What we do

Focus on a core set of issues that have *high impact* on the *environmental health* and *long-term prosperity* of our region:

- Advocating sensible land use
- Restoring public forests
- Improving water quality
- Promoting clean energy
- Encouraging civic engagement







Volunteer Water Information Network (VWIN)

- Volunteer-based chemical monitoring program.
- Sample 33 sites throughout Henderson County.
- Test for several parameters indicating pH, alkalinity, conductivity, nutrients, and sediment.
- Data covering nearly two decades.
- Allows MountainTrue and partners to identify streams facing degradation.
- Annual reports and interactive map available at mountaintrue.org.
- Accomplishments- Erosion and Sediment
 Ordinance and Mud Creek Restoration Project.





Stream Monitoring Information Exchange (SMIE)

- Volunteer-based biological monitoring program.
- Sample 21 sites throughout Henderson County for aquatic macroinvertebrates.
- Aquatic macroinvertebrates are terrific indicators of water quality.
- Allows MountainTrue and partners to identify streams facing degradation.
- Annual reports and interactive map available at mountaintrue.org.
- Annual training held in March; recruiting new volunteers.





Adopt-A-Stream (AAS)

- Enable community members to become stewards of sections of local streams, creeks, and rivers.
- Teams participate in trash clean-up events.
- Teams are watchdogs of their stream and perform regular monitoring.
- Teams are comprised of local businesses, local government departments, community groups, church or family groups, school groups, neighborhood associations, or individual citizens.



Henderson County Big Sweep

- Annual county-wide stream clean-up event held in September.
- Adopt-A-Stream teams, and other groups and individuals throughout the community participate.
- In the past five years alone, MountainTrue Big Sweep volunteers have contributed over 1,400 hours removing almost 14,000 pounds of trash and recycling!





Education and Outreach

- Organize and lead adult and youth education activities.
 - 1. Rugby Middle School field tripcollaborated with other organizations to educate 300 8th graders.
- Contribute to community outreach events.
 - 1. Mills River Day- contributed to the planning of, and participated in, Mills River Day.





Other Opportunities

- Live Staking
 - 1. Reduce bank erosion by planting certain native plants such as silky dogwoods.
- Other opportunities may arise throughout the year.
