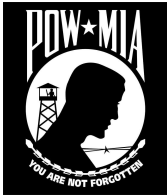
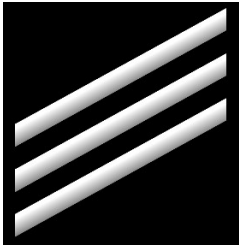


# Roy J. Williams

Missing In Action – April 21, 1944 – Mediterranean Sea

<p>Williams was a U.S. Navy, Seaman First Class, and a Naval Armed Guard. He was on one of the ships (Convoy UGS-38) attacked in the Mediterranean Sea. “Some 28 merchant ships with Armed Guards aboard were in a much larger convoy about four hours east of Algiers and enroute to Bizerte when German torpedo planes came in for the kill on April 20, 1944. Two American ships were hit, and one was sunk.” He is memorialized at the <i>Tablets of the Missing North Africa American Cemetery</i>, Carthage, Tunisia. He was born in Henderson County, the son of Eulice Raymond Williams and Bessie Elizabeth Warren. He was residing and working in the Mountain Home community at the time of his enlistment.</p>
