BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TUESDAY, JANUARY 2, 2024

The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled meeting at 5:30 p.m. in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the Historic Courthouse on Main Street, Hendersonville.

Sheriff Lowell Griffin provided the invocation.

CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

Chairman McCall called the meeting to order and welcomed all in attendance.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairman McCall led the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag.

INFORMAL PUBLIC COMMENT

- 1. Martha Rollefson spoke in regard to the 2045 Comprehensive Plan; she believes the Board needs to adopt the plan.
- 2. Lois Vermillian stated from her seat in the audience that she did not wish to speak.
- 3. Ray Crombe said he believes the current proposed 2045 Comp Plan would change the character of Etowah. He urged the Board to keep the rural character that exists in Etowah.
- 4. David O'Connor spoke in regard to the 2045 Comp Plan; he said it has been challenging to follow the many changes that have been made to the proposed plan during the planning process. He asked the Board to consider a period for the public to review the proposed plan and offer their comments.
- 5. Katie Breckheimer stated the most recent version of the proposed 2045 Comp Plan was posted late this afternoon, and the public had not had ample time to review the changes.

6. Lynne Williams spoke in support of farmland preservation. She explained the importance of developing a MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) with the city in the implementation of the Comprehensive Plan for areas annexed by the city

- 7. Lowell Griffin informed the Board of the difficulty in obtaining or renewing a driver's license in Henderson County. He stated that county residents must travel to other regions in the state to obtain or renew a driver's license efficiently. He believes the Henderson County DOT office is understaffed and asked the Board to support a letter to the DOT asking for improved representation in Henderson County.
- 8. Cheryl Bennett spoke in support of protecting an Heirloom Orchard located on the Blue Ridge Community College campus.

DISCUSSION/ADJUSTMENT OF AGENDA

Chairman McCall made the motion to accept the agenda as presented. All voted in favor, and the motion carried.

Commissioner Andreotta made a change to consent agenda item G – Appointment of Commissioner Representatives, adding the Broadband Task Force to the list. Commissioner Andreotta and Commissioner Hill act as the commissioner's representatives for this group.

Commissioner Lapsley removed Vaya Health Commissioner's Advisory Committee from the Appointment of Commissioners list.

Commissioner Hill stated that he and his daughter have both been involved professionally with the project described in consent agenda item S – Set Public Hearing to close a portion of the 20-foot Right of Way. When the public hearing for this item is held on February 5, 2024, he will ask to be recused from the discussion and vote.

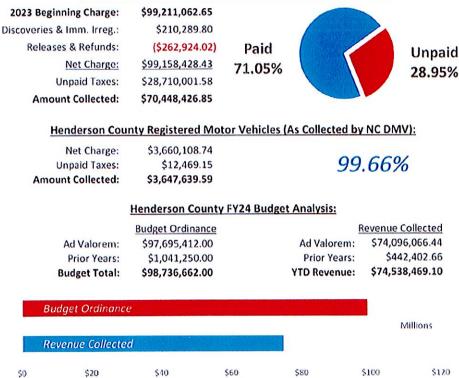

Behavioral Health System Coordinator Position - Public Health

The Henderson County Board of Health requested the Commissioners approve the addition of a Behavioral Health System Coordinator position previously established within the Department of Public Health. That position was recently reclassified and transitioned into County Administration to lead strategic efforts identified by Commissioners for the priorities linked to opioid litigation settlement funds.

The capacity to lead broader community initiatives related to mental health and substance use strategies is reflected in the current Community Health Improvement Plan and represents a critical need. Those efforts are supplemental to the goals linked with the use of opioid litigation settlement funds, but that foundation can't be sustained without the requisite expertise and staffing capacity. One of the priority collaborations underway today, for example, concerns proactive efforts to advance suicide prevention, particularly among youth.

The position was previously funded by local dollars prior to the transition, and with the ability to fund the Behavioral Health Systems Director entirely with opioid litigation settlement funds, this request posed no changes to the current FY 24 budget for the Department of Public Health.

The Henderson County Board of Health reviewed the letter of support from the Henderson County Partnership for Health at their August 8, 2023, meeting. Board members agreed on the importance of sustaining the position and approved a motion to advocate for its continuation.

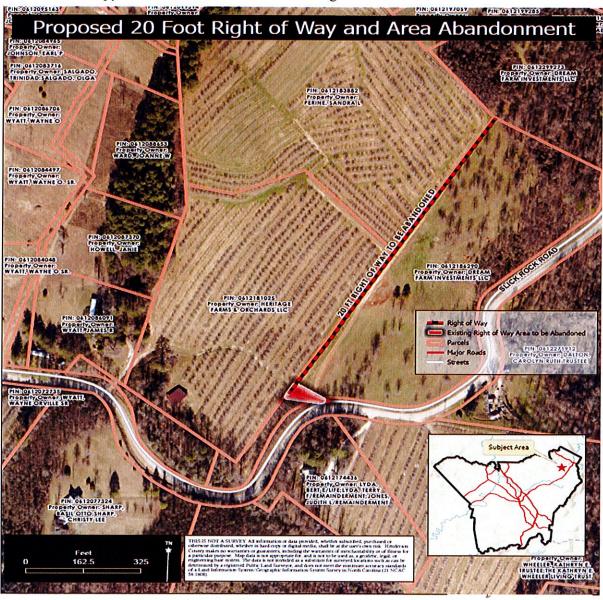
2024.009 Set Public Hearing to close a portion of 20-foot right-of-way and right-of-way area from road centerline of Slick Rock Road to the Eastern line of the Heritage Farms & Orchards, LLC

Planning and Property Addressing staff received a petition to close a 20-foot right-of-way and right-of-way area from the road centerline of Slick Rock Road to the Eastern line of the Heritage Farms & Orchards, LLC. Under North Carolina General Statute (NCGS) 153A-241, counties have the power to close any public road or easement not within a city, except public roads or easements for public roads under the control of the Department of Transportation. To close any road, the Board must:

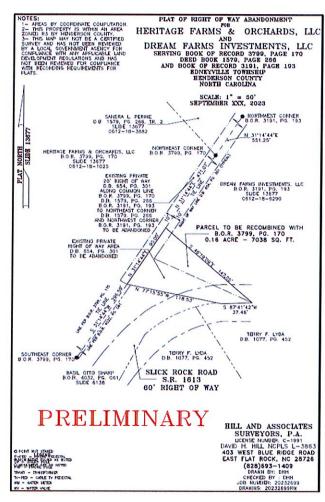
- Vote to adopt a resolution declaring its intent to close the public road or easement.
- Call and notice a public hearing on closing the road or easement, with notice "reasonably calculated to give full and fair disclosure of the proposed closing to be published once a week for three successive weeks before the hearing, a copy of the resolution to be sent by registered or certified mail to each owner as shown on the county tax records of property adjoining the public road or easement who did not join in the request to have the road or easement closed, and a notice of the closing and public hearing to be prominently posted

in at least two places along the road or easement."

- Hold the public hearing, where the Board must "hear all interested persons who appear with respect to whether the closing would be detrimental to the public interest or to any individual property rights."
- Then, if the Board "is satisfied that closing the public road or easement is not contrary to the public interest and (in the case of a road) that no individual owning property in the vicinity of the road or in the subdivision in which it is located would thereby be deprived of reasonable means of ingress and egress to his property, the Board may adopt an order closing the road or easement."
- File a copy of the Board's order with the Register of Deeds.

§ 153A-241. Closing public roads or easements.

A county may permanently close any public road or any easement within the county and not within a city, except public roads or easements for public roads under the control and supervision of the Department of Transportation. The board of commissioners shall first adopt a resolution declaring its intent to close the public road or easement and calling a public hearing on the question. The board shall cause a notice of the public hearing reasonably calculated to give full and fair disclosure of the proposed closing to be published once a week for three successive weeks before the hearing, a copy of the resolution to be sent by registered or certified mail to each owner as shown on the county tax records of property adjoining the public road or easement who did not join in the request to have the road or easement closed, and a notice of the closing and public hearing to be prominently posted in at least two places along the road or easement. At the hearing the board shall hear all interested persons who appear with respect to whether the closing would be detrimental to the public interest or to any individual property rights. If, after the hearing, the board of commissioners is satisfied that closing the public road or easement is not contrary to the public interest and (in the case of a road) that no individual owning property in the vicinity of the road or in the subdivision in which it is located would thereby be deprived of reasonable means of ingress and egress to his property, the board may adopt an order closing the road or easement. A certified copy of the order (or judgment of the court) shall be filed in the office of the register of deeds of the county.

Any person aggrieved by the closing of a public road or an easement may appeal the board of commissioners' order to the appropriate division of the General Court of Justice within 30 days after the day the order is adopted. The court shall hear the matter de novo and has jurisdiction to try the issues arising and to order the road or easement closed upon proper findings of fact by the trier of fact.

No cause of action founded upon the invalidity of a proceeding taken in closing a public road or an easement may be asserted except in an action or proceeding begun within 30 days after the day the order is adopted.

Upon the closing of a public road or an easement pursuant to this section, all right, title, and interest in the right-of-way is vested in those persons owning lots or parcels of land adjacent to the road or easement, and the title of each adjoining landowner, for the width of his abutting land, extends to the center line of the public road or easement. However, the right, title or interest vested in an adjoining landowner by this paragraph remains subject to any public utility use or facility located on, over, or under the road or easement immediately before its closing, until the landowner or any successor thereto pays to the utility involved the reasonable cost of removing and relocating the facility. (1949, c. 1208, ss. 1-3; 1957, c. 65, s. 11; 1965, cc. 665, 801; 1971, c. 595; 1973, c. 507, s. 5; c. 822, s. 1; 1977, c. 464, s. 34; 1995, c. 374, s. 1.)

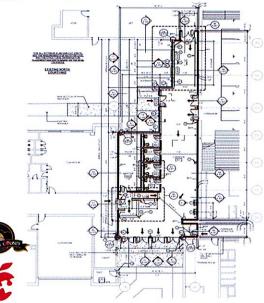

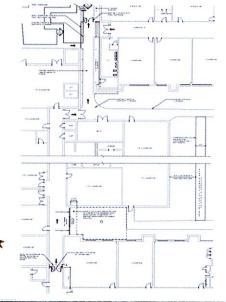

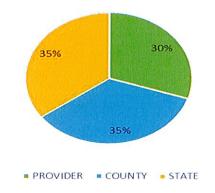

- Provide update to Board of Commissioners at the February 21st meeting

Commissioner Hill made the motion that the Board approve the budget amendment to appropriate ARPA Fund Balance. All voted in favor, and the motion carried.

Henderson County 2045 Comprehensive Plan

Starting in July of 2021, the County embarked on developing its new comprehensive plan. Over the course of 24 months, thousands of community members actively participated in the planning process to shape the plan's vision for 2045. The Board of Commissioners held a public hearing on December 5, 2022. After that meeting, considerable time was spent reviewing the plan goals and, most recently, the future land use map monthly at Commissioner meetings.

Although the Board has continued to receive informal public comment and discussed revisions during regularly scheduled Commissioners meetings, it has been over a year since the public was last formally requested to comment on the plan in its entirety. Staff recommended the Board consider holding a dedicated public comment period prior to adoption. Public comment and adoption can occur at the same meeting. This would allow the Board to stay within the allocated timeframe set forth by the Board at the meeting on December 4, 2023.

Staff requested direction on how the Board would like to proceed considering the comments above. The Board has dedicated a tremendous amount of effort and time to craft a comprehensive plan that reflects their vision for 2045. The plan is vital to the County's ability to conduct development-related business and responsiveness to land use challenges.

Recap

- The County embarked on the development of a new comprehensive plan in 2021
- Thousands of community members actively participated in the planning process

Urban Growth Boundary (UGB)

The Urban Growth Boundary was added to the Future Land Use Map and a description was included in the plan

The Urban Growth Boundary borders the incorporated municipal boundaries of the towns, cities, and villages within Henderson County. The boundary concept was created by the Board of Commissioners during their review of the draft plan in 2023. The purpose of the boundary is to identify where the municipalities are expected to focus growth accommodation and continue to direct development for the next 20 years. It differs from the Utility Service Area, which signifies the existing and potential areas for water, sewer, and broadband utilities, because the Urban Growth Boundary is the area where the physical, urban development is most likely to occur.

The urban growth boundary is the priority area where growth should first be directed. The USA is the second priority area for middle housing and economic development due to the availability of utilities such as water and sewer.

Commissioners' Incorporated Changes

- The Board dedicated a tremendous amount of effort and time to craft a comprehensive plan that reflects their vision for 2045
- All revisions have been transparent and discussed during the Board's meetings
 - Meetings that had Comprehensive Plan Goals discussed also had dedicated public comment
- Revisions to the plan goals, recommendations, and action steps discussed in depth during a 4-month period
- Revisions to Future Land Use Map, including a mapping exercise, were studied between July and December
- Major additions to the draft plan included a delineated Urban Growth Boundary

Urban Growth Boundary Definition

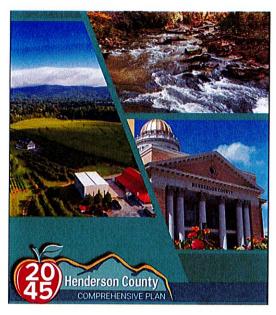
The Urban Growth Boundary is now defined in the glossary as:

"**Urban Growth Boundary (UGB):** Geographic area that encompasses the municipal limits and appropriate for growth that includes adaptive reuse and high-density development during the next 20 years. Municipal growth should be directed to the UGB."

Where We Are in the Process

- ▶ The required public hearing was on December 5, 2022.
- Since that time, the Commissioners continued to receive informal public comment.
- The BOC maintained transparency as revisions were discussed during regularly scheduled Board meetings; but it has been over a year since the public formerly commented on the plan in its entirety.
- Although not required, staff recommends the Board consider holding a dedicated public comment prior to adoption. Public comment and adoption can occur at the same meeting.
- Plan adoption is anticipated for February





Chairman McCall said that although the information presented had been seen in bits and pieces, the consolidated plan that the Board received just before tonight's meeting was a new document that would require time to review. She noted that at the December 4, 2023, meeting, the Board had voted to retain the 2020 Comprehensive Plan document as the County's Comprehensive Plan for three months or until March 31, 2024.

Commissioner Lapsley announced that he expects the board to take action on the final draft plan and land use maps at the mid-month meeting in February.

5. Hendersonville City Zoning Board of Adjustment – 1 vac.

There were no nominations, and this item was carried to the next meeting.

6. Home and Community Care Block Grant Advisory Committee – 1 vac.

There were no nominations, and this item was carried to the next meeting.

7. Laurel Park Planning Board – 1 vac.

There were no nominations, and this item was carried to the next meeting.

8. Laurel Park Zoning Board of Adjustment – 1 vac.

There were no nominations, and this item was carried to the next meeting.

9. Library Board of Trustees - Nomination of President of the Friends of the Library position

Chairman McCall made the motion to appoint Milton Butterworth to the Friends of the Library position #8. All voted in favor, and the motion carried.

10. Nursing/Adult Care Home Community Advisory Committee – 10 vacs.

There were no nominations, and this item was carried to the next meeting.

COMMISSIONER UPDATES

Commissioner Andreotta noted the passing of longtime friend and Henderson County business owner Cliff Freeman. He said he was a pillar of the community and would be missed.

Vice-Chair Edney, also a friend of Cliff Freeman, said his passing was a loss to the community.

Commissioner Hill offered kudos to Parks and Recreation for the success of the weekend New Year's Eve Apple Rise Ceremony.

Lapsley echoed comments in regard to the loss due to the passing of Cliff Freeman.

Commissioner Lapsley noted that his alma mater, the University of Wyoming, had recently

played Toledo in the Barstool Sports Arizona Bowl. Toledo led most of the game, but Wyoming scored a 24-yard field goal as time expired to win the game with a final score of 16-15.

Vice-Chair McCall said the next meeting on January 17th would be the Budget Retreat, and due to the expected length of that meeting, a public comment period would not be offered. She said the state had scheduled a public hearing for the Clear Creek Sewer Project. The meeting will be held on February 5, 2024, at 5:00 p.m. in the North Henderson High School Auditorium. In closing, she noted that the Recycling Center is extending the collection of Styrofoam to twice a month. Collection will be offered on the first and third Tuesday of each month.

COUNTY MANAGER'S REPORT

John Mitchell thanked Bruce Gilliam and his staff at Parks & Recreation for the success of the New Year's Eve Apple Rise Ceremony.

Mitchell noted that the first Henderson County podcast was available to view on the County's website. In closing, he said the grubbing had made it onto the Ecusta Trail after months of work.

As per custom, the panel was asked to predict who would win the national championship game that is coming up between the Michigan Wolverines and the Washington Huskies. He said the winners would win the right to be the first to each lunch at the Budget Retreat on January 17th. Russ Burrell, John Mitchell, Chairman McCall, Commissioners Hill, Lapsley, and Andreotta predicted Michigan would win the championship, while Amy Brantley and Vice-Chair Edney predicted Washington would take the win.
