SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

NC Medicaid has finalized a policy requirement for Medicaid providers to implement a tobaccofree policy for any portion of the property upon which it operates to include "...buildings, grounds and vehicles". The Henderson County Department of Public Health has confirmed that this expectation applies to the Human Services building and more broadly to the campus at large. NC Medicaid is requiring this new policy to be in effect as of December 1, 2022.

The issue has been discussed with the Henderson County Board of Health and the Henderson County Board of Social Services on June 21, 2022. Both boards endorsed and supported the requirements and asked that the matter be forwarded to the Henderson County Board of Commissioners for consideration and action. That action is required because current county policy (a combination of ordinance, order and policy) is not sufficient to meet the updated tobacco-free policy requirements from NC Medicaid.

BOARD ACTION REQUESTED:

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners is requested to enact appropriate policy changes for the Henderson County Human Services campus consistent with the new tobacco-free policy requirements from NC Medicaid and to implement that policy no later than November 30, 2022.

Suggested Motion:

I move the Board approve the tobacco-free policy revisions necessary for the Henderson County Human Services campus to comply with NC Medicaid requirements.



North Carolina Standard & Tailored Plan Tobacco-Free Policy Requirement

Tobacco-related policy requirements go into effect on Dec. 1, 2022.

January 25, 2022

This replaces the bulletin published on Sept. 7, 2021, North Carolina Standard & Tailored Plan Tobacco-Free Policy Requirement (https://medicaid.ncdhhs.gov/blog/2021/09/07/north-carolina-standard-tailored-plan-tobacco-free-policy-requirement)

Tobacco-related policy requirements for Standard Plans and Tailored Plans contracted medical, behavioral health, intellectual/developmental disabilities (I/DD), and traumatic brain injury (TBI) service providers will be effective Dec. 1, 2022. These requirements will apply to both Medicaid and state-funded service providers. The Department will work with the Standard Plans and Tailored Plans to include these requirements, as appropriate, in advance of Dec. 1, 2022.

Secondhand smoke is a well-documented danger to health. No one should be exposed to secondhand smoke when they access care or on the job. Research shows that most people who use tobacco want to quit. An environment free from triggers to use tobacco products is necessary to support service recipients whose goal is to become tobacco free. People with behavioral health disorders die disproportionately from tobacco-related illness. Among people who try to become tobacco free, only a small minority receive evidence-based care to assist them.

Therefore, starting Dec. 1, 2022, NC Medicaid Managed Care Standard plans and Tailored Plans will require contracted providers, not including retail pharmacies, and with the exception of the residential provider facilities noted below, to implement a tobacco-free policy covering any portion of the property on which the participating provider operates that is under its control as owner or lessee, to include buildings, grounds, and vehicles.

A tobacco-free policy includes a prohibition on smoking combustible tobacco products and the use of non-combustible tobacco products, including electronic, heated, and smokeless tobacco products, and/or nicotine products that are not approved by the FDA as tobacco treatment medications, as well as, prohibiting participating providers from purchasing, accepting as donations, and/or distributing tobacco products to the individuals they serve.

Intermediate care facilities for individuals with intellectual disabilities (ICF-IID) and I/DD residential services subject to the Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Final Rule are exempt from this requirement. However, starting Dec. 1, 2022, the following policies shall be required in these settings:

- 1. Indoor use of tobacco products shall be prohibited in all provider owned/operated contracted settings.
- 2. For outdoor areas of campus, providers shall:
 - Ensure access to common outdoor space(s) that are free from exposure to tobacco use; and
 - Prohibit staff/employees from using tobacco products anywhere on campus.

As part of policy implementation, Standard Plan and Tailored Plan contracted service providers should integrate tobacco use treatment and support into all settings. Evidence-based tobacco use treatment is defined as a combination of FDA approved medications and counseling.

To support this policy change, the North Carolina Division of Public Health Tobacco Prevention and Control Branch partners with the Division of Mental Health/Developmental Disabilities/ Substance Abuse Services and the Division of Health Benefits to coordinate Breathe Easy NC: Becoming Tobacco Free (https://breatheeasync.org/).

Breathe Easy NC: Becoming Tobacco Free is a statewide initiative to support people with behavioral health conditions and I/DD/TBI in becoming tobacco free, by working with service providers to integrate tobacco use treatment and make campuses tobacco free.

- Standard Plan and Tailored plan contracted service providers should make use of this resource to ensure they have a transparent, well-organized, and evidence-based tobacco-free policy and tobacco use treatment implementation process.
- Making an organization's campus tobacco-free is a process that should involve all organization stakeholders: service recipients or clients, leadership, and staff. Implementing a tobacco-free policy can take 3-6 months, occasionally longer.
- Providers should integrate tobacco use treatment or referrals to tobacco use treatment resources, such as QuitlineNC, prior to policy implementation.

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

Policy Timeline



September 7, 1993

County Smoking Ordinance

Applies to **Buildings** Only Smoking allowed only in designated areas.

County Manager can designate or remove smoking areas inside buildings

September 20, 1993

Health Department designated as nonsmoking facility by County Manager David Thompson – in response to request for same from Health Director Tom Johnson.

July 1, 1996

1993 Smoking Ordinance instructs that all designated smoking areas must be outside or serviced by separate HVAC system if indoors as of 7/1/96.

<u>September 20, 2006</u>

Commissioners voted to make "nonsmoking" the entire Human Services Building, and the area within 50 linear feet of the exterior of the building, in response to request for same from DSS Board and вон.

October 15, 2006

Smoking ORDER

Ordinance of 1993)

Prohibits tobacco smoking within any county

Current Ordinance (accessed online June 2022)

Still only addresses Smoking

Added language to include no smoking on "Grounds" unless in designated areas

County Manager still has authority to create or remove smoking areas

Changed smoking definition to include ecigarettes

Updated statutory authority sources





Current Status

Current policy, limitations and implications

Henderson County Smoking Ordinance


Accessed from County Website June 2022

- Policy applies to traditional tobacco products that generate smoke (lighted tobacco product).
- E-cigs were added in definitions.
- Smoking is still allowed in designated areas*.
- County Manager can designate or remove smoking areas*.

Implications and Limitations

A county ordinance that allows designated smoking areas does not qualify as a smokefree policy. State-level maps and charts show Henderson County as not having a qualifying policy.

What has changed?

New accreditation standard, new Medicaid guidance for healthcare operations

New Requirements

NC Medicaid

Tobacco-Free Policy Requirement

Starting December 1, 2022, Standard and Tailored Prepaid Health Plans will require contracted medical organizations (and others) to provide a

100% Tobacco-Free campus.

NC Local Health Department Accreditation

Standard 30.9 has been updated to require a **100% Tobacco-Free Facilities** policy

Standard 30.10 has been updated to require that the Tobacco-Free policy required in 30.10 also prohibit use of all tobacco (NOT JUST SMOKING) within 50 ft of all health department facilities.

What does 100% Tobacco-Free Mean?

- A tobacco-free policy applies to all of the property under the program's control (that you rent or own)
- All of that property (buildings, grounds, and vehicles) is tobacco-free
- Tobacco includes the use of combustible, electronic, heated, and smokeless tobacco products
- No designated areas for tobacco use indoors or outdoors
- Programs do not purchase, accept as donations, or distribute any tobacco products

Not just policy: Treatment

NC Medicaid Standard & Tailored plans are *also* required to:

- Increase the use of tobacco use treatment medications & counseling in all settings
- Train care managers on brief interventions & standard of care tobacco use treatment
- Provide Quitline services
- Promote tobacco use treatment benefit utilization to beneficiaries

What would we like to see for Human Services campus?

Changes for Henderson County Smoking Ordinance & Policy for Department of Public Health/ Human Services Campus

Proposal for Human Services Campus

Smoking Ordinance

- Incorporate or endorse within ordinance
- Reconcile 3 variations of guidance: ordinance, order & policy
- Allow for department level policy that reflects same
- Utilize comprehensive definition for tobacco products, if not allow in public health policy
- Tobacco-free building and grounds, eliminate designated tobacco use area

Department of Public Health Policy

- Policy consistent with ordinance revisions
- Policy to include any necessary elements that the Commissioners choose not to incorporate within ordinance
- Effective as soon as possible
- Evaluate need for mirror or joint policy
- Must be in place prior to December 1, 2022, earlier would be preferable for accreditation

Long Term Tobacco Policy Objectives

- Henderson County Board of Health rule for tobacco-free policy for all government buildings and grounds in the county
- Advantage of rule applying to municipalities/uniform approach
- Would utilize comprehensive definition of tobacco products
- Specifically envisioned and defined as necessary due to emergence of e-cigarettes and other vaping type products which have been targeted to youth
- Requires Commissioners' endorsement
