MINUTES

STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA COUNTY OF HENDERSON

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS DECEMBER 18, 1991

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled meeting at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the Henderson County Office Building.

Those present were: Chairman J. Michael Edney, Vice-Chairman Vollie G. Good, Commissioner Hugh D. Randall, Commissioner F. Richard Baker, Commissioner William McKay, County Manager David F. Thompson, Assistant County Manager/Finance Director David E. Nicholson, County Attorney Don H. Elkins, and Clerk to the Board Elizabeth W. Corn.

CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

Chairman Edney called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner Baker led the pledge to the American Flag.

INVOCATION

Jerry Hyder, Associate Pastor of Mud Creek Baptist Church gave the invocation.

REVIEW OF MINUTES

Minutes were presented of the following meetings:

November 20, 1991 November 26, 1991 December 2, 1991

The minutes were approved as presented.

DISCUSSION/ADJUSTMENT OF AGENDA

David Thompson deleted item "C" under Unfinished Business, Green River Management Board. Mr. Thompson added item "H" under New Business, Cane Creek Sewer Increase. This item was for information purposes only.

PUBLIC INPUT

<u>Danny McConnell -</u> Mr. McConnell lives in Dana. He spoke regarding the Voluntary Farm Preservation Ordinance, suggesting a wording change to the section on land records requirements.

CITY-COUNTY SCHOOL MERGER

David Thompson informed the Board of letters that Chairman Edney sent to both the City and County School Board Chairmen acknowledging receipt of their separate merger plans. In the letter, Chairman Edney requested that representatives of both Boards be present at this meeting to inform the County Commissioners on how they plan on resolving school merger.

Chairman Edney stated that the merger plan was due today, December 18, 1991. Since that has not happened, he asked representatives from both school boards to speak on the subject.

Hardy Caldwell, Chairman of the Henderson County Board of Education spoke first stating that he had new information as of this morning and could not speak on behalf of his board until they have a chance to see the information.

Frank Ewbank, Chairman of Hendersonville Board of Education informed the Board that the city has approved the merger plan with minor revisions and they stand ready to act on that plan.

The two consultants, Mr. Miller and Mr. Burchfiel spoke briefly, stating that basically everything has been agreed upon except the pupil assignment policy. Binding arbitration was briefly discussed and Dr. Miller recommended someone from the Institute of Government be used if we do go into binding arbitration.

Chairman Edney requested both school boards meet with the Board of Commissioners, here, January 6, 1992 at 6:00 p.m. for discussion of the merger plan.

PROPOSED FARMLAND PRESERVATION ORDINANCE

Matt Matteson submitted the most recent draft (dated 12/5/91) of the proposed Farmland Preservation Ordinance for the Board's review and comment. This draft reflects modifications made to the proposed ordinance since it was reviewed and amended by the Planning Board. The December 5th changes were made collectively by the County Attorney, the County Manager and the County Planner and did not substantially alter the proposed ordinance.

Mr. Matteson has supplied copies of the draft to the Soil Conservation Service, the Register of Deeds, the County Assessor, the County Extension Agent and to Frank Fitzsimmons and Don Ward.

David Thompson discussed Mr. McConnell's suggestion (public input) stating that it could be done by changing the word <u>may</u> to <u>shall</u> on page 17. Mr. Thompson suggested that if the Board is ready to

adopt the ordinance that they do so contingent upon final review by the County Attorney.

There was discussion of the Sewer Use Ordinance in connection with this Ordinance.

Bob Carter, a soil conservationist, stated that maybe some language should be put into this Ordinance that would refer to the Sewer Use Ordinance. Mr. Thompson stated that the Sewer Use Ordinance would have precedence.

Commissioner McKay made the motion that the Ordinance, as amended, be adopted by this Board subject to approval by the County Attorney. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

ROAD PETITION

The original road petition to add Village Drive to the state maintenance system was postponed because of the Planning Department's recommendation. Village Drive is a road name duplication.

Matt Matteson informed the Board that Village Drive is located in the city's extraterritorial jurisdiction and the city has approved the name.

After much discussion, Commissioner Baker made the motion to send the petition back to the planning department and that the planning department work with the developer to request a name change. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

NOMINATIONS

- 1. Chairman Edney informed the Board of 2 vacancies on the Job Training Partnership Act Committee. There were no nominations so the item was rolled to the next meeting.
- 2. Chairman Edney informed the Board of 2 vacancies on the Henderson County Industrial Facilities & Pollution Control Authority. There were no nominations so the item was rolled to the next meeting.
- 3. Chairman Edney informed the Board of 2 vacancies on the Nursing Home/Domiciliary Home Advisory Committee. Both Mr. Warren and Ms. Arnold are willing to serve another term if nominated.

Commissioner Baker made the motion to reappoint Webb Warren and Dorothy Arnold. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

4. Chairman Edney informed the Board of 1 vacancy on the Henderson County Planning Board. Bob Brummett has indicated that he is willing to serve another term if nominated.

Commissioner Good made the motion to reappoint Mr. Brummett to the Henderson County Planning Board. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

5. David Thompson addressed the Henderson County Land Use Steering Committee. He has requested a minimum of 15 members up to whatever number the Board of Commissioners may choose. Mr. Thompson has supplied each Board member with a lengthy list of possible candidates. Each Commissioner is asked to fill out the supplied "Listing of Candidates for Henderson County Land Use Plan Steering Committee" and return to David Thompson. Mr. Thompson will act as the clearinghouse for these lists.

Mr. Thompson requested that this Committee be put on the agenda for the January 6 meeting for nominations with the following criteria used for selection of nominees. The individual nominees should be:

- 1. Advocates of community planning.
- 2. Respected by the citizens within the community.
- 3. Be active within the community.
- 4. Be knowledgeable about Henderson County and the problems we're facing as a county now, and will be facing in the future.
- 5. Be a "team-player" with leadership capabilities.

REFUNDING OF BOND ISSUE

David Nicholson presented the bond order. He presented a preliminary financing timetable for the advanced refunding of the 1983 School, Technical College, and Hospital Bond Issue. The actual process of the refunding began with the introduction of the bond order. Mr. Nicholson requested the Board set the Public Hearing on this issue for January 6, 1991 at 7:00 p.m.

The primary reason for the refunding is the savings to the county because of the lower interest rate available now.

Commissioner Baker introduced the following bond order which was read at length:

"BOND ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,900,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF HENDERSON"

WHEREAS, the County of Henderson (the "County") has issued School Bonds, dated March 1, 1983 (the "School Bonds"), and \$3,525,000 of the School Bonds are outstanding (the "Outstanding School Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the County has issued Technical College Bonds, dated March 1, 1983 (the "Technical College Bonds"), and \$475,000 of the Technical College Bonds are outstanding (the "Outstanding Technical College Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the County has issued Hospital Bonds, dated March 1, 1983 (the "Hospital Bonds") and \$375,000 of the Hospital Bonds are outstanding (the "Outstanding Hospital Bonds"): and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of the County deems it advisable to refund the Outstanding School Bonds, the Outstanding Technical College Bonds and the Outstanding Hospital Bonds (collectively referred to herein as the "Outstanding Bonds") pursuant to and in accordance with The Local Government Finance Act; and

WHEREAS, an application has been filed with the Secretary of the Local Government Commission of North Carolina requesting Commission approval of the Bonds hereinafter described as required by The Local Government Finance Act, and the Secretary of the Local Government Commission has notified the Board that the application has been accepted for submission to the Local Government Commission; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDERED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Henderson, as follows:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners of the County has ascertained and hereby determines that it is advisable to refund the Outstanding Bonds.

Section 2. In order to raise the money required to refund the Outstanding Bonds as set forth above, in addition to any funds which may be made available for such purpose from any other source, bonds of the County are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to The Local Government Finance Act of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate principal amount of bonds authorized by this bond order shall be \$4,900,000.

Section 3. A tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds when due shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 4. A sworn statement of the County's debt has been filed with the Clerk to the Board and is open to public inspection.

Section 5. This bond order shall take effect upon its adoption.

Commissioner McKay moved the adoption of the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the bond order entitled, "BOND ORDER AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$4,900,000 GENERAL OBLIGATION REFUNDING BONDS OF THE COUNTY OF HENDERSON," has been introduced at the meeting of the

Board of Commissioners of the County of Henderson held on December 18, 1991 and the Board of Commissioners of the County of Henderson desires to provide for the holding of a public hearing thereon and the submission of a statement of debt in connection therewith as required by The Local Government Bond Act; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the County of Henderson, as follows;

(1) The public hearing upon said bond order shall be held on the 6th day of January, 1992 at 7 o'clock P.M., at the County Office Building, in Hendersonville, North Carolina.

(2) The Clerk to the Board is hereby directed to cause a copy of the bond order to be published with a notice of such hearing in the form prescribed by law in a qualified newspaper no fewer than

six days prior to such public hearing.

(3) The County's Finance Officer is hereby directed to file with the Clerk prior to publication of the bond order with the notice of such public hearing, a statement setting forth the debt incurred or to be incurred, the appraised value of property subject to taxation by the County and the net debt of the County.

The motion was seconded by Commissioner Good and was adopted by the following vote:

1991 UNITED WAY CAMPAIGN

Tom Johnson, Health Director, headed up Henderson County Government's efforts for the United Way campaign this year. He presented a summary of the campaign. Last year Henderson County donations totaled \$6,773, this year donations totaled \$9,758 for a 44% increase over last year. Mr. Johnson thanked all the departmental representatives for their hard work.

Chairman Edney thanked Tom Johnson and all the staff that helped with the campaign and those who contributed to the campaign.

LAND OF SKY - Optional Relocation Benefits Policy Manual Amendment

Matt Matteson had spoken with Cinthia Milner, Grants Administrator/Planner for Land of Sky. Ms. Milner informed him that the Board needed to readopt the Optional Relocation Benefits Policy Manual with amendments.

Mr. Matteson informed the Board that readoption of the manual would not cost the county any additional monies but is necessary because of new federal regulations. There needs to be some changes in categories in the budget.

Commissioner Good made the motion for the Board to adopt the new manual and the associated budget amendment. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

DEED INDEX CONSOLIDATION

Ms. Maxwell, Register of Deeds, submitted a resolution for adoption by our Board. "Resolution Adopting New Index Books In The Office Of The Register Of Deeds As Official County Records."

Don Elkins recommended the Boards' adoption of the Resolution.

Commissioner Randall made the motion for the Board to adopt the new books as the Official County Records. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

TAX RELEASES

Robert Baird, Henderson County Assessor, submitted a list of sixty-eight (68) tax release requests.

Commissioner Good made the motion, if all the paperwork is in order, to approve these releases as recommended. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

TAX REFUNDS

Robert Baird submitted a list of eleven (11) tax refund requests.

Commissioner Good made the motion, if all the paperwork is in order, to approve these refunds as recommended. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

NOTIFICATION OF VACANCIES

Chairman Edney informed the Board of one vacancy on the Solid Waste Advisory Committee. Mr. Whorton Nelson resigned. We will need to appoint someone to fill his unexpired term. This will appear on the next agenda for nominations.

Chairman Edney informed the Board of one vacancy on the Nursing Home/Domiciliary Home Advisory Committee. Ms. Katherine Adams' term expired in August of this year but we failed to note it at the time. Ms. Adams has been sent a letter to see if she is willing to serve again if nominated but we have not gotten a response as yet.

MANAGER'S UPDATE

a. Bids on House Removal

David Nicholson informed the Board that on December 11 he opened bids for the removal of five houses from the proposed courthouse complex site. Included in all of the proposals is the removal of any buildings, the associated clean-up and levelling of the lots. Bids were taken for both payment by the County and to the County for these houses, due to the varying value of the houses. The following bids were awarded:

- 423 First Avenue-Charles Town will pay to the County \$500.
- 322 Second Avenue-Charles Town will pay to the County \$1001.
- 319 Third Avenue-County will pay to S. Blackwell \$1250.
- 323 Third Avenue-County will pay to S. Blackwell \$1050.
- 331 Third Avenue-Charles Town will pay to the County \$500.

Included in the agreement with these contractors is a completion date of March 1, 1992. Any extension beyond that date will have to be approved in writing by Henderson County. Net cost to the county on these five buildings is \$299.00.

b. Environmental Impact Ordinance

David Thompson informed the Board that he has submitted a letter to 22 groups/individuals along with a copy of the Environmental Impact Ordinance which has been in use in Orange County, North Carolina. He requested their comments on such an ordinance for Henderson County. Upon receipt, staff will consolidate remarks and use them to prepare a draft ordinance for Henderson County.

There was discussion and it was decided that staff should contact those that have not been heard from yet, to see if they plan to respond.

c. Solid Waste Management

David Thompson informed the Board that the implementation of tipping fees on January 1 is working smoothly. The advertisements are ready for the newspaper, the brochures are at the printers and it looks like we will make the January 1, 1992 deadline.

Mr. Thompson discussed the possibility of expanding Nippy Page's title, Recycling Coordinator to Integrated Solid Waste Planner with Eldon Owen taking on the recycling operation's responsibilities.

He informed the Board that they hope to open the Construction & Demolition Landfill January 1, 1992.

Mr. Thompson informed the Board that staff will be preparing a draft grant proposal for recycling.

d. Naples area sewer improvements

Mr. Thompson discussed this briefly with the Board and informed them that Jim Erwin is meeting with FMHA to see if we qualify for the grant we previously applied for.

e. Comprehensive Land Use Plan

David Thompson discussed the agreement between Henderson County and Wolpert Consultants for preparation of our Comprehensive Land Use Plan. One of the reasons this firm was chosen was because of the detail of numerous documents they will provide which will be available to help educate the public on the Land Use Plan.

The timetable for the project covers the period from December 1991 through December 1992.

f. Financial Report

David Nicholson handed out the financial report for November 1991 and briefly discussed it with the Board. Attached is copy of same. He also informed them of the status of the one cent sales tax.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Commissioner McKay made the motion for the Board to go into Executive Session. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner McKay made the motion for the Board to go out of Executive Session. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

ANNUAL CHRISTMAS LUNCHEON ANNOUNCEMENT

Chairman Edney informed all that the Board will recess for the Annual Christmas Luncheon for County Employees. The luncheon is from noon to 2:00 p.m. at the Parish Hall of St. James Episcopal Church. The Board will resume proceedings following the luncheon.
