# STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA COUNTY OF HENDERSON

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MAY 6, 1991

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled meeting at 7:00 p.m. in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the Henderson County Office Building.

Those present were: Chairman J. Michael Edney, Vice-Chairman Vollie G. Good, Commissioner F. Richard Baker, Commissioner Hugh D. Randall, Commissioner William McKay, Interim County Manager Jerry D. Myers, Finance Director David E. Nicholson, and Clerk to the Board Elizabeth W. Corn.

County Attorney Don H. Elkins was not in attendance but was expected later in the meeting.

# CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

Chairman Edney called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

# PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Commissioner McKay led in the pledge to the American Flag.

#### INVOCATION

Rev. Walter Treadway of East Flat Rock First Baptist Church gave the invocation.

#### REVIEW OF MINUTES

Minutes were presented for review of the following meetings: March 4, 1991, April 17, 1991, and April 25, 1991. Minutes were approved as presented.

#### DISCUSSION/ADJUSTMENT OF AGENDA

"B" Cable Review Committee Interim Report was added under UNFINISHED BUSINESS.

Rescheduling of the mid-month meeting was added as first item of discussion under NEW BUSINESS.

#### PUBLIC HEARING

Commissioner Baker made the motion to go into Public Hearing to hear comments on the proposed amendments to the Henderson County Zoning Ordinance. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Matt Matteson, County Planner, briefed the Board on the proposed amendments.

The Henderson County Planning Board has reviewed and recommended the following proposed amendments to the Henderson County Zoning Ordinance.

1. Amendment to Section 808 regarding Accessory Buildings. The proposed amendment clarifies where and under what conditions accessory buildings and structures can be placed, particularly for double fronted or corner lots.

There was no-one who wished to speak in regard to this proposed amendment.

2. Amendment to the Official Zoning Map. The proposal would extend the R-40 (Residential) zoning district in the Flat Rock area by approximately 200 acres and would encompass previously unzoned areas of the Kingwood Subdivision, Claremont Subdivision and adjacent property west of Mine Gap Road.

Public in attendance who spoke in regard to this proposed amendment:

Bob Then- Lot # 46 531 Kingcrest Drive (Kingwood Subdivision).
Mr. Then spoke in favor of the zoning, it affects his lot.

<u>Juliet Brussell</u>- Lot # 9099 117 Continental Drive (Kingwood Subdivision). Ms. Brussell spoke in favor of the zoning, for uniformity.

<u>Bert Borserk- 115 Continental Drive (Kingwood Subdivision). Mr. Borserk spoke in favor of the zoning.</u>

<u>Tillie Cairnes- 281</u> Flat Rock, she lives across from Kingwood. From the map her property is involved and she spoke in opposition of her property being zoned.

<u>Jim Welter- 119 Continental Drive (Kingwood Subdivision). Mr. Welter spoke in favor of the zoning.</u>

<u>George Gosnell</u>- Zirconia Road, below Kingwood. He came tonight to find out if his property would be affected, it will not. He is opposed to his property being zoned.

Van Clinkscales - Lot # 48 Kingcrest Drive (Kingwood Subdivision).
Mr. Clinkscales spoke in favor of the zoning.

<u>Linda Charping- 208 Summersweet Lane (Kingwood Subdivision).</u> Mrs. Charping spoke in favor of the zoning.

John F. Potts- 418 Mine Gap Road East Flat Rock. Mr. Potts is not opposed to zoning of the property in question but is opposed to his

property being zoned. His property is not in question at this time.

Hortense Potts - 420 Mine Gap Road East Flat Rock. Mrs. Potts has property adjoining Claremont, property that is not in question at this time. Mrs. Potts does not wish her land zoned.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to close the Public Hearing. A vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

Chairman Edney stated that this item will be on the agenda again for the next meeting. At that time a decision will be made. He thanked everyone who came and spoke tonight.

# PUBLIC INPUT

Brenda Brock- 102 Lake Avenue. Mrs. Brock spoke on the Special District School Tax. She has written a letter to the Board of Commissioners expressing her views. Mrs. Brock feels that the Special District School Tax should be abolished. She feels that it is inequitable, there are people using the school system who are not being taxed and people who do not use the school system who are being taxed.

R.L. Roper - Mr. Roper spoke on Cable T.V., expressing that Multivision's rates are too high.

#### BUDGET CALENDAR AND SCHEDULE

David Nicholson addressed the Budget Calendar for fiscal year 1991-1992. The Department Head's have all turned in their budgets to the Finance Director. The last week or so Mr. Nicholson has been meeting with the Department Head's to review their budgets. Mr. Nicholson will have the budget ready to present to the Board of Commissioners sometime later this month. There was much discussion.

# CABLE TV REVIEW COMMITTEE REPORT

Commissioner Baker, Chairman of the Committee, asked Matt Matteson to present the recommendations from the committee.

Mr. Matteson stated that the Cable TV Review Committee has met on four occasions in public session for the purpose of reviewing the existing 1989 Cable TV Ordinance and looking at the options the county has regarding the upcoming expiration of the Franchise currently held by Multivision Cable.

There are three major recommendations:

1. Amendments to the Cable TV Ordinance. The Committee recommends that the Board of County Commissioners set a public hearing for June 3, 1991 to consider these amendments.

- 2. Expiration of the Franchise for Multivision. The Committee addressed options available to the County regarding the existing 15 year franchise. After thorough review of all the options several recommendations were offered. The Committee has scheduled another meeting for May 14 to refine these requirements into acceptable language which will be contained in a document known as the Franchise Ordinance. It is the intent of the Committee that this be put in final form and forwarded to the Board for first consideration no later than the June 3, 1991 meeting.
- 3. Cable TV Advisory Committee. The Committee agreed that due to the complexity of the operation of cable television systems and the added controls and review requirements specified in the 1989 Ordinance, the Board of Commissioners should consider the appointment of a five-member standing committee composed of citizens of the County who are knowledgeable in the field of communications or have related experience in cable television systems.

These are not final recommendations from the Committee, there may be some additions or adjustments made after the May 14 meeting. There was much discussion.

Commissioner Good made the motion to set a Public Hearing for June 3, 1991 at 7:00 p.m. to hear public input on the Cable TV Ordinance. A vote was taken and the motion carried unanimously.

## RESCHEDULING/MID-MONTH MEETING

Chairman Edney stated that it has been suggested that the Board move the mid-month meeting from May 15 to May 22, since there are only nine days between meetings.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to move the mid-month Commissioners' Meeting from May 15, 1991 to May 22, 1991. A vote was taken and the motion carried.

## INTERFAITH ASSISTANCE MINISTRY

Chairman Edney informed the Board that Margaret Milroy is not in attendance today. Mrs. Milroy had telephoned Commissioner McKay and he forwarded the request to the Board. Mrs. Milroy wished to invite the Commissioners to an Interfaith Assistance Ministry Sharing Breakfast at 7:30 a.m. on May 15 at the Chariot, at which time the Interfaith Assistance Ministry will share with the Board what they have accomplished and what they plan to do. Mrs. Milroy

assured Mr. McKay that they will not be asking for additional funds at that time.

The Clerk was directed to poll the Board at a later time and inform Mrs. Milroy of the number who plan to attend the breakfast.

# LAND OF SKY Presentation/Joan Tuttle

Mrs. Tuttle informed the Board that this month celebrates the 25th Anniversary of the Older Americans Act, their main purpose being to try to keep older adults at home. We viewed a 15 minute video. Mrs. Tuttle presented a mug to each of the Commissioners.

# SOLID WASTE ADVISORY COMMITTEE (SWAC) RECOMMENDATIONS

Roy Neill, Chairman of the Henderson County Solid Waste Advisory Committee, stated they have met and approved their Mission Statement and have some recommendations for changes to the By Laws. He presented the recommendations to the Board. There was discussion. There was no action taken today.

# COMMUNITY BASED ALTERNATIVES (CBA) TASK FORCE/George Knopf

Mr. Knopf reminded the Board that the CBA Task Force is made up of seven members of the community appointed by the Commissioners. He presented the Task Forces' recommendation as to how CBA funds should be distributed for the 1991-1992 fiscal year:

## LAND RECORDS RESOLUTION/Robert Baird

Mr. Baird, County Tax Assessor, requested the Board approve the attached resolution maintaining and keeping the Land Records program intact. There was much discussion.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to adopt the resolution as presented. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Chairman Edney recognized Mayor Bob Parrish and thanked him for coming.

## TAX FORECLOSURE/Offer to Purchase

Chairman Edney informed the Board of an offer to purchase by Walter Carpenter, substitute trustee under a Deed of Trust. Property was foreclosed in the name of John S. Barber.

Mr. Myers stated that the County Attorney has reviewed this offer and has no problem with it. Chairman Edney stated that the trustee wishes to foreclose, John Barber doesn't have a problem with it, but to foreclose properly Mr. Carpenter has to pay the taxes and get the property back in Mr. Barber's name before he can foreclose it.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to accept the Offer to Purchase. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

## TAX RELEASES

Robert Baird, Tax Supervisor, submitted request to the Board for 102 tax releases stating that he has reviewed all releases and supporting documentation is in order and on file in the County Assessor's Office.

Commissioner Baker made the motion to approve the tax releases, if all paperwork is in order, as submitted by Robert Baird. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

## TAX REFUNDS

Robert Baird submitted request to the Board for 44 tax refunds stating that he has reviewed all refund requests and supporting documentation is in order and on file in the County Assessor's Office.

Commissioner Baker made the motion to approve the tax refunds, if all paperwork is in order, as submitted by Robert Baird. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

## NOMINATIONS

1. Chairman Edney reminded the Board of 1 vacancy on the JTPA-Job Training Partnership Act and asked for any nominations. There were none so the item was rolled to the next meeting.

- 2. Chairman Edney reminded the Board of 1 vacancy on the Land of Sky Regional Council Advisory Council on Aging and asked for any nominations. There were none so the item was rolled to the next meeting.
- 3. Chairman Edney reminded the Board of 4 vacancies on the Nursing Home/Domiciliary Home Advisory Committee and asked for any nominations.

Commissioner Baker nominated Mrs. Eleanor (Grant) Healy and Mrs. Jody (Robert) Drake.

Chairman Edney nominated Mrs. Margaret Brown.

Commissioner McKay made the motion to appoint the above three persons for 3 of the 4 vacancies. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

# NOTIFICATION OF VACANCIES

Chairman Edney informed the Board of 3 vacancies on the Board of Health and 1 vacancy on Western North Carolina Tomorrow. These will be on the agenda next meeting for nominations.

# EXECUTIVE SESSION

Commissioner Baker made the motion for the Board to go into Executive Session. All voted in favor and the motion carried. Don Elkins, County Attorney was in attendance for Executive Session.

Commissioner Good made the motion for the Board to go out of Executive Session. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

The meeting was recessed until 7:00 p.m. Thursday, May 9. Executive Session will be continued at that time.
