Crime Prevention Council – 5 vac.

There were no nominations at this time and this item was rolled to the next meeting.

9. Mountain Valleys Resource Conservation and Development Program -1 vac. There were no nominations at this time and this item was rolled to the next meeting.

10. Nursing/Adult Care Home Community Advisory Committee – 4 vac. Commissioner Lapsley nominated Martha Sachs for position #1.



#### **SPACE ALLOCATION FOR 1995 COURTHOUSE**

Chairman Thompson stated at the February 1, 2016 meeting, the Board appointed a committee to review space needs and Phase III of the '95 Courthouse Security Upgrades. The Committee, which is comprised of Chairman Thompson, Commissioner Edney, Sheriff McDonald, Clerk of Court Kim Gasperson-Justice, Assistant County Manager Amy Brantley and County Engineer Marcus Jones, has met and considered input from other key stakeholders in the facility, and will be prepared to present a proposal to the Board at this meeting.




### **Proposed Space**



(Red) The space for the New Law Library currently houses two public defenders offices. Their offices will be relocated.





(Purple) This area currently houses small claims court. With minor modifications, such as moving the Judge's bench back and building a new wall, new Judge's chambers will be made.






The area in orange currently houses a victims waiting room, which will be moved upstairs. The area will become a staff break area for the District Attorney and Public Defender Offices.







(Yellow, Green, Purple) The Public Defender, Tax/Land Records, and Shared space is currently vacant. Dark black lines denote new walls. The Public Defender will have a lot more space and more offices.


(Green) Tax/Land Records is designated for the Tax Office, however the best fit hasn't been worked out yet.

(Purple) This space is the old Guardian Ad-Litem Space. It is proposed to be one private office, and the additional area being used for meeting spaces and can be cooked by the Clerk of Courts office or other groups. Arbitration nor Mediation happen every day.


(Pink) The Register of Deeds believes he can put the plat cabinets on both sides and move them out of his existing office. This will give him more space for shelving.

(Blue) The VIP Area is an area needed by the Sheriff's Department of about 600 sf for Volunteers and Partnership. They currently lease space at the Blue Ridge Mall.

Ms. Brantley believes the renovation cost will be minimal. Much of the carpet has been cleaned and has remaining life. Carpet may have to be replaced in the Public Defender's office.





The staircase is an integral part of the design but not included in the pictures. The cost to move the staircase a short distance ranged from \$150,000 - \$200,000. As an alternative, the staircase will remain and better use of the existing space utilized. Chairman Thompson feels the steps are necessary for movement of traffic with only two elevators.




(Blue) This area is at the front entrance and will be designated for the Sheriff's Office for security. A new door will exist on the right where Land Records currently exists. The New Security Area is the same length and width as what is currently being utilized on the ground floor.


Commissioner Lapsley has concern with a crowding of people at the front door, spilling out onto the front steps. Chairman Thompson and Ms. Brantley believe the vestibule area is large enough to hold most people and the porch is also covered. The New Entry Doors will be changed from sliding doors with push bar doors. Security will be fully evaluated.







A small door will be installed in the current law library. (Yellow) To accommodate the courtroom a jury room will be made by removing a couple of walls. (Green) This area will be the new victim waiting area.






(Brown) The Attorney/Client Meeting Room requires the movement of a door. The new security door will allow judges to move from courtrooms behind secured walls.







The security door above will be installed with an automatic open mechanism that automatically opens if the fire alarms goes off. This will be a secondary egress from the courtrooms to the staircase in case of emergency.

Chairman Thompson stated everyone seems happy with the plan. A couple of things need to be followed up on which apply to code and security measures.

Commissioner Messer questioned the timeframe.

Ms. Brantley responded that much of the work can be completed inhouse. She would have to get with the team to give an accurate timeframe. Offices will be moving in two weeks.

Commissioner Lapsley questioned the location of the handicapped elevator, and questioned if the Tax Office and Register of Deeds would still have to be moved.

Ms. Brantley responded the handicapped elevator would be on the north side of the staircase.

Commissioner Edney feels the Tax Office will have to be moved in the future for another courtroom to be added. He also noted that cameras still have to be installed for security.

Commissioner Hawkins made the motion that the Board directs staff to continue with the plans and implement the plans as discussed. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

#### **CONNECT NC BOND ACT**

Dr. Molly Parkhill, President of Blue Ridge Community College, updated the Board on the Connect NC Bond Act, which will be on the Tuesday, March 15, 2016 Primary General Election ballot. On February 1, 2016, the Henderson County Board of Commissioners adopted a Resolution in Support of the Bond.

According to the 2015 population estimates released by the U.S. Census Bureau, North Carolina surpassed Michigan to become the ninth most populous state. The State has seen the population grow by 2 million people since 2000, and there is a need to expand and repair existing infrastructure to ensure we can meet the demands of our growing population, continue the development of new jobs, and grow our economy.

Locally, if passed, the bond would provide \$2.96 million to Blue Ridge Community College for construction, repairs and renovations to the campus. This will include a new biology and chemistry lab, Phase II of the Advanced Manufacturing program, and expansion of Law Enforcement.

- No tax increases would be necessary to finance the bond, given the state's strong revenue growth and ample debt service capacity.
- The \$2 billion infrastructure bond will connect North Carolina to the 21<sup>st</sup> century through statewide investments in higher education, agriculture, stated parks, National Guard and water and sewer infrastructure. It's been 15 years since the last general obligation bond was authorized to upgrade our state's infrastructure in 2000. Since then North Carolina has grown by more than 2 million people.
- About two-thirds of the bond would benefit higher education, 16 percent would pay for improvements in
  parks and in sewer and water infrastructure, 9 percent would go to agricultural projects, 5 percent would be
  allocated to the North Carolina Zoo, and 4 percent would be spend on the National Guard and public safety.

Commissioner Hawkins reiterated that no new taxes were foreseen due to debt payoff. The facilities will be paid off in 25 years and available for 50 years. The Board of Commissioners are responsible for Blue Ridge Community College as well as the schools. Needs must be met and if the Bond is not used, local taxes would have to be raised. With the Bonds, very low interest rates are received. He expressed that citizens need to vote for the Connect NC Bond.

Steve Wyatt explained that Board of Commissioner debt is on the same premise. North Carolina will now be competitive. Colleges must provide the necessary training.

#### **COUNTY MANAGER'S REPORT**

Mr. Wyatt informed the Board that the Report from Vannoy on Hendersonville High School is expected in the next couple of weeks. The plan is to have it included on the March 16<sup>th</sup> agenda.

Flags are at half-staff in honor of the passing of former First Lady Nancy Reagan.

#### CLOSED SESSION

The Board is requested to go into closed session pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §143-318.11(a), for the following reason(s):

Pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §143-318.11(a)(4), to discuss matters relating to the location or expansion of industries or other businesses in Henderson County, including agreement on a tentative list of economic development incentives that may be offered by the Board in negotiations.

Commissioner Edney made the motion that the Board go into closed session pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §143-318.11(a) (4) for the reasons set out in the Request for Board Action in the Board's agenda packet. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

#### RESOLUTION OF MEMORIAM

Dr. George Alexander Jones August 2, 1920 - February 12, 2016

- WHEREAS, Dr. George Alexander Jones was born in Henderson County, was a Saluda native, who graduated from Saluda High School, attended college at Lees-McCrae College and Lenoir-Rhyne College receiving a master's degree in theology and a Ph.D. from the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky. Dr. Jones also served our country in the United States Army; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. George Alexander Jones spent many years as a pastor in Kentucky, returning to Henderson County upon his retirement where he served as an interim pastor in various churches around Henderson County; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. George Alexander Jones was a man with a passion for history and genealogy founding the Henderson County Genealogical and Historical Society, he worked tirelessly to record the heritage of Henderson County and document the county's historic cemeteries; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. George Alexander Jones was a key figure in saving the Henderson County Historic Courthouse from demolition; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. George Alexander Jones was a leader in preserving Henderson County's history helping to form the Henderson County Heritage Museum; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. George Alexander Jones was recognized by the Society of North Carolina Historians as the Historian of Western North Carolina; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. George Alexander Jones spent many years of his life serving his community, making it a better place to live. History, and the citizens of Henderson County, will remember Dr. George Alexander Jones as someone who left the community better than he found it:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Dr. George Alexander Jones will be remembered for his legacy of recording and preserving the history of Henderson County, and his many contributions to our community.

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the County of Henderson to be affixed.

#### RESOLUTION

In Support of North Carolina Department of Transportation receiving funding for the Summerwind Project

WHEREAS, the Henderson County Board of Commissioners supports and encourages economic development in Henderson County to grow the local economy and tax base; and,

WHEREAS, KDS (Kiln Dry Systems) located in Etowah/Horse Shoe is expanding an existing facility with an investment of \$1.4 million, and the creation of an additional 19 jobs with average salary in excess of \$50,500; and,

WHEREAS, the Henderson County Board of Commissioners supports and encourages the expansion of KDS within Etowah/Horse Shoe/Horse Shoe; and,

WHEREAS, the existing gravel road, Summerwind Drive, is not sufficient for the needs of the KDS commercial truck traffic,

WHEREAS, NCDOT added SR 2421, Summerwind Drive to the State Maintained road system effective October 8, 2015

WHEREAS, the Board of Transportation approved a request for Economic Development Funds in the amount of \$180,000 effective June 4, 2015

WHEREAS, there is an anticipated project overrun of \$130,000 due to the following;

- \$20,000 utility pole relocations will exceed original estimate by \$20,000
- \$110,000 a private waterline was located during construction which will need to be replaced. In coordination with the City of Hendersonville this line will be replaced and combined with an adjacent line. Upon installation the line shall be maintained by the City of Hendersonville providing service to a Nursery and a Residential Community

WHEREAS, of the anticipated \$130,000 overrun NCDOT is requesting \$111,000 from the Senate and House Contingency Funds with the remainder to be funded by NCDOT Economic Development Funds

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Henderson County Board of Commissioners hereby fully supports the North Carolina Department of Transportation improving Summerwind Drive and fully supports the North Carolina Department of Transportation receiving total funding of approximately \$310,000 for the same.
