## The Agency

Henderson County Department of Public Health is a robust agency that often leads the way in the region and state when addressing public health issues and community needs and is well supported by local government and the Board of Health. The priorities identified in the most recent community health assessment in 2021 are Mental Health, Substance Misuse, Physical Activity and Nutrition, Safe and Affordable Housing, and Interpersonal Violence. A few notable activities of the agency have included being proactive in identifying a social determinant of health as a priority and with the support of local government and community agencies maintains an active countywide taskforce to address behavioral health and substance abuse. Henderson County Department of Public Health employees a total of 145 employees – 120 full/part time and 25 auxiliary/temporary and was reaccredited with honors in 2022. The Henderson County Board of Health was awarded outstanding Board of Health in 2015, 2018 and 2022.



## **Essential Duties**

- Must be knowledgeable regarding risk management, county/department safety policies/procedures, health and physical hazards for staff and operations, Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) requirements, preparedness/bioterrorism threats, infection control, communicable disease and other appropriate initiatives to assure and protect the health and safety of the general public, clients and staff
- Working knowledge of applicable federal and state laws, rules and regulations


## Minimum Requirements

- Medical Doctorate
- Or master's degree in public health administration and at least one year of employment experience in health programs or health services
- OR a master's degree in a public health discipline other than public health administration and at least three years of employment experience in health programs or health services
- OR a master's degree in public administration and at least two years experience in health programs or health services
- Or a master's degree in a field related to public health and at least three years of experience in health programs or health services
- Or a bachelor's degree in public health administration or public administration and at least three years experience in health programs or health services
