# Western Highlands Area Authority - Quarterly Fiscal Monitoring Report (FMR) for the period ended June 30, 2010

5. Hospital Corporation Board of Directors – 1 vac.

Commissioner McGrady made the motion to reappointment John Bell to position #2 and Bill Smith to position #4 and to accept the reappointments by acclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried. At the October 4, 2010 regular meeting, Carolyn Justus and Fielding Lucas were nominated for position #9, and Don Holder and Bill Moyer were nominated for position #11. ### PARDEE HOSPITAL UPDATE

Due to misstatements and rumors, Chairman Moyer explained that there have been no formal discussions among the Board with respect to the sale of Pardee Hospital. The Board has held a number of open discussions with respect to the proposed joint venture of Pardee and Mission. The Board will not take a position on the joint venture until they receive a specific proposal for the Hospital Board. Chairman Moyer felt a resolution should be adopted stating the Board has no intention of selling the hospital.

After lengthy discussion, Chairman Moyer made the motion that this Board has no present intention to sell the hospital and that the Board's position at this time is that the hospital should not be sold. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

#### **BREAK**

A five minute break was taken.

#### EXTENTION OF ETJ ON UPWARD ROAD

Hendersonville Mayor Barbara Volk presented a proposal which would extend the city's Extra Territorial Jurisdiction (ETJ) on Upward Road. Per state law, the city cannot extend its extraterritorial powers into any area where the county has adopted and is enforcing a zoning ordinance and subdivision regulations, and where the county is enforcing the State Building Code, unless the city and county agree upon the area where each will exercise those powers. Mayor Volk quoted David Owen of the Chapel Hill School of Government, "Growth on the fringes of cities impacts the cities. Cities may eventually annex these areas and thus have responsibility for providing municipal services within them. If a city cannot secure planning and regulatory jurisdiction until after urban densities are established it will have no opportunity to influence how development within these areas takes place."

The State of North Carolina allows cities to exercise planning and development regulations in designated areas with the permission of the county. A few counties in North Carolina have official policies on when ETJ authority is granted, but most do so, on a case by case basis. As NCDOT widens Upward Road and the

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economy rebounds in the next few years, there will be further growth in that area. Property owners in the ETJ pay no city taxes and are subject to no city ordinances beyond land use. All existing land uses in the ETJ may continue without interference. ETJ is not the first step toward involuntary annexation.

The City Council has endeavored to cooperate wherever possible with the County Commissioners and County Staff. Within the past few months the City has revisited and revised their policy on extension of sewer service to industrial development following concerns expressed by Henderson County. The City has agreed to contribute a large portion of the fee required for Henderson County to join the state's beaver management program as requested by Henderson County. Approval has recently been given to use city property to park county vehicles during construction on the courthouse property.

As part of the transition to the ETJ, the properties would be rezoned to the cities classifications since they are not mirrored to the counties. The city is willing to agree that the city zoning would be as close as possible to the current county zoning and is willing to work with the group developing the Dana small area plan to see that this is incorporated into their zoning decisions.

Commissioner McGrady disclosed that he owns property in the subject area and had asked the county attorney whether his indirect ownership of land within the ETJ would suggest his recusal from this matter, and the county attorney did not feel this was necessary.

It was the consensus of the Board that it was not necessary to recuse Commissioner McGrady.

Mayor Volk noted a public input session was held which was originally advertised as a public hearing due to a problem with giving appropriate notifications to the newspaper. The official public hearing will take place at their November 4 City Council meeting. All of the public input received at the October meeting is part of the record and will be part of the official decision of the City Council. Before the City Council can vote to extend the ETJ a resolution will be required from the County Commissioners.

Commissioner Williams made the motion that the Board wait until after the City's public hearing on November 4, 2010 and the Dana small area planning committee's public input session on November 8, 2010 and then take up the ETJ at the mid November meeting coming back with a resolution that both the City and County find acceptable. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

#### TOWN OF FLETCHER PROPOSAL TO BUILD A DOG PARK AT WESTFELDT PARK

Mark Biberdorf, Town Manager, and Greg Walker, Recreation Director of the Town of Fletcher were in attendance at this meeting to present a proposal for building a dog park at the County-owned Westfeldt Park. This facility is proposed to be built and operated by the Town of Fletcher and comprised of two fenced areas to allow dogs to run off-leash while accompanied by their owners. The area proposed for the dog park is located in the open field at the front of the park along Old Fanning Bridge Road.

Henderson County Recreation Director Tim Hopkin and Assistant County Manager Selena Coffey had met with the Town's Manager and Recreation Director and are in general agreement with the concept of the proposal, given that it is being proposed at no County cost and addresses one of the projects identified with the Henderson County Parks and Recreation Facilities Needs Assessment completed in 2007.

Town Manager of Fletcher Mark Biberdorf stated the demand for a dog park in Fletcher area has been one of the top recreational facility requests that the Town received from the public. Approximately 2 acres will be needed to construct the dog runs and have a reasonable buffer around the fenced in areas. Other amenities that were identified as desirable for the dog park but not absolutely necessary were the following:

- More parking spaces at the entrance of the park
- Water access for the dogs
- Restrooms
- Sun shade or a shelter

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• Signage identifying the dog park area and a list of the rules

The Town of Fletcher is proposing to build the base facility out of its Park Development Fund. The approximate cost to do this is \$12,000. The Town of Fletcher will cover the maintenance costs and maintenance as well. Other amenities could be added either through fund raisers, contributions from outside groups, or contributions from the County. The Fletcher Police Department will be responsible for patrolling the area.

Selena Coffey noted the 2007 Parks and Recreation needs assessment did include a dog park. It will be necessary to make changes to the animal ordinance to allow the off-leash issue within the fenced area. The responsibility of liability issues will also need to be addressed.

The Town of Fletcher proposal was included in the agenda packet for review.

Commissioner McGrady requested contact be made with the family who donated this specific tract of land.

Chairman Moyer requested that staff look at the possible effects of the dog park on economic development.

Commissioner McGrady made the motion that the Board authorizes staff to further negotiate with the Town of Fletcher and draft an agreement with the Town based on their proposal with the County having no financial commitment by the County and that the agreement be brought back to the Board of Commissioners for approval at a future meeting; And further that staff makes the necessary revisions to the Animal Ordinance to address the issues pertaining to allowing animals to be off-leash within the confined areas approved for the project or other County or Municipal facilities. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

#### CONTINUATION OF PUBLIC HEARING FOR CAVE INN DRIVE

Planning Department staff requests the Board to continue a public hearing to consider the abandonment of State maintenance and the closure of all known right of ways for Cave Inn Drive (SR 1661) located on the property of Tommy J. and Joan C. Heinz. Mr. and Mrs. Michael Harris are contesting the closure of said right-of-way (ROW). Both parties acknowledged that the current right-of-way and road does not extend to the beginning of the Harris property.

Property Addressing Coordinator Curtis Griffin advised the Board that an agreement had not been met and requested that the public hearing be continued to November 17, 2010 at 11:00 in order to allow time to get a signed agreement.

Commissioner McGrady made the motion that the public hearing for Cave Inn Drive be continued to November 17, 2010 at 11:00 a.m. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

# SUBMISSION OF THE 2011 SCHEDULE OF VALUES, STANDARDS, AND RULES AND THE 2011 PRESENT-USE VALUE SCHEDULES AS PRESCRIBED BY NCGS 105-317 (C) (1) TO THE HENDERSON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

Assessor Stan Duncan stated as required by statute, these Schedules are to be utilized in conducting the 2011 general reappraisal at market value and where appropriate, present-use value. These Schedules will be available to the public at the County Assessor's Office, and Clerk to the Board's Office and via the county website. These schedules will be used in implementing the 2011 general reappraisal for Henderson County. A public hearing must be set and advertised.

Chairman Moyer stated there were discussions as to whether to continue the revalue on the current schedule or to modify it. The revaluation will be included as a discussion item on the November 3, 2010 meeting agenda. Utilities and business personal property will also be discussed along with the effects of a revaluation. If possible it would be good to have someone speak from a lenders perspective as well as a real estate agent.

Commissioner McGrady made the motion that the Board accepts the receipt of the schedules and makes them available for public inspection. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

#### CNG TRANSIT VEHICLE PROCUREMENT FOLLOW-UP

At its last meeting, the Board requested additional information for the acquisition of 5 new CNG transit vehicles for the Apple Country Transit System to replace existing vehicles. The total project includes 4 CNG buses and 1 CNG transit van with an estimated total cost of \$1,004,257, with Federal and State funds covering the \$921,002 of the expenses. County matching funds of approximately \$83,255 are required, which will come from current fund balance within the Transit Fund. Though the County does annually budget for a transfer from the General Fund for required matching funds for the Transit Fund, Staff is not requesting any additional appropriation from the General Fund for this acquisition. Vehicle delivery is expected for the fall of 2011 if the Board authorizes staff to proceed.

In addition to the Board's question about funding for the vehicles, staff has confirmed that only conventional fuel type vehicles (gasoline or diesel) are available via N.C. State Contract.

Commissioner Messer made the motion that the Board authorizes staff to solicit bids for the four medium-duty CNG buses and one CNG minivan. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

#### BREAK

A break was taken in order to change video tapes.

## PETITION FOR ABANDONMENT OF A PORTION OF GLOVER STREET (SR 1924)

Anthony Starr stated at North Carolina Department of Transportation's request, staff initiated a petition to abandon the state maintenance for the portion of Glover Street (SR 1924) that runs through Jackson Park (map provided). According to NCDOT files, the North Carolina Department of Transportation agreed to add the portion of Glover Street located in Jackson Park to the state road system when the area was considered for a landfill in 1973. It is NCDOT policy to build and maintain streets that access landfills.

NCDOT staff indicates they have not maintained the portion of Glover Street located inside of Jackson Park since the park was developed. According to NCDOT staff, they discovered that this road segment was within their system when preparing for improvements (re-surfacing, curb & gutter) to Glover Street as part of the "Secondary Roads Program." Those NCDOT improvements would be at least 2 years from now. The current road condition, within Jackson Park, is poor and delaying any improvements by 2 years or more could require additional maintenance efforts in the interim. The County has done minor maintenance in recent years, such as pothole repairs.

If NCDOT agreed to maintain this road segment, NCDOT would require the removal of the speed bumps and park gate as a condition of maintaining the road. Vehicle speed and volume continues to represent a safety concern for the Park users and operations as vehicles use the route as a short cut from 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue to Glover Street. This section of Glover Street is not within the Hendersonville City limits and therefore City maintenance is not an option currently.

Chairman Moyer noted several years back a plan had been put forth to have a loop road south of the park which would completely solve the problem. It was undetermined who the plan had come from. Mayor Volk has expressed willingness to work with the County and NCDOT to see if any of their pots of money could be used and whether the loop road could be explored.

Chairman Moyer made the motion that the Board approves the petition and forwards it to NCDOT for action with the condition that the ability to develop a loop around Jackson Park to free the traffic in the park be studied. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

#### AGRI-BUSINESS ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT RESEARCH REPORT

Selena Coffey stated during budget deliberations the Board of Commissioners asked that staff research the feasibility of developing an Agri-Business Economic Development to complement its current economic development policies. Staff provided a report on findings for the Board's review within the agenda packet. Henderson County has historically been a farming and agricultural community. County Government has recognized the importance of agriculture on economic development and the economy.

- In 1999 one of the major issues within the budget was to put funds in the budget for an agricultural project position on a temporary basis. The position was filled but only continued for approximately 1.5 years and was not funded in future years.
- In 2003 the Commissioners adopted the County's first Strategic Plan, listing some of their top strategic goals directed as agricultural economic development. The Comprehensive County Plan (CCP) also had recommendations with regard to agriculture.
- In 2005 the Commissioners began putting funds into the budget to use as a set aside for agricultural projects as approved by the Board.
- In 2006, 2007, 2008 specific actions, steps and strategies were adopted for agriculture in retaining and recruiting businesses to the county.
- In 2009 and 2010 the Commissioners have approved the Enhanced Agricultural District Ordinance as well as the Agricultural Preservation Plan.

#### Agri-Business Economic Development Position Job Descriptions

In researching this type of a position, staff contacted the Polk County Manager who provided information regarding their Agricultural Economic Development Director position and enlisted the assistance of our Human Resources Department to send out a listserv request for information from other jurisdictions across the state with similar position. Only one other County responded with a job description and salary range for their position. Additionally, the Partnership for Economic Development CEO, Andrew Tate, was contacted and provided his job description and that of his Director of Industry Relations due to the similarities between those positions.

Utilizing the Polk and Orange County job descriptions and salary ranges for comparison, as well as the County's current department head pay structure, the County's Human Resources Department recommends a salary range of \$45,630 - \$70,726 at pay grade 80 for an Agri-Business Economic Development Director position, reporting to the County Manager.

The salary range will be largely dependent upon the Board's expectation and what they would like to see in regards to its responsibilities, decision making ability, job duties, and autonomy from County Government, etc.

Ms. Coffey provided the primary options with regard to organizational structure and reporting options should the Board move forward with funding an Agricultural Economic Development position/function.

Additional considerations for funding the function/position

• Henderson County has been budgeting for agriculture incentives and projects non-routinely since Fiscal Year 2005-2006 (\$43,811) and then began regularly funding at \$50,000 in Fiscal Year 2007-2008.

- Potential for reallocation of funds to Cooperative Extension budget to offset some expenses for start-up for this program.
- Potential for grants for Farmland Preservation and other similar programs at Federal and State levels.

The Commissioners will be providing input individually to the County Manager and Assistant County Manager and this item would be put back on the agenda for November 1, 2010.
