- New Farmer's Market Coalition to work with local markets





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# Our Programs Continued to Grow Through Different Media


- HCCE held 263 meetings/programs/activities/consultations (down 86%).
- Those had 6,780 participants (down 63%)
- 88 print articles, radio, television shows (up 13%)
- 278 web posts (up 109%)
- Over 68,000 Facebook hits on our main page (up 78%)
- An additional 33,000 on our four other pages
- Over 73,360 web page views (up 249%)

# 4-H Youth Development Program

- In 2020 Henderson County 4-H had:
  - 7 clubs, 2 of which were in public schools
  - Over 240 total club members
  - Conducted embryology on-line for most second graders after COVID closures.
  - Increased contacts over 2019 due to keeping activities going on-line.



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# Extension Master Gardener Volunteer Program

- Henderson County had 23 open projects in 2020. This includes:
  - 19 main projects (projects "owned" by EMGV
     Program, e.g. Bountiful Harvest Community Garden)
  - 9 side projects (projects that EMGV's assisted with)
- Henderson County's EMGV program **ranked #1** in the state in volunteer hours with a total of:
  - 115 volunteers
  - -7,902
  - 600 educational hours
  - Ranked 8th in NC in Volunteer Hours/Capita









We currently have five Facebook pages to keep You informed. Our website traffic basically doubled in 2020.

We have also developed a regular presence in mass media including newspaper, radio and television. In 2020, we had over two million mass media contacts.



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## **Still Connecting Students to the Farm**

- Our Annual School Tour went virtual this year
- Many teachers from the 4 middle schools used it.
- Rugby, Hendersonville, E. Flat Rock and Apple Valley
- The Virtual Tour included videos and interviews
- Exposed to technology & careers related to Agriculture
- Hoping to be back live in 2021
- Reviews have been overwhelmingly positive
- Goal to get all 8<sup>th</sup> graders involved
- Partial tour funding was included in the county budget
