Provisional Ballot Definitions

1. ID NOT PROVIDED – EXCEPTION – REASONABLE IMPEDIMENT

If the voter completed a Photo ID Exception Form and is otherwise eligible to vote, staff are required to recommend approval of the application and the county board is required to count the provisional ballot, unless the county board unanimously find that the Form is false.

2. DL/SSN PROVISIONAL

If the voter must vote provisionally due to registration repair and provides either their valid NCDL or SSN number with the provisional application, staff are required to recommend approval of the application and the county board is required to count the provisional ballot

3. INCORRECT PARTY

Staff should conduct research to confirm the voters affiliation.

If the record shows that the voter's party affiliation was incorrectly listed in their voter record, then the application must be approved and the ballot counted.

If the record confirms the voter is affiliated with a different political party than the political party in whose primary that voter cast a provisional ballot, the county board must count only count the non partisan contests, if any.

4. INCORRECT PRECINCT

If voter submits a provisional voting application simply because they presented in a precinct other than their proper precinct within the same county, the county board must approve the application.

5. NO RECORD OF REGISTRATION

Staff must research application eligibility.

If the record shows that applicant properly registered or timely attempted to register by submitting the required information before the voter registration deadline that county board must approve the application.

6. PREVIOUSLY REMOVED

Voters who were previously and properly removed because the county received a cancellation notice from the voter or from another jurisdiction are not eligible unless a timely attempt was made upon their return to the county to register. An application submitted in this circumstance must be disapproved.

7. NO RECORD OF REGISTRATION

Staff must research application eligibility.

If the record shows that applicant made no timely attempt to register by submitting the required information before the voter registration deadline that county board must disapprove the application.

8. INCORRECT PARTY

Staff should conduct research to confirm the voters affiliation.

If the record confirms the voter is affiliated with a different political party than the political party in whose primary that voter cast a provisional ballot, and there was found to be no attempt to change the voters party in a timely manner, the county board must disapprove the application.

9. ID NOT PROVIDED – NO EXCEPTION FORM/RETURN WITH ID

Voters who choose to vote a provisional ballot and then bring their photo ID to the county board office must do so no later than 12:00 PM on the third day after the election.


- Member Hill moved to accept the agenda. The motion was approved unanimously.

New Business:


- 60 Provisional ballots were reviewed. Based on staff research, and supporting documentation provided, 25 were approved and 35 were not approved.




