



REVENUES: WHERE THE MONEY COMES FROM...




EXPENDITURES: WHERE THE MONEY GOES...

SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

The 2009 Community Revitalization Grant Program (CR) Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) application period has begun. Through a preliminary evaluation process, it was determined that the Talley Drive area met the CDBG Community Revitalization program criteria. The proposed project would include owner occupied housing rehabilitation, storm water/drainage controls and roadway improvements. The proposed CDBG Community Revitalization application must be completed and a public hearing regarding the application must be held prior to submission to the State.

The CDBG Community Revitalization grant program is a competitive process that awards up to \$850,000 per project and has no local match requirement. The deadline for application to the State is September 30, 2009.

BOARD ACTION REQUESTED:

Planning Staff request approval of the application after holding the hearing and receiving public comment.

Suggested Motion: I move that the Board approve the application to the Division of Community Assistance for the Community Revitalization grant program for the housing rehabilitation, roadway improvements and storm water control activities and authorize the execution and submittal of any necessary application documents.
