Ribbons and badges in the shadow boxes were earned through each veteran's hard work, skill, meritorious service, deployment, accomplishments, and valor.



The shadow boxes are 8" x 10" and will be placed on public display in the VFW building at Five Points. The name of each participating veteran will be on each shadow box.








Rather than full size medals like at VMI, Henderson County's Wall of Honor will feature ribbons and badges.

## Criteria to participate:

- Honorably discharged veterans
- Active, Reserve, or National Guard service
- Service in war time or peace
- Next of kin can sponsor a deceased veteran
- Must have a connection to Henderson County
- Artifacts must be donated to the Wall of Honor program
- No cost to the veteran but donations to the program are welcome








What is important to a veteran?
