Position Statement Proposed Modification to the Henderson County Animal Ordinance July 20, 2011

The Blue Ridge Humane Society is a nonprofit, limited-admission animal welfare organization dedicated to providing a safe sheltering environment for homeless, injured and abused animals awaiting adoption. We are committed to proper animal care, spay and neutering as the responsible control for our community's pet population and the reduction of needless euthanasia. We have operated for over 60 years within Henderson County, North Carolina.

The members of the Board of Directors for the Blue Ridge Humane Society have unanimously approved the following position statement regarding the proposed modification to the county's animal ordinance that would allow the sale, trade or giveaway of dogs and cats in open-air markets and flea markets.

"As members of the Board of Directors, it is our responsibility to advocate for the humane treatment of all animals. Henderson County euthanized over 3600 homeless animals in 2010 due to pet overpopulation. Tragically, most were adoptable animals. This modified ordinance will further the exploitation of animals and deliberate breeding, creating further overpopulation. Blue Ridge Humane Society strongly opposes modification to the Animal Ordinance that would allow the sale, trade, or giveaway of cats and dogs in open-air markets.

Based on information provided by our Veterinary Advisory Board, the sale of animals in an unlicensed, unsupervised, uninspected setting puts humans and animals at risk for health threats such as rabies, parasites, and other communicable diseases. The indiscriminate sales of animals, fosters opportunistic display of young, stressed, and perhaps ill animals to unsuspecting consumers. Lack of medical oversight, a written contract, or proof of ownership in such a setting, leaves consumers without recourse.

In support of the humane treatment of animals in Henderson County, the Blue Ridge Humane Society respectfully requests that the Commissioners vote against this proposed modification of the Animal Ordinance.
