BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
NOVEMBER 4, 1991

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled meeting at 7:00 p.m. in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the Henderson County Office Building.

Those present were: Chairman J. Michael Edney, Vice-Chairman Vollie G. Good, Commissioner F. Richard Baker, Commissioner Hugh D. Randall, Commissioner William McKay, County Manager David F. Thompson, Assistant County Manager/Finance Director David E. Nicholson, County Attorney Don H. Elkins, and Clerk to the Board Elizabeth W. Corn.

CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

Chairman Edney called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner McKay led the pledge to the American Flag.

INVOCATION

Morris Kaplan of Agudas Israel Congregation gave the invocation.

REVIEW OF MINUTES

Minutes were presented for review of the October 23 meeting. The minutes were approved as corrected.

DISCUSSION/ADJUSTMENT of AGENDA

David Thompson added a Resolution as item "C" under Unfinished Business. He also deleted item "B" under New Business, to be postponed until the November 20 meeting. He informed the Board that item "E" under New Business was in two parts, one part that had been left off the agenda for Untimely Tax Exemptions.

PUBLIC HEARING - Proposed Vested Rights Ordinance

Mr. Matteson, County Planner, informed the Board that the draft ordinance was reviewed by the Planning Board on September 24, 1991, and had been discussed at a previous Commissioners' Meeting. New legislation requires the adoption of such an ordinance.

Commissioner Good and Matt Matteson attended the Hendersonville Home Builders Association meeting on October 10 to discuss this ordinance.

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Mr. Matteson stated that the Ordinance would allow any developer to enter into an agreement with Henderson County so that a vestiture may be obtained. That would be a two (2) year minimum which could be extended to five (5) years upon request. The draft application form was reviewed and discussed as was fees.

Commissioner Baker made the motion to go into Public Hearing to hear public comment on the proposed Vested Rights Ordinance. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

No one signed up to speak. Chairman Edney asked if anyone in attendance would like to speak, no one chose to speak.

Commissioner Baker made the motion to close the Public Hearing. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

This item will appear on the next agenda for action.

PUBLIC INPUT

Sam McGuirt - Mr. McGuirt is with Duke Power and read a prepared statement regarding Duke Power Company's Operation of the Tuxedo Hydroelectric Station.

ACCEPTANCE OF MOUNTAIN AREA LAND USE PLANNING GRANT

A draft contract was presented for the acceptance of a grant offered in the amount of \$30,000 for the development of the County's Comprehensive Land Use Plan. Mr. Thompson requested authorization to execute the grant acceptance with the stipulation that there will be no substantial changes from the draft.

Commissioner McKay made the motion that the County Manager be authorized to execute the grant and the County will supply up to \$7,500 in matching monies. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

NOMINATIONS

1. Chairman Edney reminded the Board of 3-5 appointments needed on the Community Child Protection Team and asked for any nominations.

Commissioner Baker nominated Mary Ruth Smith, Commissioner McKay nominated Larry Swabe, Commissioner Good nominated George Knopf, Commissioner Randall nominated Steve Briggs, and Chairman Edney nominated Ken Lanning. Commissioner Baker made the motion to suspend the rules and appoint these five people. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

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2. Chairman Edney reminded the Board of 1 vacancy on the Youth Advisory Board due to a resignation.

Commissioner Good nominated Rick Wood to fill this vacancy. Commissioner McKay made the motion to suspend the rules and appoint Mr. Wood. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

3. Chairman Edney reminded the Board of 2 vacancies on the Job Training Partnership Act Committee. There were no nominations at this time so the item was rolled to the next meeting.

RESOLUTION Regarding Simplification of Public Assistance Programs, and Alexander vs. Flaherty Negotiations

Liston Smith, Director of Social Services, presented a draft Ordinance he had prepared. He reviewed the Ordinance and the Board was in agreement with his views. The purpose of the Ordinance is to try to get our legislators to realize the exorbitant amount of paperwork required and the increased workload that is expected of the Social Workers as well as the increased administrative costs versus the decrease in benefits.

Commissioner Baker made the motion to adopt the Resolution subject to approval by the County Attorney. A vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

REQUEST FOR SEMI-AUTOMATIC DEFIBRILLATORS

Mr. Thompson recently met with Bill Stewart and Rick Livingston who are representing the Henderson County Fire Chiefs Association and the Henderson County Fireman's Association concerning a request for the purchase of semi-automatic defibrillators. This request was made at budget time but not funded by the Board at that time.

Rich Livingston addressed the Board and read a prepared statement expressing the need and desire of six departments to get assistance from the County Commissioners in the amount of \$38,612.40 to purchase six defibrillators so they can start the EMT-D program immediately. There was much discussion. No action was taken and this item will be on the agenda for November 20.

REQUEST FOR AMENDMENT TO SPECIAL USE PERMIT - Carriage Park PUD

Mr. Matteson, County Planner, presented a request from Mr. Jim Creekman of First Citizens Bank for an amendment to a Special Use Permit granted by the Board on March 7, 1988. This should be handled in the same manner as a new request. It must first be presented to the Board of Commissioners and after such notification the item should be formally referred to the Planning Board for recommended action. This will be followed by a public hearing held by the Board of Commissioners.

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Mr. Creekman addressed the Board. Chairman Edney referred this item to the Planning Board for their recommendation.

REQUESTS for Removal of Room Tax Penalties

David Nicholson presented four requests to the Board for consideration. All four are for removal of the room tax penalties:

1. TJR Properties (Ramada Inn)
2. Gerton Lakeside Motel
3. Southernaire Motel
4. Terrace Court

The late penalty is \$10.00 per day and an additional 5% after 30 days. The local act indicates that "the Board of Commissioners may, for good cause shown, forgive or compromise the late penalty". The penalty amount changes effective with taxes due after October 1, 1991. It will then be 1% of the taxes due.

There was much discussion. Commissioner Baker addressed the Gerton Lakeside Motel penalty moving that the penalty be reduced to \$25.00. A vote was taken and the motion failed four to one. Commissioner McKay moved that the penalty stand as assessed on all four requests. A vote was taken and the motion carried four to one.

UNTIMELY TAX EXEMPT APPLICATIONS

1. First Church of the Nazarene

Robert Baird, Tax Assessor, presented this request for tax exempt status from the First Church of the Nazarene on Washington Street. Under N.C. G.S. 105.282.1, untimely applications may be approved by the Henderson County Board of Commissioners.

The property in question is used for a parking lot. Mr. Baird submitted the application for the Board's approval.

2. Pauline Pinkston

Robert Baird, Tax Assessor, presented this request for elderly tax exempt status from Ms. Pauline Pinkston of Hendersonville. He submitted the application for the Board's approval.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to grant both the exemption requests. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

TAX RELEASE REQUESTS (140)

Robert Baird presented an accumulation of releases. He has reviewed all the releases and has found the backup documentation

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to be in order. He submitted the releases for the approval of the Henderson County Board of Commissioners.

Commissioner Good made the motion to approve these requests if the paperwork is in order. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

TAX REFUND REQUESTS (11)

Robert Baird presented an accumulation of refunds. He has reviewed all the refunds and has found the backup documentation to be in order. He submitted the refunds for the approval of the Henderson County Board of Commissioners.

Commissioner Good made the motion to approve these requests if the paperwork is in order. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

NOTIFICATION OF VACANCIES

1. Henderson County Travel and Tourism Committee- Chairman Edney informed the Board of four vacancies effective December 91. This will appear as a nomination on the November 20 agenda.

PROCLAMATION of AMERICAN EDUCATION WEEK

A proclamation was addressed from Ms. Betsy Hinkle, President-Elect of the Henderson County Association of Educators. She wished to proclaim the week of November 17-23 as AMERICAN EDUCATION WEEK.

Commissioner Randall made the motion that the Board endorse the proclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

REQUEST FOR JOINT MEETING WITH SOLID WASTE ADVISORY COMMITTEE (SWAC)

David Thompson informed the Board that the Solid Waste Management Planning Study has been completed by David M. Griffith Associates, Ltd. and received in his office. Mr. Thompson feels it would be appropriate for the Board of County Commissioners to call a special meeting to discuss the study and the overall plan of action for addressing the solid waste management needs of Henderson County. Mr. Thompson recommended some dates for the meeting.

By consensus it was decided to try to get together with the Solid Waste Advisory Committee on Monday, November 18 at 7:00 p.m. An alternate date was chosen of Tuesday, November 19 at 7:00 p.m.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Commissioner Baker made the motion for the Board to go into Executive Session to discuss matters as allowed under General Statute 143-318.11. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

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Commissioner Good made the motion for the Board to go out of Executive Session. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 11:35 p.m.
