CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

Chairman Hawkins called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

PUBLIC HEARINGS

Public Hearing for Rezoning Application #R-2018-09 Laughter, Residential One (R1) to Regional Commercial (RC)

Chairman Hawkins made the motion to go into public hearing for consideration of Rezoning Application #R-2018-09. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Eric Warren stated Rezoning Application #R-2018-09 was initiated on December 27, 2018 and requests that the County rezone approximately 6.06 acres of land from Residential One (R1) to Regional Commercial (RC). The acreage consists of 4 parcels. The property owners include Shane and Kelly Laughter, SE Johnston III, Phillip Gilliam, and Timothy Johnston. Shane Laughter will be serving as agent.

At the regularly scheduled meeting on March 21, 2019 the Planning Board voted 8-0 to forward this rezoning request with a favorable recommendation.

Before taking action on the application, the Board of Commissioners must hold a public hearing. In accordance with §42A-303 and §42A-346 (C) of the Henderson County Land Development Code and State Law, notice of the May 6, 2019 public hearing regarding rezoning application #R-2018-09 was published in

the Hendersonville Lightning on April 17th and April 24th. The Planning Department sent notices of the hearing via first class mail to the owners of properties adjacent to the Subject Area on April 22, 2019 and posted signs advertising the hearing on the Subject Area on April 22, 2019.

1. Shane Laughter, applicant, signed up to speak but made no comments.

Commissioner Messer made the motion to go out of public hearing. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Lapsley made the motion that the Board table the application until after the Tap Root Farm Public Hearing in June. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

2019.40 Public Hearing for Rezoning Application #R-2019-01 Hahn, Residential One (R1) to Industrial Chairman Hawkins made the motion to go into public hearing for consideration of Rezoning Application #R-2019-01. All voted in favor and the motion carried,

Eric Warren stated Rezoning Application #R-2019-01 as amended on March 11, 2019 requests that the County rezone approximately 21.70 acres of land from Residential One (R1) to an Industrial (I) zoning district. The acreage consists of 3 parcels (PIN: 9578-76-7853, 9578-86-0329, and 9578-86-0937) on New Hope Rd. and Airport Rd. in the Dana area. The property owners are Brian and Norman Hahn, George R Scott Agritourism Farm LLC, and Beasnest Holdings, LLC. Eric Goodman is serving as agent.

At the regularly scheduled meeting on March 21, 2019 the Planning Board voted 7-0 (member Eric Goodman recused himself from voting) to forward this rezoning request with a favorable recommendation.

Public Input

- 1. Jeff Tanklersley spoke on behalf of himself and his neighbors. He asked the Board to remember the heritage and quality of life. They are against the rezoning.
- 2. Brian Hahn, applicant, purchased the property in 2001, prior to the zoning.
- 3. Eric Goodman feels that due to absence of water and sewer, the property cannot be densely populated. He envisions a few more buildings with maybe electrical or plumbing businesses. He reminded the Board that as a Planning Board member, he had recused himself from voting on this application.

Chairman Hawkins made the motion to go out of public hearing. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Commissioner Messer made the motion that the Board approves rezoning application #R-2018-09 to rezone the Subject Area to Industrial, based on the recommendations of the Henderson County 2020 Comprehensive Plan, and with any conditions as discussed, and; he further moved that the Board approved the resolution regarding the consistency with the CCP. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

INFORMAL PUBLIC COMMENTS

- 1. Jean Peelen spoke regarding the ERA Resolution. She asked the Board to support the resolution giving everyone equal rights.
- 2. George Poppas has concerns about the Boards support of the 287g program. He does not see any proof that it protects anyone, and feels detainers violate the constitution. He asked that the Board not support the program.
- 3. Jacob Hansen is opposed to the NCDOT Highway 191 road widening project. He feels it will cause pollution and damage to health.
- 4. Jim Pace is opposed to the NCDOT Highway 191 road widening project. He is concerned the project will cause more accidents and harm to health. He asked the Board to pass a resolution requesting NCDOT redesign the project.
- 5. Mark Stickney is opposed to the NCDOT Highway 191 road widening project. He feels the work already completed is appropriate, and no additional widening is necessary. Mr. Stickney is concerned that the design planned around the schools will endanger the safety of the kids.
- 6. Robert Coffey is opposed to the NCDOT Highway 191 road widening project. He feels the work already completed is appropriate, and no additional widening is necessary. He requested the Board to ask

NCDOT to abandon the plan.

- 7. Ivan Beggs is opposed to the NCDOT Highway 191 road widening project. The project is too large and not necessary.
- 8. Phil Rasmussen is opposed to the NCDOT Highway 191 road widening project. The project is too large and not needed and should be redesigned.
- 9. Nancy Glowacki spoke regarding the ERA Resolution. She asked the Board to support the resolution providing equal rights for all and requested the resolution be placed on an upcoming agenda.
- 10. Lee Luebbe spoke regarding the ERA Resolution. She asked the Board to support the resolution giving equal rights to all and send to the legislatures.
- 11. Lucy Butler spoke regarding the ERA Resolution. She asked the Board to support the resolution giving equal rights to all.
- 12. Jane Bilello thanked the Board for supporting the renewal of the 287g program.
- 13. Richard Freudenberger is opposed to the NCDOT Highway 191 road widening project. Improvements such a widening the lanes is okay but 4 lanes are not needed.
- 14. Linda Miller spoke regarding the ERA Resolution. She asked the Board to support the resolution giving equal rights to all.
- 15. Daniel Watson signed up but did not speak.
- 16. Felicia Arriaga is against the 287g program and she feels it causes fear and separates families. She asked the Board to spend the money for other means.
- 17. Rachel Poller left and League of Women Voters member Patty Rogers spoke for her. She asked the Board to support the ERA Resolution giving equals rights for all, and send to legislatures.
- 18. Alan Romiret is opposed to the 287g program.

2019.42 Resolution to extend County Comprehensive Plan (CCP)

The County Comprehensive Plan (CCP) was adopted in July of 2004 to provide a guideline for growth in the County through the year 2020. Prior to the adoption of the CCP, the County had a 1977 Land Use Plan and a 1993 Comprehensive Land Use Plan. It is now time to update the CCP with a new plan that will guide growth for the next 15-20 years.

Planning staff and the Planning Board has identified several items that are necessary before the County can undertake a CCP update. These items include:

- 1. Completion and adoption of the Cane Creek Sewer District Master Plan (this plan is underway, and it is anticipated it will be completed within FY20/21).
- 2. Completion and adoption of the Master Water and Sewer Plan for the City of Hendersonville (both plans have been drafted).
- 3. Demographic and other related data from the 2020 Census (the Census is currently underway, and this data will not be available until 2021/2022).

On March 21st, the Planning Board discussed the CCP updates and the need for additional time to complete the above listed items. The Board voted unanimously to recommend that the Board of Commissioners by resolution, extend the 2020 CCP to the year 2023 to allow the County to prepare a realistic comprehensive plan with appropriate goals and objectives to guide growth in the coming years.

Motion:

I move that the Board of Commissioners adopts the resolution to extend the current CCP to the year 2023 to allow the County time to receive the necessary documents to complete an update.

2019.43 Cancellation of Stormwater and Sedimentation Control Ordinance enforcement agreement with Town of Columbus Termination

During budget preparation, staff has determined that it would be in the County's interest to cancel the November 18, 2013, Stormwater and Sedimentation Control Ordinance enforcement agreement with the Town of Columbus, as no longer economically in the County's interest. Under the terms of that Agreement, at least four months' notice of termination must be given, and terminations can only occur at the end of the months of June or December. It is proposed that immediate notice be given that the County will terminate the Agreement effective December 31, 2019.

Motion:

2019.44 Memorandum of Understanding – NC DHHS

Session Law 2017-41 requires all counties to enter into an annual written agreement with the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) for all social services programs excluding medical assistance (Medicaid). The law requires the written agreement to be executed no later than July 1st of each year. DHHS has provided a Memorandum of Understanding between DHHS and Henderson County effective for FY2020.

Commissioner Lapsley prepared the report to the Board and it was reviewed by the Task Force membership prior to publication. This issue is impacting taxpayers and the Board must try to take some action.

Commissioners seek advice from community leaders dealing with this problem and Review of current National & Statewide efforts to address the problem.

<u>Victims</u>

- Substance abuse victims are scattered throughout our community.
- Level has reached a point that the number of victims is having a serious impact on our hospital Emergency Departments, our Department of Social Services staff, our EMS responders, and our Detention Center.
- That impact flows directly to the County taxpayer.
- Our community has a responsibility to help these folks overcome the substance abuse problem.

Victim Contact Points

- Medical Providers
- Hospital Emergency Departments
- EMS Responders
- Sheriff Department Officer's
- Detention Center
- Court System
- These are all intervention points which should all be included as an integral part of the community effort.

Victim Assistance

- There are several non-profit & faith based groups assisting our various county departments dealing with this serious community problem.
- There is a need for a Community Resource Navigator for Substance Abuse Victims.

Commissioner Lapsley feels the primary outcome is a need for a Hotline with an educated person in a designated location, to act as a facilitator to get the person to the right pace for treatment.

Treatment Programs

- There are a very limited number of treatment alternatives available in our community.
- Our hospitals and Emergency Services staff are only available to deal with short term contact with substance use abusers.
- The use of medication assisted treatment (MAT) has been demonstrated to be the most effective method available.
- The lack of long term MAT treatment programs in our region to meet our needs is a major community problem.
- Most victims in our community are forced to go out of the county and even outside the State to get serious long term treatment programs.

Education/Prevention Programs

- North Carolina Controlled Substance Reporting System
- Hope Rx community educator
- Diversion control program

Summary and Recommendations

- Encourage Partnership for Health to continue its leadership role on this problem
- Support the efforts of Henderson County Department of Social Services to help families address this problem
- Fund a new Resource Navigator on Substance Abuse
- Encourage increased dialogue with State Probation Office on helping felons after release
- Encourage Blue Ridge CC to assist victims in gaining a place in the workforce
- Support the HC Sheriff and District Attorney in holding illegal drug dealers accountable
- Encourage local medical providers to uniformly participate in the North Carolina Controlled Substance Reporting System
- Continue support for the use of Naloxone by County EMS and first responders
- Request County staff to investigate the feasibility of expanding the availability of medically assisted treatment (MAT) programs with Blue Ridge Health and others.
- Continue to support mental health and substance abuse programs in the public school system
- Continue to support the County Sheriff and Detention Center to educate and assist abusers in a successful exit from the criminal justice system and into the workforce
- Support HopeRx in its efforts to educate the school system and public on the impact of this problem.
- Recognize the efforts of the faith based community and other non-profit groups to address this problem.

COUNTY MANAGER'S REPORT

County Manager Steve Wyatt stated the biggest part of the May 15th agenda will be a budget workshop. Midday after a lunch break, NCDOT's Brian Burch will attend the meeting and speak. Within the proposed budget, there is no earmark for \$250,000 to the 287g program.

It was the consensus of the Board to cancel the Public Hearing for Text Amendments to the LDC previously scheduled for May 15th, and reschedule it at a later date.

Commissioner Lapsley informed the Board that the Secretary of Transportation (NC First Commission) has asked him to be a part of the NC First Commission. They will meet every other month for 18 months in Raleigh to view how to fund transportation.

REMEMBRANCE OF BECKY SNYDER

County Manager Steve Wyatt stated last week was a rough week with the passing of Becky Snyder. The Board of Commissioners provided great support. Staff that day did an amazing job with herculean efforts, truly above and beyond. Emergency Services also provided efforts above and beyond the call of duty. We have suffered a great loss.

Memorial Services for Becky Snyder are schedule for Saturday, May 11th at the First United Methodist Church at 2:00 p.m.

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS ENACTMENT 2019-42

WHEREAS, in 2004 the Board of Commissioners adopted the Henderson County, North Carolina, 2020 Comprehensive Plan (the "CCP") pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §153A-341, to guide land use planning in Henderson County through the year 2020; and,

WHEREAS, the CCP by its own terms is due for re-examination and updating in 2020; and

WHEREAS, the Henderson County Planning Board has identified several items which need to be completed prior to the re-examination and updating of the CCP, namely:

A. Completion and adoption of the Cane Creek Water and Sewer District Master Plan, anticipated to be completed within during the 2021 Fiscal Year;

B. Completion and adoption of the master water and sewer plans for the City of Hendersonville; and

C. Receipt of demographic and related data from the 2020 Census, which will not occur until 2022; and,

WHEREAS, on March 21, 2019, the Henderson County Planning Board unanimously voted unanimously to recommend that the Board of Commissioners extend the CCP to the year 2023, to allow the most current available data and plans to be incorporated in the new plan;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the life of the CCP, as it currently exists and may be amended, be and hereby is extended until and through 2023, in order to allow receipt of necessary plans and information for the creation of a new comprehensive plan to guide Henderson County through 2040.
