#### **MINUTES**

#### STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA COUNTY OF HENDERSON

#### BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 21, 2012

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled meeting at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the Historic Courthouse on Main Street, Hendersonville.

Those present were: Chairman Tommy Thompson, Vice-Chairman Bill O'Connor, Commissioner Larry Young, Commissioner Michael Edney, Commissioner Charlie Messer, County Manager Steve Wyatt, Interim Assistant County Manager David Whitson, County Attorney Russ Burrell and Clerk to the Board Teresa Wilson.

Also present were: Public Information Officer Christy DeStefano, Finance Director J. Carey McLelland, Planning Director Anthony Starr, Engineer Marcus Jones, Research/Budget Analyst Amy Brantley, Planner Parker Sloan, Library Director Bill Snyder, Assessor/Tax Collector Stan Duncan, Senior Planner Autumn Radcliff, Planner Matt Cable, Internal Auditor Darlene Burgess, and HR Director Jan Pritchard.

#### CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

Chairman Thompson called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

#### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag was led by Commissioner Edney.

#### **OUTSTANDING PLANNING AWARD FOR DANA COMMUNITY PLAN**

Planning Director Anthony Starr stated that over the years, current and previous Commissioners have provided sound leadership through a commitment to planning. Planning is important because a community can essentially make two (2) decisions; plan to make things happen, or wait for things to happen to the community. Last month at the annual conference of the North Carolina Chapter of the American Planning Association, Henderson County was awarded the 2012 Marvin Collins Award for outstanding planning and comprehensive planning in a large jurisdiction, the Dana Community Plan. Henderson County competes with the largest local governments in the state, (i.e., Charlotte, Raleigh). The American Planning Association noted when presenting the award last month that the model should be used for other planning efforts in the state. Henderson County has now received this award three times, 2005, 2009, and 2012. Henderson County is the only county local government, within recent history, to receive this award three times. Mr. Starr presented the award to the Board of Commissioners.

#### **CHAT JONES MEMORIAM**

Chairman Thompson spoke in regard to Chester Allen "Chat" Jones and his recent death. Mr. Jones was well known by many people and affected many lives. The Commissioners presented a Resolution in Memoriam of Chat Jones to his wife Judy Jones. Chairman Thompson read the resolution aloud and a copy of the resolution is hereby attached and incorporated as a part of these minutes. As part of the Resolution, Fields 8 & 9 of Jackson Park will be dedicated as "Chat Jones Memorial Fields."

#### **PUBLIC HEARINGS**

Public Hearing on CDBG Catalyst Application for the Habitat for Humanity Dodd Meadows Project Commissioner Messer made the motion that the Board go into public hearing in regard to CDBG Catalyst Application for the Habitat for Humanity Dodd Meadows Project. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Parker Sloan stated Henderson County Habitat for Humanity requests the County to apply for a CDBG Catalyst application on behalf of their Dodd Meadows neighborhood off Crest Road. The Catalyst grant cycle is beginning and Henderson County is eligible to apply for up to a \$500,000 grant. However, a process of hearings for the application is required. The Board has held the initial hearing and this second public

hearing is required. The purpose of the second hearing is to receive public comment regarding the proposed application.

The CDBG funds will be used to support Henderson County Habitat for Humanity's Dodd Meadows residential development for moderate and low income persons in the County. Up to \$250,000 of the grant would be used for road and utility improvements to serve new residential homes. The grant will fund road improvements including paving, curbing, and storm water drainage improvements, as well as, public water and sewer extension for a portion of phase two of the Dodd Meadows project. Up to an additional \$250,000 would be used to fund the construction of a community center within the Dodd Meadows development that would serve the Dodd Meadows neighborhood as well as the broader community.

No local match (County funds) is required for this grant.

#### Public Input

There was none.

Commissioner Edney made the motion that the Board go out of public hearing. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Messer made the motion that the Board authorizes staff to apply for the grant on behalf of the County and authorize the Planning Director to execute and submit all necessary documents on behalf of the County. The motion passed 4-1 with Commissioner O'Connor voting nay.

Commissioner Messer made the motion that the Board approves and adopts the resolution authorizing the Planning Director to sign NC Commerce Department Reports and Documents. All voted in favor and the motion carried. The motion passed 4-1 with Commissioner O'Connor voting nay.

#### INFORMAL PUBLIC COMMENT

All speakers spoke in regard to the Flat Rock Playhouse and possible funding by Henderson County.

- 1. Terry Neal Mr. Neal feels the community cannot let Flat Rock Playhouse (FRP) go bankrupt as it is invaluable. He does feel there are management issues. FRP books need to be available for accountability. Mr. Neal would like to present a solution. He requested that Henderson County continue to fund FRP.
- 2. Ronald Jenkins Mr. Jenkins feels FRP has made bad business decisions including the second venue on Main Street. Management is spending beyond their means. He asked that Henderson County not fund FRP.
- 3. Glen Englram Mr. Englram feels that governments should not pick winners and losers for funding by the citizen tax dollars. Commissioners are to be good stewards of tax money.
- 4. Eva Ritchey Mrs. Ritchey is concerned about the economy and health of the community. She feels FRP brings in millions to Henderson County, yet they are the lowest supported theater in the United States. Mrs. Ritchey has spoken with tourists, and they have voiced their concerns about FRP closing.
- 5. Dennis Justice Mr. Justice does not support funding for FRP. He also spoke against the purchase of the Hendersonville Christian School. Mr. Justice would rather the money be spent on the schools and infrastructure. Winners and losers shouldn't be picked by the Board.
- 6. Janice Parker Mrs. Parker is against sinking taxpayer money into the FRP. She feels productions offered by FRP, in the last few years, have become less favorable. Mrs. Parker feels when in doubt, don't fund.
- 7. Steve Carlisle Mr. Carlisle does not feel that FRP listens to ideas of others. Their meetings should be open and publicized. He would like to see the 990's for 2011.

Mr. Carlisle also suggested a "Chat Jones Day" in Henderson County where citizens could volunteer to do public service.

#### New Ambulance and Emergency Medical Services Equipment Financing

A request was made and approved by the Commissioners at the regularly scheduled September 4, 2012 Board meeting to purchase two (2) new ambulances to replace the final two units being leased and due to expire in December 2012. Emergency Medical Services is also in need of replacing its manual defibrillators due to constant failure and repair of the equipment. The current defibrillators are older technology and over 7 years old. The vendor, ZOLL, is providing a \$48,000 trade-in allowance for the old equipment. The purchase of the new ambulances and equipment is proposed to be financed through a bank installment financing contract at a fixed interest rate with annual payments over a 4-year term.

Staff requested proposals from financial institutions to finance the purchase of the two (2) new ambulances and seven (7) manual defibrillators at a total cost not to exceed \$413,539. Attached for the Board's review are the results of the financing proposals that were received from five (5) financial institutions.

First Citizens Bank has been certified as the lowest responsive proposal to finance the new ambulances and emergency medical equipment over a 4-year term at a tax-exempt interest rate of 1.25 percent. The first annual payment debt service payment of \$106,635.59 will not be due until December 2014 and will be included in the proposed FY2014 budget.

#### Motion:

I move that the Board of Commissioners approves the resolution accepting the proposal from First Citizens Bank to finance the new ambulances and emergency medical equipment authorizing the Chairman and Staff to execute and deliver the required financing documents. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

#### Petition for addition to State Road system

Staff received the petitions to add Rebels Lair to the state road system. It has been the practice of this Board to accept road petitions and forward them to NC Department of Transportation for their review. It has also been the practice of the Board not to ask NCDOT to change the priority for roads on the paving priority list.

Staff reviewed the petitions and it appears that all affected property owners or developers have signed the required petition.

#### Motion:

I move that the Board approves the petition and direct staff to forward it to NCDOT.

#### PRESENTATION FROM VICE-CHAIRMAN BILL O'CONNOR

Vice-Chairman Bill O'Connor has been working on framed replicas of the Declaration of Independence in the Constitution for the Board of Commissioners' meeting room and presented them to the Board for approval.

Commissioner Edney made the motion that the Board approves the framed replicas of the Declaration of Independence in the Constitution to be placed in the meeting room. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

#### BLUE RIDGE COMMUNITY COLLEGE UPDATE

Dr. Molly Parkhill could not be present and this item was pulled from the agenda.

#### FLAT ROCK PLAYHOUSE FUNDING - Add on

The Board discussed the \$100,000 in funding that was budgeted for the Flat Rock Playhouse.

Mr. Duane McKibben was present and noted that the Flat Rock Playhouse books are open and that the 990's for 2011 are available. He also stated that their meetings are open to the public. Flat Rock Playhouse does carry a heavy debt load and they are running out of cash. Sell of tickets is imperative.

Commissioner O'Connor made the motion to suspend payments to Flat Rock Playhouse. The motion passed on the first reading by a 4-1 vote with Commissioner Edney voting nay. The second reading will be possible at the Board's December meeting.

#### HENDERSON COUNTY AUDIT RESULTS FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2012

Mrs. Erica Brown, CPA and Audit Manager with our external audit firm, Martin Starnes and Associates, CPAs P.A. provided a short presentation on the fiscal year ended June 30, 2012 audit results. Mrs. Brown and Carey McLelland, Finance Director will be available to answer any questions the Board of Commissioners and Management may have regarding the results of the audit.

Draft copies of the Comprehensive Annual Financial Report (CAFR) and Compliance Letters were provided to the Board and Management at the meeting as the Local Government Commission (LGC) had not given their final approval prior to the agenda deadline. We don't expect any substantive changes to the report by the LGC. Final bound copies of the report will be provided to the Board and Management as soon as they have been printed and received.

The Finance Director was available to discuss any questions the Board and Management may have after reviewing the report in detail. The final report will also be placed on the County's website for the public to view and placed in the main branch of the public library.
