MINUTES

STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA COUNTY OF HENDERSON

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS DECEMBER 7, 1992

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled meeting at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Conference Room of the Henderson County Office Building.

Those present were: Chairman J. Michael Edney, Vice-Chairman Vollie G. Good, Commissioner Hugh D. Randall, Commissioner William McKay, Commissioner-Elect Renee Kumor, County Manager David F. Thompson, Assistant County Manager/Finance Director David E. Nicholson, County Attorney Don H. Elkins, and Clerk to the Board Elizabeth W. Corn.

CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

Chairman Edney called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner McKay led the pledge to the American Flag.

INVOCATION

Rev. Tommy Martin of Mountain View Baptist Church gave the invocation.

SWEARING IN

Tommy Thompson, Clerk of Superior Court, administered the Oath of Office to Commissioner J. Michael Edney and Commissioner-Elect Renee Kumor. Commissioner Edney's wife, Sherri, joined him for the ceremony as did Commissioner-Elect Kumor's husband, Stan.

Tommy Thompson presented the two new Commissioners to the audience. They received applause and congratulatory handshakes from the other Commissioners and staff.

RESOLUTION/Recognition of Charles L. Byrd

Chairman Edney asked Charles Byrd to join him on the platform. Mr. Byrd is the Superintendent of the Hendersonville City School System and has been since 1984. He has recently been named Superintendent of the Year for the State of North Carolina.

The Board of Commissioners honored Mr. Byrd with a Resolution which Chairman Edney read aloud. The Resolution had been framed and was presented to Mr. Byrd amidst applause.

Mr. Byrd offered words of thanks to the Commissioners and to the community for their support of public education.

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ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN AND VICE-CHAIRMAN

Chairman

Chairman Edney offered the floor for nominations for Chairman. Commissioner Randall nominated William McKay. Chairman Edney nominated Vollie Good. Commissioner Good made the motion that the nominations be closed. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

The Clerk polled the Board with the following vote:

Commissioner Good won the vote. Commissioner Edney handed over the gavel and wished him much luck.

Chairman Good's Comments

Chairman Good thanked Commissioner Edney and especially thanked him for the time that he has given to the community while serving as Chairman for the past two years. Chairman Good stated that for the past two years he has been learning and gaining experience as a Commissioner and now he hopes to put that experience to work. Chairman Good stated that he has been and will continue to be available to listen to citizen's concerns for our County and hopes to make Henderson County a better place for all our citizens.

Vice-Chairman

Commissioner McKay nominated Commissioner Edney. Commissioner Kumor made the motion to close the nominations. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner McKay made the motion that Mike be elected by acclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Presentation of Plaque to Commissioner Edney

Chairman Good presented a "Gavel Plaque" to Commissioner Edney as out-going Chairman. Many good words and words of thanks were offered in Mr. Edney's behalf.

CONSENT AGENDA

Commissioner Kumor asked that one item be pulled from the Consent Agenda, item "C" Notifications of Vacancies. This item was removed from the Consent Agenda for later discussion.

A. Minutes of the November 2, 1992 Board Meeting were presented for the Board's review and approval.

B. Approval of Bonds. The General Statutes require that the Board of Commissioners annually approve the bonds for the Sheriff, Register of Deeds, Tax Collector and Finance Officer. These bonds were automatically renewed in August with Peerless Insurance Company.

The bonds are in the following amounts:

They must be approved by the Board of Commissioners.

- C. Removed from the Consent Agenda for later discussion.
- D. Tax Releases & Refunds. Robert Baird, County Tax Assessor, presented an accumulation of 125 tax release requests. He has reviewed all the requests and has the supporting documentation on file in his office. He submitted the requests for the approval of the Henderson County Board of Commissioners.

Robert Baird also presented an accumulation of 11 tax refund requests. He has reviewed all the requests and has the supporting documentation on file in his office. He submitted the requests for the approval of the Henderson County Board of Commissioners.

- E. Public Hearing Date for Public & Private Road Names. The request came from the Planning Department to set a Public Hearing for Public & Private Road Names for February 1, 1993.
- F. Designation of Non-Conflicting N.C. State Road Names. Susan Sneed requested that a list of 48 road names be formally adopted by the Board. They are all non-conflicting road names.
- G. Zoning Ordinance Amendments New Zoning in North Jeter Mountain Area. This request was presented at the last Commissioners' Meeting. The Staff Attorney's recommendation was that this is a new request and should go through the procedure for Zoning Ordinance amendments. It has been to the Planning Board and it would now be appropriate for the County Commissioners to set the Public Hearing for January 4, 1993.
- H. Budget Amendment. This was a request from the Health Department because of the Statement of Status for Settlement for Medicaid funds received from the State of North Carolina during Fiscal Year 1987-88. These funds were collected by Henderson County for the Home Health Program operated by the Health Department during that fiscal year. Annually, we prepare a cost report based on our actual expenditures. A settlement must then be made between the State and Henderson County for any difference. The difference for FY 87-88 was \$22,458.00. Mr. Thompson

recommended approval of the budget amendment, based on the Finance Director's assurance that this is a normally occurring settlement for Medicaid funds.

- I. Gerton Fire Department Insurance District Designation. During the process of the Department of Insurance inspection, it was discovered that the Gerton Fire Department does not have a Board Resolution approving their insurance district. Since this is a required document for the 9S fire department rating, it is requested that a resolution from the Board approving the fire district boundary lines for insurance grading purposes be adopted. The Resolution was presented. It is for insurance grading purposes only and is not for setting up districts.
- J. Youth Access to Tobacco in N.C. Resolution. It was requested that the Board of Commissioners adopt the presented Resolution which supports closing a "loophole" in current legislation intended to prevent retailers from selling tobacco products to minors. If adopted by the General Assembly, retailers would be required to check the age of customers to be sure that they are not underage before selling them tobacco products. The Board of Health has adopted this Resolution and expressed their concern that legislation should be added which would eliminate access of minors to cigarette vending machines. The Resolution is also being considered by the N.C. County Commissioners' Association.

Commissioner Edney made the motion that the consent agenda be approved subject to item "C" being removed. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

INFORMAL PUBLIC COMMENTS

- 1.~W.R.~Bolin-Mr.~Bolin spoke briefly regarding the frequency of revaluation of property in the county. He strongly feels that local people should be used.
- <u>2. Lori Holbert Ms. Holbert spoke regarding the Gilreath Loop issue. She favors the two road names Sweetwater Road and Gilreath Loop Road. She opposes the name Old Sweetwater Road for Gilreath Loop Road.</u>
- 3. Joe Gilreath Mr. Gilreath also favors Sweetwater Road and Gilreath Loop Road. He presented a petition signed by eleven property owners who wish the name to remain Gilreath Loop Road.
- 4. Stan Pinewar Mr. Pinewar favors Gilreath Loop Road.

DISCUSSION/ADJUSTMENT OF AGENDA

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David Thompson moved Discussion Item "C" Tax Refund - Youngblood Transportation to the end of the agenda, after Executive Session.

He also asked that a formal agenda item be added as item "C" Change of Meeting Date for the next scheduled meeting date.

PUBLIC HEARING - Amendment to the Henderson County Zoning Ordinance

Matt Matteson stated that this hearing was properly advertised. The request is for a Bed & Breakfast Inn amendment for the county. This received a favorable recommendation by the Henderson County Planning Board in October.

The County Manager stated that it was important to note that this proposed text amendment would not allow Bed & Breakfast Inns as a permitted use in residential zoning districts by right. A request of this nature would have to be approved by the Henderson County Zoning Board of Adjustment. Although there is no requirement in policy or law that the County Commissioners not act on this at the public hearing, it has traditionally been the case that the Board defer action until the next scheduled meeting.

Commissioner Edney made the motion for the Board to go into Public Hearing. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Public Comments

1. Ken Hulick - Mr. Hulick is superintendent of the Carl Sandburg Home in Flat Rock. Mr. Hulick favors the Bed & Breakfast amendment.

Commissioner Kumor made the motion to close the Public Hearing. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

After considerable discussion, the consensus of the Board was to defer action and roll this item to the next Commissioners' Meeting.

PUBLIC HEARING - Public & Private Road Names.

Commissioner Kumor made the motion to go into Public Hearing. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Susan Sneed, E-911 Coordinator, stated that the Public Hearing had been properly advertised. There were 58 public and private road names that had been posted prior to the Public Hearing.

ROBERT E. LEE LANE & ROBERT E. LEE DRIVE

Susan Sneed then addressed Robert E. Lee Lane and Robert E. Lee Drive. These are two streets that are generally in the same area. Both streets are currently using the name Robert E. Lee Drive. One was posted as Lane and one as Drive.

Commissioner McKay stated that he would like to see a map showing these two roads before making a decision since this is a controversial road.

<u>Joe Gilreath - Mr. Gilreath stated that he had signed the wrong sheet.</u>

<u>Joanne Turner - Ms. Turner wished to speak re. Gilreath Loop Road.</u>

Martha Owen - Ms. Owen wished to speak re. Gilreath Loop Road.

Elsie Drake - Ms. Drake stated that she has a 1918 map of Willow Road showing from the railroad crossing to Evans Road.

<u>Lori Holbert - Ms. Holbert wished to speak re. Gilreath Loop Rd.</u>
<u>John Metcalf - Did not speak.</u>

Ron Metzger - Mr. Metzger favored the name Robert E. Lee Drive, does not favor it being changed to Robert E. Lee Lane.

Commissioner Edney made the motion to close the Public Hearing. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to delay action on these two roads until a map can be reviewed. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to approve all the lists of road names presented with the exception of Robert E. Lee Lane and Robert E. Lee Drive. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

SWEETWATER ROAD/GILREATH LOOP (SR 1334)

<u>Daryll & Pat Osteen - Did not speak.</u>

Joe Gilreath - Mr. Gilreath stated that the petition he generated (Gilreath Loop Road) that was signed by 11 property owners represented 7,065 feet of road frontage, 60% of the road frontage. Joann Turner - Mrs. Turner was in favor of keeping the name Gilreath Loop Road.

Martha Owen - Mrs. Owen was in favor of Sweetwater Road, not Gilreath Loop Road.

Martha Lyda - Did not speak.

Lori Holbert - Mrs. Holbert was in favor of Gilreath Loop Road. Violet Hall - Mrs. Hall lives on SR # 1334 and favors some form of Sweetwater in the road name.

After much discussion, Commissioner McKay made the motion to name SR # 1334 "GILREATH LOOP ROAD". All voted in favor and the motion carried. State Road #1334 will be known as Gilreath Loop Road from this day forward.

ANIMAL NUISANCE APPEAL - Wayne & Nancy Quick

Brenda Miller, Director of Henderson County Animal Control, informed the Board that she issued a compliance order to Wayne & Nancy Quick on 11/3/92 due to complaints they received about a chow mix named "Frisbee". Neighbors complained that the dog was running loose and getting into garbage and depositing feces in their yard. Mrs. Miller talked with the Quicks, they refused to put the dog up so she issued a compliance order. Since the compliance order has been issued, they have responded. To her knowledge, Mrs. Miller states they have been keeping the dog under restraint. No more complaints have been received.

The Quicks called the office this afternoon after 5:00 p.m. and stated that they would not be here for the meeting. They gave no explanation.

Commissioner Edney made the motion for the Board to deny the appeal for failure of the Quicks to appear and prosecute it. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

<u>TAX REFUND - Youngblood Transportation</u> - this item was moved to after the Executive Session.

SALUDA WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION INSURANCE

Rocky Hyder, Fire Marshall, stated that the Saluda Fire Department had requested that Henderson County pay half of their workmen's compensation premiums. They also requested that they be included on the Henderson County policy. This was consistent with what the Board has done in the past in providing workmen's compensation coverage to the fire departments. Saluda Fire District is halved by the Henderson County/Polk County Lines.

Mr. Hyder feels that it would not be fair to Saluda Fire Department or to Henderson County to include them on our policy. It would be much more cost effective to supplement their current policy. N.C. State Law prohibits insurance companies from accessing an experience modification factor on annual policies which are less than \$5,000. Saluda's annual policy is \$1,333. The Henderson County Firefighters policy has an experience modification factor of 3.23 which is a multiplier. If Saluda were to be added to our policy, their \$1,333 annual premium would be multiplied by 3.23 to come up with an annual premium.

Rocky Hyder's recommendation was to subsidize their current policy, giving them \$666.50 annually or 50% of their annual premium.

Commissioner Kumor made the motion to follow the recommendation of the Fire Marshall and pay 50% of the current annual premium for the Saluda Fire Department. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

ETOWAH LIBRARY - Addition and Renovations

Bill Snyder informed the Board that the Library has received a bequest of \$100,000 for Etowah Library improvements. They propose to solve ADA accessibility problems, solve septic system problems, and improve the facility.

He requested that the Board of Commissioners direct the establishment of a Capital Project and approve the hiring of Mr. William O'Cain, AIA to design the project. The Library Board would like to complete the design and specifications by April 1993 and begin construction in late spring or early summer.

David Thompson reminded the Board that they had previously considered the issue but deferred a decision until a line item cost figure could be presented. He recommended approval of the project up to an amount not to exceed the \$100,000 bequest and approval of Mr. O'Cain preparing bid documents. He also requested that he be allowed to approve change orders up to \$5,000 in-house.

After discussion, Commissioner McKay made the motion to approve the recommendation of the County Manager for an amount not to exceed the funds accrued with this bequest. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

ADOPTION OF SOLID WASTE ORDINANCE

Nippy Page reminded the Board that the Solid Waste Advisory Committee has spent the last couple of months rewriting the Solid Waste Ordinance for Henderson County and presented it to the Board for their consideration. Ms. Page is presently rewriting the Table of Contents. Collection of delinquent fees is not included so a section needs to be incorporated. Mr. Matteson had suggested that some wording in the Ordinance be changed from Mobile Homes to Manufactured Homes.

There was much discussion. Commissioner Edney suggested that they work on incorporating the items discussed today and bring back the final draft for the Board's approval.

APPROVAL OF GRANT OF \$15,910 to SUPPORT A SMOKING CESSATION PROJECT TARGETING PREGNANT WOMEN

The Henderson County Health Department with the approval of the Board of Health, applied for a grant from the Healthy Start Foundation to fund a local project to provide assistance and support for pregnant women who smoke. There is considerable scientific data which indicates that women who smoke during pregnancy have more babies with health problems (fetal deaths, prematurity, and low birth weights) than women who do not smoke.

The grant proposes to encourage and assist pregnant women, as well as members of their household, to stop smoking. This is a one-time demonstration grant with no requirement for matching funds. It will overlap our fiscal years running out in December 1993. No additional personnel will be required.

It was the County Manager's recommendation to approve the request as there is no match requirement from Henderson County.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to approve the request as presented. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

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APPROVAL OF LOCAL BREAST AND CERVICAL CANCER CONTROL PROGRAM AND STATE FUNDING OF \$20,569

The N.C. Division of Adult Health Services is providing funding to all Health Departments to establish or expand programs for screening and early detection of breast and cervical cancer. The program targets women over 40 with family incomes below 200% of the poverty level.

The program will be funded for at least five years. It requires a 25% local match which can be made "in-kind". No additional local funding will be required or requested.

The Health Department will contract for the clinical services which will include a pelvic exam, pap smear, breast exam, and teaching self-breast examination. Mammograms, paid for by the program, must be provided by facilities accredited by the American College of Radiology. The services of a part-time (20%) medical office assistant or licensed practical nurse will be required to handle the paperwork, appointments, follow-up and reporting.

The program has been approved by the Henderson County Board of Health. It will provide important screening services which should reduce the number of deaths caused by cervical and breast cancer in our populations which do not routinely have physical exams and mammograms.

David Thompson reminded the Board that there is no local funding required for the project.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to approve the request as presented. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

ZONING ORDINANCE AMENDMENTS - PUD

Matt Matteson requested that a Public Hearing be set regarding a proposed amendment to the Zoning Ordinance regarding permitting Planned Unit Developments (upon issuance of a Special use Permit in R-40, T-20, T-15 and O & I Zoning Districts). The Planning Board voted five to two to give this request a favorable recommendation.

Commissioner Edney made the motion to set the Public Hearing for February 1 @ 7:00 p.m. here. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

REQUEST FOR REMOVAL OF ROOM TAX PENALTY

David Nicholson informed the Board that Ramada Inn has requested that their late penalty be removed. The request was based on the fact that they mailed their check on October 15 instead of hand

delivering it. It was not postmarked until October 16. The late penalty was for the minimum which is \$25.

The local act establishing the room tax indicates that the Board of Commissioners may for good cause shown forgive or compromise the late penalty.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to sustain (uphold) the late penalty of \$25.00. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

NOMINATIONS

Nominations were rolled until after Executive Session so possible nominees could be discussed during Executive Session. A list of possible nominees will be generated for public inspection and these nominations will appear for appointment on the next agenda.

CANE CREEK WATER & SEWER DISTRICT

The Board adjourned as the Henderson County Board of Commissioners and convened as the Cane Creek Water & Sewer District.

MUD CREEK WATER & SEWER DISTRICT

The Board adjourned as the Henderson County Board of Commissioners and convened as the Mud Creek Water & Sewer District.

CHANGE OF MEETING DATE

Commissioner Kumor made the motion that the next Commissioners' Meeting be moved from December 16 to December 23 at 9:00 a.m. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Commissioner Edney made the motion for the Board to go into Executive Session as allowed under General Statute 143-318.11 to discuss the following matters:

- A. To discuss a personnel matter.
- B. To consider the acquisition of real property.
- C. To consult with the County Attorney to the extent that confidentiality is required.

All voted in favor and the motion carried.

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Commissioner Kumor made the motion for the Board to go out of Executive Session. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

ACTION

Robert Baird discussed a tax release for Stoney Mtn. Baptist Church with the Board in Executive Session.

Commissioner Kumor made the motion to accept the recommendation of the Tax Assessor if the paperwork is in order and grant the tax release request for Stoney Mtn. Baptist Church. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.

RESOLUTION

NORTH CAROLINA HENDERSON COUNTY

Upon motion by Commissioner Edney, RESOLVED that the Board of Commissioners of the County of Henderson, approve the boundary lines of the Gerton Fire District for insurance grading purposes only in accordance with the maps and description filed this date with the Board of County Commissioners and recorded in the minutes of the meeting. Said Gerton Fire District being described as follows:

BEGINNING at Point (1) on US 74, 1.2 miles Northwest of Grant Mountain Road (1602); thence in a Northeasterly direction to Point (2) at the end of Middle Fork Road (1606), 1 mile Northwest of its intersection with SR 1605 and continuing Northeasterly to Point (3) at the Henderson-Buncombe County line; thence in a general Southwesterly direction along the Henderson-Buncombe County line to Point (4) where Bearwallow Road (1594) intersects; thence in a Southeasterly direction to Point (5) .2 mile North of the intersection of SR 1602 and SR 1604; thence in a Northerly direction along SR 1602, including property within 500 feet on the East to a Point (6), 0.8 mile from its intersection with SR 1604; thence in a Westerly direction to the Point (7) on Grant Mountain Road (1602) which is 1 mile Southeast of its intersection with US Highway 74; thence in a Northwesterly direction to the point of BEGINNING, excluding property on SR 1602 and US 74 between this and the preceding point.

NOTE 1:

This description describes an area of Henderson County pursuant to G.S. 153A-233 for Insurance Grading Purposes Only.

NOTE 2:

Points 1, 2, 3, 6 and 7 are adjoining points with Bat Cave Fire Department.

NOTE 3:

Point 5 adjoins Bat Cave Fire Department to the Southeast and Edneyville Fire Department to the Southwest.

Dear Commissioner Edney,

On October 10, 1976, our church was chartered as Stoney Mountain Baptist Church, at which time the tax office was made aware the church had purchased 6.01 acres of land at 3301 Asheville Highway, Hendersonville, NC. Mr Lee Hill was told by the tax office that the church would have to pay taxes on approximately two acres of land that was still in woods at the time the land was purchased.

In 1984, the remaining land was cleared for additional parking, and the church continued to pay taxes on this property.

Each year we have listed our taxes and always accepted the tax office assessment of what we owed. Until two years ago!

In December, 1990, the church received a tax bill for \$2,817.81. We felt this was excessive, so Mr. Lee Hill, one of our trustees, and also a deacon of the church, took the bill and talked to Mr. Mark Edney in the tax office on 12/5/90. Mr. Edney told Mr. Hill to forget the bill, and that the church should never have gotten a bill in the first place, as churches are exempt from paying taxes. Approximately two weeks later, we were told verbally that we owed the amount of \$107.47. At this time, Mr. Hill went back to the tax office with a check for \$107.47 and was told that this amount was incorrect and would not accept the check for \$107.47.

On February 7, 1991, the church had the property appraised by an independent appraiser for the purpose of borrowing money for the construction of our new sanctuary. The appraiser found that the church had a bill of \$532,000.00 on the computer that was owed in back taxes, and also that the church was not listed as being a tax exempt organization!

The last week in February, Mr. Lee Hill and the pastor, Rev. Charles Rogers, paid a visit to the tax assessor's office and talked with Mr. Baird. He indicated to us that we must fill out a tax exempt form in order for our church to come under tax exempt status. We did this the next day, filling in the blanks with the information we had obtained from the appraiser that the church had hired! The following day, Mr. Doyle Freeman came to physically inspect the church property!

Following Mr. Freeman's visit to the church, we were told we owed a bill of \$254.21, which was set by Mr. Baird, based on the information he received from the church on the tax exempt form.

On March 4, 1991, Mr. Hill and Mr. Ed Whitley visited Mr. Bill McKay at the county commissioners' office. They explained to him our situation and he indicated he would look into the matter!

On March 21, 1991, Mr. Hill, Mr. Whitley and Pastor Rogers met with Mr. Baird at his office. Mr. Baird indicated that our situation had been brought before the county commissioners and a vote was taken, which was not unanimous, but which passed, indicating that past taxes would be cleared off, but we still must pay the 1990 tax of \$254.21.

We paid the 1991 taxes and filed application for property tax exemption. We later recieved a bill for \$79.80 for 1.33 acres which the tax board says we are not using. We feel this property should be tax exempt because it serves as a buffer zone between our church and the Stoney Mountain Residential Estates.

On October 6, 1992, we recieved a bill for the 1.33 acres for \$4,560.57. This is totally ridiculous, we have tried every way to work with the tax office and get our church tax exempt.

Mr. Commissioner, we are tax payers, and we feel our church has been singled out, and that it is past time for some action. There are other churches that have property that is not being used, but they are tax exempt. Would you please come to our rescue, because we do not wish to go public with this matter, but we will unless something is done. Thank you for your help in getting our church releaved from this burden.
