# HISTORIC RESOURCES COMMISSION MARCH 28, 2007

#### CALL TO ORDER/WELCOME

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

A motion was made to approve the minutes of the January 24, 2007 meeting. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

# **DISCUSSION ITEMS**

# Discussion with the State Historic Preservation Officer

Becca Johnson and Mary Ruffin Hanbury were present from the State offices. There was much discussion about the responsibilities of a new Commission, the Commission's role, and possible historic sites. Roger Snyder requested a flow chart that details how the local Commission relates to the Federal and State levels. There was also discussion of how much authority the Commission has – can it authorize a survey or must that be done by the Board of Commissioners? It was the consensus of the Commission that it does have such authority and can also apply for grants. It was also determined that after one year, and at least one designation, the Commission can be a Certified Local Government Commission.

There was further discussion of being listed on the National Register versus being a local landmark. It was determined that designation as a local landmark carries a greater status, and that such designation must be approved by the Board of Commissioners.
