## Comments to the Henderson County Commissioners May 21, 2008

Good Morning. Thank you for the opportunity to speak to you today.

My name is Richard DeSimone. I have been a Henderson County resident for almost five years. I am a retired chemist and serve on the Recycling Committee of the Environmental and Conservation Organization.

Today I'm told you will hear a presentation from county staff relating to solid waste management. This is a subject about which I hear many complaints, and about which I have had a long-standing interest.

Henderson County is among the fastest growing counties in the state. With more people comes more garbage; the future holds some real challenges in this area:

a shortage of nearby landfill space,

dramatically higher tipping fees than we now enjoy,

increasing costs to truck our wastes longer distances, and

several new state mandates we are bound to comply with.

The time for business as usual is past. Waste reduction time is upon us. Creativity and initiative will be required.

As part of our waste reduction efforts, recycling needs to play a much greater part. We are by most estimates, ten years behind in this area. But we need not dwell on that sobering thought; we just need to move ahead.

Despite perceptions that recycling in rural areas is exceptionally difficult, the data do not bear that out. Other mountain counties are doing better - much better. Macon County recycles 20% of its waste stream, ranking 7<sup>th</sup> in the state in lbs/capita recovery. Transylvania ranks, 13<sup>th</sup>, Madison 17<sup>th</sup>, Yancy 18<sup>th</sup>, Polk 25<sup>th</sup>. Henderson ranks 36<sup>th</sup>. (This according to data released in 2007 by the N.C. Department of Environment and Natural Resources, excluding yard waste and tires.)

Haywood County, with a bit more than half our population operates 10 collection "convenience" centers in rural areas of the county, open every day from 7 am to 5 pm.

The recycling infrastructure in North Carolina is well developed, and employs more people than the biotech and agricultural livestock industries. "The opportunities have never been greater for local governments to provide more efficient and effective recycling services to their citizens, and we need to see an effort on the part of many communities to do better." That's a direct quote from Scott Mouw, Chief of the Community Assistance Section of the Division of Pollution Prevention and Environmental Assistance, N.C. Department of Environment and Natural Resources.

I conclude with some encouraging observations:

some refreshing signs of life in the county engineer's department, and successful initial efforts to better market our recyclables.

This needs to continue. We need to commit to do the right thing, and to do it right. We look to you for leadership. The public will respond.

ECO stands ready to be a part of the solution, we challenge the county to do the same.
