The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled meeting at 5:30 p.m. in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the Historic Courthouse on Main Street, Hendersonville.

CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

Chairman Thompson called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

1. Dennis Justice – Mr. Justice is against the purchase of Hendersonville Christian School. He feels funds would be better used to install artificial turf on the fields at current schools instead of purchasing another school.

Tax Collector's Report

Tax Collector Clerk Kathy Johnson had presented the Tax Collector's Report to the Commissioners dated September 25, 2012 for information only. No action was required.

County Financial Report/Case Balance Report - August 2012

The August 2012 County Financial Report and Cash Balance Report were provided for the Board's review and approval.

The following are explanations for departments/programs with higher budget to actual percentages for the month of August:

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• Dues/Non-Profit Contributions – 1st quarter non-profit contribution payments paid in advance

- Elections annual voting equipment hardware and software maintenance contract paid in July
- Finance operating expenditures through August running slightly ahead of budget for the current fiscal year
- Register of Deeds printing and binding costs covered by a budget amendment from the ROD's restricted fund balance for automation and enhancements
- Emergency Management one time purchase of capital outlay equipment (mobile light towers) approved in the current fiscal year budget
- Rescue Squad 1st quarter non-profit contribution payment paid in advance
- Code Enforcement operating expenditures through August running slightly ahead of budget for the year
- Mental Health payment of mental health maintenance of effort funds appropriated for the fiscal year and paid in July to Western Highlands Area Mental Health Authority
- Public Library blanket purchase order encumbrance for the purchase of publications throughout the fiscal year
- Non-Departmental 1st quarter property and liability insurance premium paid in July and to be allocated out to all departments

The YTD deficit in the Revaluation Reserve Fund is due to a July payment of \$23k for N.C Property Tax System version updates/enhancements being implemented.

The YTD deficit in the Emergency Telephone System (911) Fund is due to an annual debt service payment due in August on financing for the 911 Center Renovation Project that began in August 2008. Fund balance of \$271,713 was appropriated to cover expenditures in this Fund for FY2013.

The YTD deficit in the CDBG – the Mud Creek Grant Project Fund and the CDBG – Talley Drive Grant Project Fund is due to the timing difference between the expenditure of grant funds and subsequent reimbursement from the state.

The YTD deficit in the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) Fund is due to a timing delay in receiving payments – federal ICE revenues for August will not be received and posted until October 2012.

Motion:

I move that the Board of Commissioners approves the August 2012 County Financial Report and Cash Balance Report as presented.

Public Schools Financial Reports - August 2012

The Henderson County Public Schools provided the August 2012 Local Current Expense Fund and Other Restricted Funds Financial Reports for the Board's information.

Motion:

I move that the Board of Commissioners approves the Henderson County Public Schools August 2012 Financial Reports as presented.

Motion:

I move the Board approves the Combined Release/Refund Report as presented.

Emergency Communications System - Budget Amendment and Reimbursement Resolution

In February 2012 Henderson County was awarded a federal grant to replace our aging emergency communications system. Staff issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) and a public bid opening was held with three responsive bidders providing bids ranging from \$1,691,081.14 to \$2,106,088.32. Since all bids were above budget, staff has been working with the lowest responsive bidder on value engineering options.

At the Board's September 19, 2012 meeting, the Board authorized Staff to use funds already budgeted to begin the study for the frequency coordination phase, and to consider ways to fund the additional \$627,220 needed for improvements necessary in the emergency communications system.

Motion:

I move the Board of Commissioners approves the budget amendment to appropriate \$627,220 from Fund Balance for the emergency communications project. I further move the Board approves the resolution, which would allow the County to reimburse itself with the proceeds of the borrowing for any of the expenditures paid by it prior to the incurrence of the borrowing.

TD Bank - Corporate Resolution

Staff is requesting that the Board approves the bank authorization resolution required by TD Bank to have on file naming the bank as an official depository and authorizing County Finance Department Staff to be able to officially transact County business with the bank.

Motion:

I move the Board of Commissioners approves the resolution provided in the agenda, naming the Finance Director and Assistant Finance Director as authorized staff to transact County business with TD Bank and naming the bank as an official depository.

Western Highlands Area Authority - Quarterly Fiscal Monitoring Report (FMR) for the quarter ended June 30, 2012

N.C.G.S. 122C-117(c) requires the staff of the local area mental health authority to provide the County Finance Officer with the quarterly Fiscal Monitoring Report (FMR) within 30 days of the end of the quarter. The County Finance Officer is then required to provide the FMR to the Board of Commissioners at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the board. The attached FMR for Western Highlands Area Authority was received by the County Finance Officer on September 20, 2012.

Motion:

I move that the Board of Commissioners approves the Western Highlands Area Authority Fiscal Monitoring Report for the quarter ended June 30, 2012.

Adoption of New CDBG Plans and Reports on behalf of the 2011 Scattered Site Housing Project and Future CDBG Grants that will be effective from October 2012 – October 2015

Henderson County received \$400,000 of Community Development Block Grant funds from the N.C. Department of Commerce's Division of Community Investment and Assistance (CI) in June of 2012. As a requirement of this grant and other current CDBG grants that were awarded to the County, the Board of Commissioners is asked to consider the approval of the necessary compliance plans and reports that must be updated prior to releasing the funding conditions for this grant. Specifically, these include 1) a Resolution to

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Adopt the Required CDBG Policies, Procedures and Plans for the County's Programs, 2) a Fair Housing Resolution, and 3) a Project Budget Ordinance.

The Policies, Procedures and Plans can be adopted under one motion by the Board. The Fair housing resolution and the project budget ordinance each require separate action.

Motion:

I move to approve and individually adopt the resolutions, plans, policies and the ordinance in the order presented as required on behalf of the County's current and future CDBG projects.

Petition for addition to State Road system

Staff received petitions to add Underwood Drive and East Prince Road to the state road system. It has been the practice of this Board to accept road petitions and forward them to NC Department of Transportation for their review. It has also been the practice of the Board not to ask NCDOT to change the priority for roads on the paving priority list.

Staff reviewed the petitions and it appears that all affected property owners or developers have signed the required petitions.

Motion:

I move that the Board approves the petitions and direct staff to forward them to NCDOT.

Henderson County Rapid Re-Housing Program

Recently, local Henderson County service providers have begun working with Homeward Bound to organize a coalition and become part of the Balance of State Continuum of Care, the body that oversees the application process for federal homeless service funding. The Coalition has applied for federal funding through the Emergency Solutions Grant for Rapid Re-Housing, and recommends that the full amount of Emergency Solutions Grant funding available for Henderson County, a total of \$48,430, be used for Rapid Re-Housing by Homeward Bound. Additional information can be found in the letter from Homeward Bound included in the agenda packet.

There are no County funds associated with this request.

Motion:

I move the Board approves Homeward Bound's Rapid Re-Housing Program, and authorizes the Chairman to sign the Certification of Local Government Approval for Non-Profit Organizations approving the project within Henderson County.

Budget Amendment

The County through its tax collector will need legal representation in bankruptcy case pending in the Middle District of Florida Federal Court. Of course, such representation requires that the attorney representing the County be licensed there, as well as having expertise in representing governmental creditors in complex bankruptcy matters. The budget amendment sought is for \$15,000.

Motion:

I move the Board approves the increase of the Tax Department's budget by \$15,000, for legal fees in the bankruptcy case now pending in the Middle District of Florida.

NOMINATIONS

Commissioner Young made the motion to hold off on any nominations until the mid-month meeting when all Commissioners will be present. All voted in favor and the motion carried.



Finance Director Carey McLelland noted that even with decreased fees in permitting and inspections, more money was brought in due to an increase in inspections.

County Manager Steve Wyatt informed the Board that he would have staff do a line item break out on fees and permits and bring the information back to the Board as follow up.

PROJECT UPDATE FOR TALLEY DRIVE COMMUNITY REVITALIZATION GRANT

Planning Director Anthony Starr stated the Planning Department continues to work on the Talley Drive Community Revitalization Project. This project is funded by a Community Development Block Grant through the N.C. Department of Commerce. The rehabilitation & replacement of several homes is under way as planned. Staff will provide the Board an update regarding the planned road construction for Talley Drive.



Project Overview

- The Community Development Block Grant Community Revitalization Project uses federal funds from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. No local County funds were used for this project.
- Project was approved for the Talley Drive neighborhood only. The neighborhood and individual residents were accepted based on need, income verification, and disabled status.
- Funding provided for home repair, reconstruction, and roadway and drainage improvements for low income residents.

Project History

- Summer 2008 On Behalf of Henderson County, Land of Sky Regional Council Staff surveyed the neighborhood residents for income qualifications and level of need.
- August 2008 Project application approved by Henderson County and sent to NC Department of Commerce.
- September 2010 Notice of grant project award received by Henderson County.
- November 2010 Signed Funding Approval and Grant Agreement sent to NC Department of Commerce.
- November 2011 Henderson County received release of funds from the NC Department of Commerce.

Henderson County Planning Department

Project History continued

- April 25, 2012 Henderson County contracted with McGill and Associates Engineering for street improvement work in Talley Drive.
- September 17, 2012 Public meeting held with Talley Drive neighborhood to obtain residents input regarding road improvement proposal.
- Based on public input session and other contacts, the community cannot agree on the potential street improvement

Project History continued

- The housing rehabilitation and relocation assistance portion of the grant is moving forward on schedule.
- Housing related activities are expected to be completed by February of 2013.
- All funds must be obligated by December 15, 2012 (under contract)
- All funds must be expended by March 18, 2013 (work is complete)
- Only option is to reduce the scope of the grant to exclude street improvements and convey that info to the NC Commerce Department
- Staff will notify the Commerce Dept. with BOC consent

Henderson County Planning Department

Commissioner Messer made the motion that the Board directs the Planning Director to proceed with the Talley Drive CDBG Project excluding the street and drainage improvements, and proceeding with replacing/rehabilitating 3 homes. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

NCDOT RESOLUTION

At its April 18th, 2012 meeting, the Board received public comment conveying concern regarding a planned concrete median on Spartanburg Highway west of its intersection with Upward Road. A business owner expressed concern about the potential impact of the median on business.

At the September 19th, 2012 meeting, NCDOT provided the Board with a current update on the project. Steve Cannon with the North Carolina Department of Transportation discussed a number of options that had been considered for the intersection. Following discussion, the consensus of the Board was that a "left over", or a left in/no left out, proposal was the best option to provide access to businesses between Upward Road and Mt Airy Street.

Commissioner Young made the motion that the Board adopts the Resolution in support of the NCDOT proposal to construct a "left over" or left in/no left out lane option for access to Mt. Airy Street from Spartanburg Highway. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

COUNTY MANAGER'S REPORT

County Manager Steve Wyatt stated that County Staff was honored with the award of "Partners of the Year" by the Henderson County Partnership for Economic Development last Tuesday at their annual dinner.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Henderson County as follows:

- 1. The Henderson County Board of Commissioners, which is authorized to declare the official intent of the County of Henderson, North Carolina with respect to matters contained herein, hereby makes the following declaration that is intended to constitute a Declaration of Official Intent to Reimburse from Financing Proceeds Expenditures Made by the County with respect to the Project:
 - (a) **Expenditures to be Incurred.** The County has incurred expenses and expects to incur expenditures ("the Expenditures") related to the Project.
 - (b) Plan of Finance. The County intends to finance the costs of the foregoing acquisition, construction and equipping with proceeds of a financing in an amount deemed advisable by the County, but not to exceed \$1 million ("the Borrowing").
 - (c) Declaration of Official Intent to Reimburse. The County hereby declares and reaffirms its official intent to reimburse itself with the proceeds of the Borrowing for any of the Expenditures paid by it prior to the incurrence of the Borrowing.
- 2. Any previous resolutions regarding the County's intent to reimburse are hereby repealed.

This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

Policies, Procedures, Plans, etc. for Henderson County's CDBG Programs

- 1. <u>Fair Housing Complaint Procedure</u> This procedure states how the County will handle complaints of housing discrimination and the steps that will be undertaken to resolve these complaints.
- Equal Employment Opportunity and Procurement Plan This plan certifies that
 the County will comply with all nondiscrimination laws and regulations in
 employment, and will take action in the areas of enforcement, education and
 removal of barriers and impediments that affirmatively further equal access in
 procurement.
- 3. <u>Procurement Policy</u> This policy outlines the three methods of procurement to be used within this project for the award of contracts and for purchases made.
- 4. Residential Anti-Displacement and Relocation Plan This plan states how the County will replace all occupied and vacant occupiable low/moderate income dwelling units demolished or converted to a use other than low/moderate income housing as a direct result of activities assisted with funds provided under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 and what steps the County will take to replace these units.
- Citizens Participation Plan This plan states that the County will provide for and
 encourage citizen participation and will provide technical assistance to groups
 representative of persons of low and moderate income who request such
 assistance.
- 6. <u>Citizens Participation Procedure for Complaints</u> This plan states the procedures developed by the County to handle complaints received involving the Community Development Block Grant or any HUD-funded programs.
- 7. Code of Conduct This policy states that no public official, employee, officer or agent of the County shall participate in the selection, the award or the administration of a contract supported by federal funds if a conflict of interest, real or apparent, is involved.
- 8. Section 504 Plan & the 504 Grievance Procedure The County's 504 Self Evaluation and the 504 Grievance Procedure documents the hiring policies and practices of the County and describes how citizens can file a grievance concerning 504. Section 504 preceded the American's with Disabilities Act (ADA) and deals with handicapped access to public facilities. It mirrors the more recent requirements adopted under ADA regulations, but is applicable only to public facilities.



HENDERSON COUNTY FAIR HOUSING COMPLAINT PROCEDURE OCTOBER 2012 – OCTOBER 2015

Housing discrimination is prohibited by Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968 and by the North Carolina State Fair Housing Act. In an effort to promote fair housing and to ensure that the rights of housing discrimination victims are protected, Henderson County has developed the following procedures for receiving and resolving housing discrimination complaints:

- 1. Any person or persons wishing to file a complaint of housing discrimination in Henderson County may do so by informing the County's Planning Director of the facts and circumstances of the alleged discriminatory acts or practice.
- 2. Upon receiving a housing discrimination complaint, the County Manager shall acknowledge the complaint within 10 days in writing and inform the North Carolina Human Relations Commission about the complaint.
- 3. When a housing complaint cannot be resolved at the local level, the County's Planning Director shall offer assistance to the North Carolina Human Relations Commission in the investigation and reconciliation of all housing discrimination complaints, which are based on events occurring in Henderson County.
- 4. The County shall publicize in the local paper and on the County's website that the County's Planning Director is the local official to contact with housing discrimination complaints.



HENDERSON COUNTY Equal Employment and Procurement Plan

OCTOBER 2012 - OCTOBER 2015

Henderson County maintains the policy of providing equal employment opportunities for all persons regardless of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, handicap, age, political affiliation, or any other non-merit factor, except where religion, sex, national origin, or age are bona fide occupation qualifications for employment.

In furtherance of this policy, Henderson County prohibits any retaliatory action of any kind taken by any employee of the locality against any other employee or applicant for employment because that person made a charge, testified, assisted or participated in any manner in a hearing, proceeding or investigation of employment discrimination.

Henderson County shall strive for greater utilization of all persons by identifying previously underutilized groups in the workforce, such as minorities, women, and the handicapped, and making special efforts toward their recruitment, selection, development and upward mobility and any other term, condition, or privilege of employment.

Responsibility for implementing equal opportunities and affirmative action measures is hereby assigned to the Board of Commissioners' Chairman to assist in the implementation of this policy statement.

Henderson County shall development a self-evaluation mechanism to provide for periodic examination and evaluation. Periodic reports as requested on the progress of Equal Employment Opportunity and Affirmative Action will be presented to the Board of Commissioners' Chairman.

The County is committed to this policy and is aware that with its implementation, the County will receive positive benefits through the greater utilization and development of all its human resources.

PROCUREMENT POLICY FOR THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAMS OCTOBER 2012 – OCTOBER 2015

In the procurement of supplies, equipment or services in Henderson County's Community Development Block Grant Program, the following policies shall apply:

- 1) Small purchase procedures. Theses are relatively simple and informal procurement methods that are sound and appropriate for a procurement of services, supplies, or other property, costing in the aggregate not more than \$25,000. Under this procurement method, price or rate quotations shall be obtained from an adequate number of qualified sources. Miscellaneous professional services, office supplies and equipment may be secured by this method.
- In competitive sealed bids (formal advertising), sealed bids shall be publicly solicited and a firm, fixed, price contract shall be awarded to the responsible bidder whose bid, conforming with all of the material terms and conditions of the invitation for bids, is lowest in price.
- In competitive negotiations proposals shall be requested from a number of sources and the Request for Proposals shall be publicized. All aspects of the competitive negotiations shall be carried out in conformance with 24 CFR Part 85. The general administrative contract, appraisal contract, surveying contract and all other required services related to the program implementation shall be awarded utilizing this method. Under this method special consideration shall be given to experience, technical abilities, and familiarity with the services to be provided. Price shall not be the sole consideration for award of contract.

All procurement efforts shall include the solicitation of bids from qualified small, female, and minority-owned business firms.

In all cases, procurement under this Policy must conform to the requirements for procurement set forth in 24 CFR Part 85.

An adequate record of procurement must be maintained to ensure that these policies and the requirements of 24 CFR Part 85 have been followed in their entirety.



HENDERSON COUNTY RESIDENTIAL ANTI-DISPLACEMENT AND RELOCATION ASSISTANCE PLAN OCTOBER 2012 – OCTOBER 2015

In order to comply with the requirements of Section 104(d) of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, Henderson County adopts the following plan:

Henderson County will replace all occupied and vacant occupiable very-low or low-income dwellings units demolished or converted to a use other than low/moderate-income housing as a direct result of activities assisted with funds provided under the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, as described in 24 CFR 570.606 (b)(1).

All replacement housing will be provided within three years of the commencement of the demolition or rehabilitation relating to conversion. Before obligating or expending funds that will directly result in such demolition or conversion, the County will make public and submit to HUD the following information in writing:

- 1. A description of the proposed assisted activity;
- 2. A general location on a map and approximate number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be demolished or converted to a use other than as low/moderate-income dwelling units as a direct result of the assisted activity;
- 3. A time schedule for the commencement and completion of the demolition or conversion;
- 4. The general location on a map and approximate number of dwelling units by size (number of bedrooms) that will be provided as replacement dwelling units;
- 5. The source of funding and a time schedule for the provision of replacement dwelling units; and
- 6. The basis for concluding that each replacement dwelling unit will remain a low/moderate-income dwelling unit for at least 10 years from the date of initial occupancy.

The County will provide relocation assistance, as described in 570.606 (b)(2), to each low/moderate-income household displaced by the demolition of housing or by the conversion of a low/moderate-income dwelling to another use as a direct result of assisted activities.



Henderson County provides for and encourages citizen participation, with particular emphasis on participation by persons of low and moderate income that are residents of low and moderate-income neighborhoods and/or slum and blight areas. The County provides citizens with reasonable and timely access to local information and records relating to the grantee's proposed use of funds. This is done through the County's Board of Commissioners' meetings, which are advertised in the local newspaper.

The County provides technical assistance to facilitate citizen participation, when requested. Such assistance is provided to groups representative of persons of low-and moderate-income that request assistance in developing proposals. The level and type of type of assistance will be determined by the applicant.

The County provides for public hearings to obtain citizens views and to respond to proposals and questions at all stages of the community development program, including one hearing to receive citizen input as to the housing, community and economic development needs of its citizens, one hearing prior to the submission of any application for CDBG funding from the North Carolina Division of Community Investment and Assistance, and one hearing at the close-out of the grant program. Adequate notice is given for these meetings at times and locations convenient to potential or actual beneficiaries, and with accommodation for the handicapped. Any published advertisement issued by Henderson County includes the State TDD telephone number (1-800-735-2962).

Henderson County provides for timely written answers to written complaints and grievances. A response will be made within 10 calendar days. (See attached Complaint Procedure)

Henderson County will provide a translator for non-English speaking residents for public hearings when the County is notified that any non-English speaking resident will attend the public hearing. An interpreter will be provided for hearing impaired residents. A minimum of 48-hour notice to the Clerk to the Board is required for interpretation services, which may be needed for all County public hearings.



CITIZEN PARTICIPATION PROCEDURE FOR COMPLAINTS OCTOBER 2012 – OCTOBER 2015

Henderson County has developed a procedure to process complaints, which may be received involving the 2011 CDBG Scattered Site Housing Project or any other HUD-funded program. There are two basic forms of complaint procedures: 1) verbal complaints which will be dealt with informally by the County's Planning Office (PO), and 2) written complaints which will be dealt with formally with a set of procedures including appeals.

All written complaints received by Congressional staff, local elected officials, the Clerk to the Board, and the PO will be logged in as received by the PO. Within a ten-day period following the receipt of this complaint, a response will be developed by the PO, reviewed by the Clerk to the Board, and mailed to the party who wrote the complaint. This response will include property documentation and background of the case in question, the proposed action, and the time frame in which the complaint will be addressed.

In the event this response is unsatisfactory to the person making the complaint, that party will be referred to the North Carolina Division of Community Investment and Assistance (CI), specifically the CI Representative serving the County. The CI Representative will respond in writing to the complaint and the County with a decision or recommendation for resolution. The written recommendation made by CI's staff representative will be final in all cases.

It is the responsibility of the person making the complaint to furnish documents, provide documentation to support allegations, provide counsel if desired, inform in writing to the PO if they are represented by a third party, and attend the meeting involving a review of their complaint.



HENDERSON COUNTY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT CODE OF CONDUCT OCTOBER 2012 – OCTOBER 2015

HATCH ACT

No employee or agent of the County may perform any function during work hours that is considered political activity. This includes: soliciting votes, transporting voters, distributing campaign materials, working on or developing campaign materials, etc.

DISCRIMINATION

No person shall, on the grounds of race, color, religion, national origin, handicap or familial status, Vietnam Era Veteran status or sex be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subject to discrimination under any program or activity funded in whole or in part with federal funds.

ENGAGEMENT IN PROCUREMENT

No employee, officer or agent of the County shall participate in the selection or award of administration of a contract supported by federal funds if a conflict of interest, real or apparent would be involved. Such a conflict would arise when:

- a) The employee, officer, or agent;
- b) Any member of his immediate family;
- c) His or her partner; or
- d) An organization which employs or is about to employ, any of the above, has a financial or other interest in the firm selected for award.

The grantee's officers, employees, or agent shall neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors, or anything of monetary value from contractors, potential contractors, or parties to sub-agreements.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

No employee or agent shall influence or attempt to influence the outcome of any case or matter in which he has a direct interest either personally or in the person of any relative by blood or marriage. Employees or agents so involved shall abstain from dealing with such matters; they may provide information at the request of the Board of Commissioners, but shall not attempt to influence the decisions of the Board of Commissioners.



HENDERSON COUNTY SECTION 504 COMPLIANCE OFFICER/GRIEVANCE PROCEDURE OCTOBER 2012 – OCTOBER 2015

Henderson County, North Carolina, hereby designates Steve Wyatt, County Manager, or his designee, to serve as Section 504 Compliance Officer throughout the implementation of Henderson County's Community Development Block Grant Programs.

Citizens may file Section 504 grievances at any point in the program. The County will respond in writing to written citizen grievances. Citizen grievances should be mailed to Steve Wyatt, County Manager, Henderson County, 1 Historic Courthouse Square, Suite 2, Hendersonville, NC 28792. The County will respond to all written citizen grievances within ten (10) calendar days of receipt of the comments.

Should any individual, family, or entity have a grievance concerning any action prohibited under Section 504, a meeting with the compliance officer to discuss the grievance will be scheduled. The meeting date and time will be established within five (5) calendar days of receipt of the request. Upon meeting and discussing the grievance, a reply will be made, in writing, within five (5) calendar days.

If the citizen is dissatisfied with the local response, they may write to the North Carolina Division of Community Investment & Assistance (CI), 4313 Mail Service Center, Raleigh, NC 27699. CI will respond only to written comments within ten (10) calendar days of the receipt of the comments.

The County uses newspaper advertisements and posts information on publicly accessible bulletin board to notify all persons including the disabled of their rights under the County-funded or directed government projects. FAIR HOUSING RESOLUTION HENDERSON COUNTY, NORTH CAROLINA OCTOBER 2012 – OCTOBER 2015

WHEREAS, Henderson County seeks to protect the health, safety and welfare of its residents; and

WHEREAS, citizens seek safe, sanitary, and habitable dwellings in all areas of the County; and

WHEREAS, Henderson County finds the denial of equal housing opportunities because of religion, race, color, sex, familial or handicap status, or national origin legally wrong and socially unjust; and

WHEREAS, the denial of equal housing opportunities in housing accommodations is detrimental to public welfare and public order; and

WHEREAS, Henderson County finds the practice of discrimination against a citizen in housing a denial of his equal rights and his equal opportunity to seek a better living and develop community pride;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of HENDERSON County, North Carolina, that

- Section 1. Henderson County has declared it an official policy that there shall not be discrimination in the terms or conditions for buying or renting housing within the County.
- Section 2. All business groups and individual citizens of the County are urged to respect and implement this policy.
- Section 3. The County Manager or his designate, of Henderson County is the official authorized by the County to (1) receive and document complaints regarding housing discrimination in the County; and (2) refer such complaints to the North Carolina Human Relations Commission for investigation, conciliation and resolution.

<u>Section 8</u>. The Finance Director is directed to include a detailed analysis of past and future costs and revenues on this grant project in every budget submission made to this Board of Commissioners.

<u>Section 9.</u> Copies of this Grant Project Budget Ordinance shall be made available to the Finance Director for direction in carrying out this project.

<u>Section 10</u>. The Finance Director is hereby authorized to transfer funds from one line item to another line item without further approval by the Board of Commissioners, subject to the regulations of the North Carolina Department of Commerce, Division of Community Investment & Assistance.

Henderson County Rapid Re-Housing Program

History

In response to federal guidance through the Department of Housing and Urban Development and new regulations for homeless service funding through the Emergency Solutions Grant program, Homeward Bound of Asheville, Inc. contacted local homeless service providers in Henderson County to organize a Homeless Coalition.

Buncombe County has had enormous success since the implementation of its 10-Year Plan to End Homelessness reducing the overall homeless population by 25% and the chronically homeless population by 75% since its 2005 implementation. The Department of Housing and Urban Development recommends that successful regions, such as Buncombe County, educate surrounding communities about best practices, such as Housing First and Rapid Re-Housing, which have shown to reduce homelessness.

Since March 2012, Homeward Bound has been working with local Henderson County service providers to organize a coalition and become part of the Balance of State Continuum of Care, the body that oversees the application process for federal homeless service funding. Henderson County has historically not taken advantage of these dollars that could help the community reduce and/or end homelessness.

In a short time, the Henderson County Homeless Coalition has grown to over 20 organizations, educating itself on the available services, identifying gaps in services to specific populations, organizing goals for the next year, and applying for federal funding through Emergency Solutions Grant for Rapid Re-Housing. The coalition recently recommended that the full amount of Emergency Solutions Grant funding available for Henderson County, a total of \$48.430, be used for Rapid Re-Housing by Homeward Bound.

Program

Homeward Bound's Rapid Re-Housing Program will work with the Mainstay Domestic Violence Shelter and the Henderson County Public Schools HELP program to identify individuals and families experiencing homelessness in need of permanent housing. Rapid Re-Housing Case Managers will assist households to locate and procure fair-market, scattered-site housing and provide them housing stabilization services in their homes to ensure that they maintain their housing long-term. Homeward Bound will provide short- and medium-term tenant-based rental assistance and housing case management (1-24 months). In the first year of this program, the agency will house and support 15 households. Homeward Bound's case manager will be located at the Mainstay Domestic Violence Shelter.

Request

Homeward Bound has received a conditional award of Emergency Solution Grant funding in the amount of \$48,430.00 from the state of North Carolina. In order to contract, the state requires the local government to approve the program for the region in which services will be performed.

Homeward Bound requests that the Henderson County Board of Commissioners approve the agency's Rapid Re-Housing Program to provide valuable permanent housing assistance to individuals and families experiencing homelessness in Henderson County.
