### **MINUTES**

### STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA COUNTY OF HENDERSON

### BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS MONDAY, NOVEMBER 6, 2023

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled meeting at 5:30 p.m. in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the Historic Courthouse on Main Street, Hendersonville.

### CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

Chairman McCall called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

### **INVOCATION**

Biltmore Baptist Hendersonville Campus Connections Coordinator Marilyn Bennett provided the invocation.

### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Randi-Mae and Sadie Eatmon with Barnyard Bandits 4-H Club led the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

### EDNEYVILLE FIRE UPDATE (ADD ON)

Emergency Management Director Jimmy Brissie provided an update on the brush fire in the Edneyville community. He shared videos and pictures from the front lines of the fire, where every Henderson County Fire Department is engaged and has been working to contain the fire since Friday afternoon. The NC Forest Service has been on the ground since the fire started and continues to bring in resources from across the State. He said 65 agencies and approximately 200 people are involved in the management of the fire. Today, Mr. Brissie said that he had seen trucks arrive from several additional counties, including Catawba, Robeson, and Currituck. He said there has been tremendous support from federal and state leaders. The local community has stepped forward with many donations and support. Fruitland Baptist Church and the Fruitland Bible College have offered tremendous support by providing facilities for firefighters to use to take a break and have a meal. They have partnered with the NC Baptist Men to set up a feeding operation.

Brissie said there have been a few voluntary evacuations in the East Poplar community. Currently, there have been no injuries reported. Two vacation homes have sustained substantial damage. The NC Forest Service will have a strong presence for at least three weeks after the fire has been 100 % contained due to conditions and to complete "mop-up operations" to ensure there are no hot

spots that could reignite the fire. The total fire currently spans 431 acres, and it is 5% contained. In addition to the burn ban that has been issued, a State of Emergency has been declared to ensure that the county has all the resources needed to be successful in this operation.

Chairman McCall said that Governor Roy Cooper called her today to express his concern She shared, for the public's benefit, that a state of emergency is declared for counties to seek reimbursement for costs incurred during an emergency situation.

### RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OPERATION GREEN LIGHT FOR VETERANS

WHEREAS,	the residents of Henderson County have great respect, admiration, and the utmost
	gratitude for all the men and women who have selflessly served our country and this community in the Armed Forces and

- WHEREAS, the contributions and sacrifices of the men and women who served in the Armed Forces have been vital in maintaining the freedoms and way of life enjoyed by our citizens; and
- WHEREAS, Henderson County seeks to honor these individuals who have paid the high price for freedom by placing themselves in harm's way for the good of all; and
- WHEREAS, Approximately 200,000 service members transition to civilian communities annually; and
- **WHEREAS,** an estimated 20 percent increase of service members will transition to civilian life Approved: November 15, 2023

in the near future; and

**WHEREAS,** studies indicate that 44-72 percent of service members experience high levels of stress during the transition from military to civilian life; and

WHEREAS, Henderson County appreciates the sacrifices of our United States Military Personnel and believes specific recognition should be granted;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Henderson County Board of Commissioners and the citizens of Henderson County recognize the immeasurable value and valiant contributions made by our veterans during wartime and peace time. The Henderson County Historic Courthouse will be illuminated in green light from November 6<sup>th</sup> through November 12<sup>th</sup> in support of all our veterans. We encourage the businesses and residents of Henderson County to join us by displaying their own green lights.

**2023.141** Proclamation – Proclaiming November 18, 2023, Robert Morgan Day
The Board was requested to adopt a Proclamation proclaiming November 18, 2023, as Robert Morgan Day.

Chairman McCall read the Proclamation aloud.

### PROCLAMATION PROCLAIMING NOVEMBER 18 AS ROBERT MORGAN DAY

- **WHEREAS**, Robert Morgan was born in Hendersonville, North Carolina on October 3, 1944, he grew up on a family farm in the Green River valley; and
- WHEREAS, Robert Morgan was interested in writing poetry, fiction, and music at a young age, however, he was encouraged to study science in college instead, but after starting his higher education at North Carolina State University in engineering and applied mathematics, he transferred to UNC-Chapel Hill and graduated with a B.A. in English in 1965; he received a Master of Fine Arts degree from UNC-Greensboro; and
- WHEREAS, In the late 1960s, Robert Morgan began writing poetry with the support and encouragement of his teachers, friends, and peers, many of his poems were published and a first book, Zirconia Poems, was born in 1969; and
- WHEREAS, After beginning his career at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York in 1971, Professor Morgan received NEA grants in 1974, 1981, and 1987; in 1988, he was awarded a Guggenheim fellowship, and a Rockefeller Foundation fellowship, followed by the James

- G. Hanes Poetry Prize by the Fellowship of Southern Writers, and the North Carolina Literature Award; and
- WHEREAS, In 1991, Robert Morgan's novel, "Gap Creek" was published and it was selected for the Southern Book Critics Circle Award for Fiction for 2000, and was chosen as Notable Book by the New York Times. Gap Creek was a selection of the Oprah Book Club and a New York Times bestseller. It was chosen by the Appalachian Writers Association as Book of the Year for 2000; and
- WHEREAS, Robert Morgan became the Kappa Alpha Professor of English at Cornell University in 1992, a position he held until retirement his retirement in 2022 as Kappa Alpha Professor of English Emeritus; and
- WHEREAS, Robert Morgan is the author of 15 books of poetry, nine volumes of fiction, including the sequel to "Gap Creek", "The Road from Gap Creek", and three nonfiction books; he also served as visiting writer at Davidson College, Furman, Duke, Appalachian State, and East Carolina universities; and Robert Morgan was inducted into the North Carolina Literary Hall of Fame in 2010; and

**NOW, THEREFORE,** the Henderson County Board of Commissioners expresses their deep admiration for the gifts and talents that Robert Morgan has brought to Henderson County, and the world at large, as a man of great academic achievement and a highly-prolific author of admired literature. On behalf of the citizens and staff of Henderson County, we proclaim November 18 as Robert Morgan Day. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the County of Henderson to be affixed.

### PROCLAMATION DESIGNATING NOVEMBER AS ADOPTION MONTH

WHEREAS, more than 113,000 children in the United States foster care system and approximately 12,000 children in North Carolina are waiting to be adopted into permanent families;

WHEREAS, birth parents, relatives, foster families, and adoptive families all work to create Stronger Families Together;

WHEREAS, seventeen children with identified families in Henderson County are waiting for their forever family; and, six without identified families are awaiting adoption.

**WHEREAS**, twenty-eight Henderson County children were adopted into forever families in FY 22-23.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Henderson County Board of Commissioners, at their meeting on November 6, 2023, does hereby designate the month of November as Adoption Month in Henderson County, and calls upon all citizens, community agencies, faith groups, medical facilities, elected leaders and businesses to observe this month by honoring the professionals who work to make children's dreams of a permanent home a reality, answering the call of finding safe and permanent families for needy children and supporting the families who have opened their hearts and homes to a child in need.

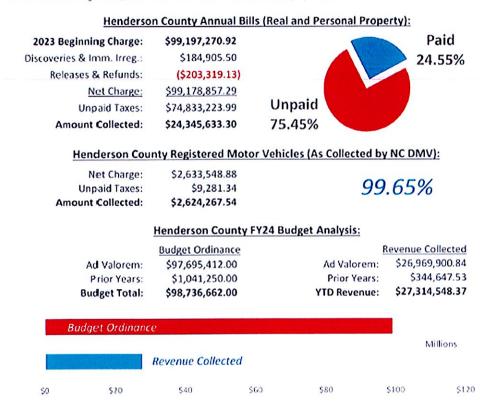

### Supplemental Agreement with the NCDOT for STBG Funds to be used for the Ecusta Trail West Preliminary Engineering

In 2022, the County successfully secured over \$10.4 million in STBG-DA (Surface Transportation Block Grant – Direct Attributable) for the construction of Ecusta Trail West (US 64 in Horseshoe to the county line). In 2023, the RAISE grant was awarded for the construction and PE of the Ecusta Trail. To prevent delays in engineering designs and construction, a portion of the STBG-DA funds is being reallocated to begin PE of the Ecusta West design and permitting. This will allow the previously approved RAISE funds and NSFLTP funds to be used for construction.

A supplemental agreement with NCDOT is required for Henderson County to access these funds for the Ecusta West PE. The STBG has a required 20% local match that will come from other funding sources, including fundraising, TDA, and other grant sources. The total STBG-DA funds to be allocated are \$1,440,000.

The County received an application from Special Needs Sports to use the Historic Courthouse lawn on Saturday, November 18, 2023, from 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. for a Special Needs Craft Fair.

To allow for this use on County grounds, the Board was requested to grant a one-time exemption to rule #4 of the County Facility Use Policy, which prohibits solicitation on the grounds. This exemption would cover the date and time specified on the application and outlined above.

### Motion:

I move that the Board grant an exemption to the County Facility Use Policy for Special Needs Sports, allowing for the sale of arts and crafts on the Historic Courthouse lawn, or within the Courthouse if necessary, on Saturday, November 18, 2023, from 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.

Vice-Chair Edney made the motion to adopt the consent agenda as amended. All voted in favor, and the motion carried.

### DISCUSSION

### **County Comprehensive Plan Update**

After receipt of the draft 2045 Comprehensive Plan from the Planning Board on December 5<sup>th</sup>, 2022, the Board of Commissioners has been conducting a thorough review of the draft plan. As part of that process, the Board of Commissioners wish to review the Future Land Use Map.

The Board directed staff to break down the current draft map into smaller geographic areas for review. The Board of Commissioners will discuss each region of the county specifically as part of their review.

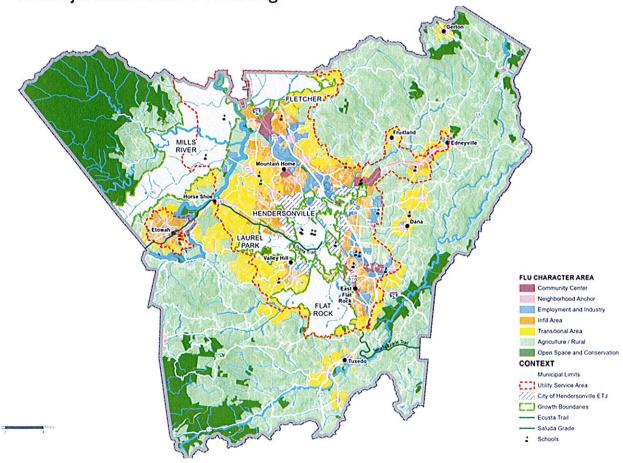
### Future Land Use Map

- Current draft version is based on a multitude of factors including:
  - Current FLUM
  - Existing land use
  - Community Plans
  - Environmental constraints and opportunities (wetlands, steep slopes, rich soils, etc.)
  - Municipal and ETJ boundaries
  - Water/sewer availability (current and future)
  - Broadband availability (current and future)
  - · County priorities
  - · Public survey results
  - Stakeholder input
  - Planning Board/Steering Committee revisions
  - Commissioner revisions

• The map is VISIONARY! It should reflect the culmination of the data received during the planning process and project land uses for 2045.

- The map is not just a visualization of the comprehensive plan. It is a tool that is used to administer processes for the public and should be accessible and easily understood.
- The map will assist in a rezoning process, but it is not synonymous with zoning districts which require further public input and is done at the parcel scale.

• The map can be amended with sufficient reasoning and can be done in conjunction with a rezoning.

- More industrial
- More commercial along US64 corridor ("a rural highway commercial overlay")
- · Buffer residential with existing agricultural land

May 25, 2022: Joint Planning Board Meeting with the Board of Commissioners to discuss the FLUM. Notes on Edneyville included:

· Higher density along public sewer

July 19, 2023: After review of plan goals was completed, further discussion on the FLUM began at commissioner meetings.

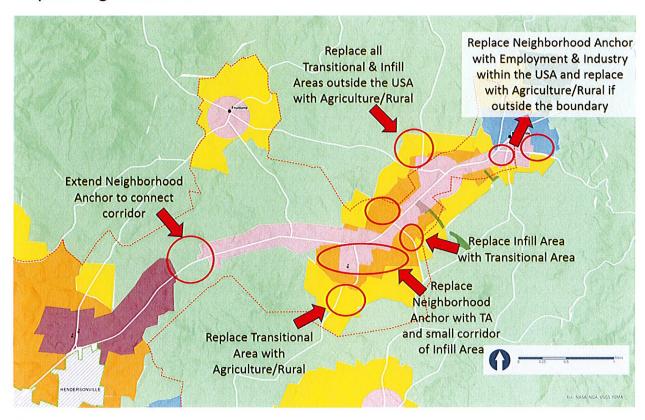
August 2023: Individual meetings with commissioners to discuss specific FLUM changes that were incorporated into the current draft version.

**September 14, 2023:** Individual maps were distributed to the commissioners by request to facilitate map editing.

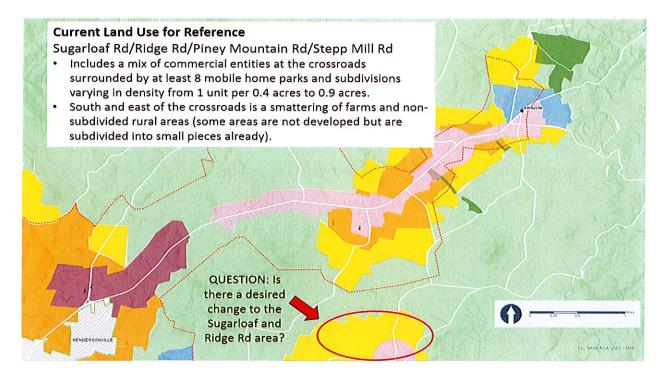
### Future Land Use Map Exercise

• At the direction of the Board, on September 14<sup>th</sup>, staff provided each commissioner with 9 blank inset maps to color. Each map represented a different part of the County.

- As of November 2nd, staff received the Edneyville area map from the commissioners.
- To assist in visualizing the similarities and differences between the current draft and what the majority of commissioners chose to edit, staff put comments on the existing draft inset map for review.
- A majority was noted on all issues except for one that staff will ask for specific guidance on.



Commissioner Lapsley asked that the Board be provided with a copy of the map above and directed Staff to use the same format in future maps used for Board discussion.



The Board said they believed the area questioned in the above map was part of the Dana/Fruitland area and did not address this area of the map in the submissions that were made for the Etowah/Horse Shoe Community. The Board would like to address the questioned area in the future.

### **Next Steps**

- The changes the Board previously approved are incorporated into the current draft Future Land Use Map in a GIS layer.
- Request Board consensus on changes presented today for incorporation into the current draft map.
- If the Board is ready, staff will incorporate all changes and provide Board with an updated, physical map for approval and then can move forward with updating and adopting the draft comprehensive plan.

It was the consensus of the Board to focus on the south end – Dana region of the County at the next meeting.

### Career Development Plan Update

At the Board's October 2, 2023 meeting, Chaman McCall and Henderson County Education Foundation Executive Director Peggy Marshall gave a presentation on a proposed student mentorship program. Chairman McCall has been working on this issue and has done some additional research with a neighboring community that has a similar program in place. She

presented this additional information to the Board. Following the presentation, the Board was requested to discuss any items presented and direct Staff accordingly.

Knowing that "one caring adult" makes a huge difference in the lives of young people, initiating the Success Coaching model can lead to the most significant positive student outcomes and community benefits.

Chairman McCall said the subcommittee plans to challenge all the municipalities within the County to participate in the program.

Commissioner Hill would like to see a quarterly report once the program has been started. Chairman McCall said to get the program moving, a coordinator needs to be hired so they may start planning for the beginning of the next school year, which is when this program would begin at Flat Rock Middle and East Henderson High School.

Vice-Chair Edney clarified that the program coordinator would not be a school employee but an employee of the Henderson County Education Foundation.

Chairman McCall said the program will strive to be self-sufficient through grants and donations. However, to apply for available grants, there must be an existing program.

Commissioner Lapsley asked if the \$50,000 would be an amendment to the school board's budget. Chairman McCall said no, the funds would have nothing to do with the school board's budget; the money would be granted to the foundation. She said the school would provide the location to take the mentors to the students.

School Board Vice-Chair Jay Egolf said the School Board thinks this a fantastic idea and fully supports the program. School Superintendent Mark Garrett said the impacts of the program will be shown quickly with increased attendance, reduced suspensions, and matriculating students to tenth grade on time. He said traditional data has shown that students who go to tenth grade on time are more likely to graduate.

Chairman McCall made the motion that the Board grant \$50,000 to the Henderson County Education Foundation to start the Success Coaching program and that the Foundation move forward with acquiring additional funds and provide the Board of Commissioners with quarterly reports on the success of the program. All voted in favor, and the motion carried.

### **COMISSIONER UPDATES**

Vice-Chair Edney and Commissioner Lapsley had no updates to share.

Commissioner Hill shared that on November 9-12, the traveling Vietnam Memorial will be located at the Veteran's Healing Farm. He said there will parking locations throughout the County that will offer shuttles to the Veteran's Healing Farm twenty-four hours a day. He encouraged citizens to visit the memorial. He noted that the dome of the historic courthouse will be lit in green in support of Operation Green Light for Veterans. In closing, Hill said that there would be a Veteran's Day program at Forest Lawn on November 11. Veterans Services is requesting cars to transport our local veterans from the American Legion to the program at Forest Lawn.

Commissioner Andreotta noted that this Saturday is Veteran's Day, and Henderson County is blessed with a phenomenal veteran population. He shared that his father was a World War II marine and remembers that influence in his home as a child. He encouraged citizens to seek out a veteran and let them know how much they are appreciated.

Chairman McCall said both her father and son are Veterans and she is proud of their service to our country.

Chairman McCall said she had the opportunity to attend an event in Washington, DC, with a group from the Hendersonville Chamber of Commerce. Buncombe and Madison County Chambers of Approved: November 15, 2023

Commerce members were also in attendance. She said it was a quick two-day visit that afforded the opportunity to speak with Congressman Edwards for a good 45 minutes before he went to vote. Senator Ted Budd and Senator Thom Tillis both spent time with the group, and additional time was spent with their staff. The group shared needs and concerns in their respective counties. Workforce Development was the main focus of those discussions. The group met with the Park Service and talked about the problem with the dam at the Carl Sandburg site. The dam is out of commission, and there is no water in the pond. An engineering study was paid for by the park service and will be completed in February. However, it is not in the immediate plans to rebuild the dam anytime soon; the date they were given was 2026. In closing, she thanked the Chamber for inviting her to participate in the initiative.

### **COUNTY MANAGER'S REPORT**

John Mitchell said there was an incredible turnout for Treat Street, and an estimated 8,000 pieces of candy were given out to local trick-or-treaters.

Mr. Michell thanked Chris Todd and staff, along with Marcus Jones and Jimmie Brissie for putting together the groundbreaking for the Ecusta Trail that was held at the Veteran's Healing Farm on Saturday, October 28. He shared there was a ribbon cutting held last week at the Green River/Tuxedo Park for their new sports court. He believes the county has doubled the number of pickleball courts over the past year.

John Mitchell said he, Commissioner Hill, and Chairman McCall will meet with the Board of AgHC tomorrow to bring back recommendations for the future of farmland preservation programs. There will be an update at the next meeting about the progress of the VFW project as well as the permit for the Edneyville Sewer.

In closing, Mr. Mitchell said he was deeply impressed by the professionalism, the calmness under pressure, and the men and women of our fire departments, emergency management, and the sheriff's office that have stepped up to provide support during the brush fire that is currently burning in Edneyville.

Vice-Chair Edney made the motion that the Board go into closed session pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §143–318.11(a)(5), for the reasons set out in the Board's agenda packet. All voted in favor, and the motion carried.

Chairman McCall made the motion to go out of closed session and adjourn at 7:57 p.m. All voted in favor, and the motion carried.

### PROCLAMATION PROCLAIMING NOVEMBER 18 AS ROBERT MORGAN DAY

- WHEREAS, Robert Morgan was born in Hendersonville, North Carolina on October 3, 1944, he grew up on a family farm in the Green River valley; and
- WHEREAS, Robert Morgan was interested in writing poetry, fiction, and music at a young age, however, he was encouraged to study science in college instead, but after starting his higher education at North Carolina State University in engineering and applied mathematics, he transferred to UNC-Chapel Hill and graduated with a B.A. in English in 1965; he received a Master of Fine Arts degree from UNC-Greensboro; and
- WHEREAS, In the late 1960s, Robert Morgan began writing poetry with the support and encouragement of his teachers, friends, and peers, many of his poems were published and a first book, Zirconia Poems, was born in 1969; and
- WHEREAS, After beginning his career at Cornell University in Ithaca, New York in 1971, Professor Morgan received NEA grants in 1974, 1981, and 1987; in 1988, he was awarded a Guggenheim fellowship, and a Rockefeller Foundation fellowship, followed by the James G. Hanes Poetry Prize by the Fellowship of Southern Writers, and the North Carolina Literature Award; and
- WHEREAS, In 1991, Robert Morgan's novel, "Gap Creek" was published and it was selected for the Southern Book Critics Circle Award for Fiction for 2000, and was chosen as Notable Book by the New York Times. Gap Creek was a selection of the Oprah Book Club and a New York Times bestseller. It was chosen by the Appalachian Writers Association as Book of the Year for 2000; and
- WHEREAS, Robert Morgan became the Kappa Alpha Professor of English at Cornell University in 1992, a position he held until retirement his retirement in 2022 as Kappa Alpha Professor of English Emeritus; and
- WHEREAS, Robert Morgan is the author of 15 books of poetry, nine volumes of fiction, including the sequel to "Gap Creek", "The Road from Gap Creek", and three nonfiction books; he also served as visiting writer at Davidson College, Furman, Duke, Appalachian State, and East Carolina universities; and Robert Morgan was inducted into the North Carolina Literary Hall of Fame in 2010; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the Henderson County Board of Commissioners expresses their deep admiration for the gifts and talents that Robert Morgan has brought to Henderson County, and the world at large, as a man of great academic achievement and a highly prolific author of admired literature. ### MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Agreement is made this the sixth day of November, 2023, by and between the Town of Mills River, a body corporate and politic of the State of North Carolina (the "Town"), and the County of Henderson, a body corporate and politic of the State of North Carolina (the "County").

### **Background of Agreement**

- A. The County owns and operates an emergency communications tower located in the Town of Mills River on Forge Mountain.
- B. The County desires to upgrade the tower and site to allow the provision of commercial wireless carriers to enhance the cellular service in the South and North Mills River valleys. These upgrades will also enhance the coverage of the County's Emergency Responder Radio System.
- C. The Town recognizes the need and importance of providing an enhanced level of commercial cellular service to this geographic area as well as expanded coverage of the Emergency Responder Radio System all for the benefit of residents of the Town.
- D. The County and the Town have funds available to assist with the necessary construction upgrades made available by the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA). The expansion of the tower site is an allowable expense under §153A-149(c)(11)(17).
  - E. Both parties wish to memorialize their agreement, as stated herein.

### Agreement

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual undertakings stated herein, the Town and the County agree as follows:

- 1. Obligations of the County:
- A. The County will make the required site upgrades as determined by their contracted engineers and consultant working with commercial wireless carriers during the scope of this project.



- B. The County will allocate one hundred and fifty thousand dollars (\$150,000) of ARPA funding towards the completion of this project.
- C. The County will ensure all procurement and contracting requirements required for ARPA projects are followed and documentation of verification is maintained.
  - D. The County will communicate regular project updates to the Town.
- E. The County will work with the contracted Engineers and Consultants to coordinate any required permitting, licensing and inspections for the completion of the project by local, state or federal authorities with the County incurring the costs.

# 2. Obligations of the Town:

- A. The Town will assist with facilitation of any required permitting, licensing and inspections for the completion of the project by local, state or federal authorities up to the limit of the Town's regulatory authority.
- B. The Town has previously contributed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) towards the overall costs of the project to be held and dispersed by the County
- C. The Town will reimburse the County, from the amount which has been contributed by the Town, for expenses incurred within sixty days of submission of such expenses to the Town. The County will supply the Town with documentation of the project costs being considered for reimbursement up to the limit of the Town's contribution to the project. The initial \$100,000 of the project will be paid jointly by Henderson County (\$50,000) and the Town of Mills River (\$50,000). At the conclusion of the project, any unspent and unencumbered remainder of this initial \$100,000 will be divided equally between the Town and the County.
