WHAT'S NEW WITH THE DIGITAL LIBRARY?

— hoopla —


Users of hoopla have several ways to maximize their monthly borrows. In addition to the four monthly *Instant Borrows* available, you will also see an option in hoopla to checkout *Flex Borrows. Flex Borrows* are a collection of titles provided for checkout through hoopla by NCLIVE. These titles will show as Available or Wait List. If a title indicates there is a Wait List, you may place that title on hold.

Starting in March, *Bonus Borrows* will be available the last week of each month instead of quarterly. *Bonus Borrows* are a collection of titles available in hoopla that do not count toward your 4 monthly *Instant Borrows*.

In addition to ebooks and audiobooks, hoopla includes a selection of movies and music for checkout, as well as BingePasses. BingePasses are a collection of items that only use one of your monthly checkouts and are available for one week. With this one checkout you can access multiple items available in the pass for the week. There are currently over 20 BingePasses available, with content for children and adults. Some popular ones include The Great Courses, Hallmark Movies, Curiosity Stream, and Hellosaurus.

USING YOUR DIGITAL LIBRARY





- Libby. Library

Library card holders and StudentAccess accounts can use the Libby app to access both the North Carolina Digital Library and the NC Kids Digital Library. Both collections include ebooks and audiobooks. The NC Digital Library also includes a large selection of digital magazines. A recent feature added to Libby is the Magazine Rack. You can now "subscribe" to a magazine in Libby and new issues will automatically be added to your Magazine Rack. You can also go directly to the Newsstand from your Magazine Rack to search only magazines.

The NC Kids Digital Library includes titles geared toward preschool through 6th grade. This collection has books, audiobooks, and read-alongs with some bilingual titles and titles available in multiple languages. The "Always Available" category includes books that have multiple copies of the same title that can be checked out at the same time. These are great for a classroom read!

Ask any staff member for help with hoopla or Libby. You can also make an appointment for more in-depth assistance with using the digital library by visiting the **Using Your Library** tab on the library website and clicking on **Technology Help**.

MOBILE PRINTING NOW AVAILABLE AT THE FLETCHER LIBRARY



Mobile printing is now available at the Fletcher Library, in addition to the Etowah and Main Library locations.

Mobile printing allows you to send documents from anywhere with an internet connection. Send items to be printed to any of the above locations and pick them up within 24 hours during regular operating hours.

Find directions on the library website- scroll to the bottom of the homepage and click on "Print from Home or Mobile Devices".

Printing costs 10¢ per page for black and white prints or 20¢ per page for color. Currently the libraries are only able to accept payment by cash or check.

Regular physical activity has many benefits for all ages. Exercise can improve your mood, boost energy, help you sleep better, reduce your risk of heart disease, type 2 diabetes, stroke, and more. Try a new physical activity at the library this spring with several fitness and movement programs available!

TAI CHI is an ancient Chinese practice of moving meditation that stimulates the body's energy flow while deepening one's inner calm. Tai Chi will be offered at the Etowah Library.

Also at the Etowah Library, **AWARENESS THROUGH MOVEMENT** classes are fun, gentle, mindful movement exercises from the Feldenkrais Method[®]. Most lessons take place comfortably lying on your back, side, or front, but you may also stand, walk, or sit in a chair. These classes help a wide range of people, from those with limited mobility to those who have more flexibility.

CHAIR EXERCISE CLASSES at the Edneyville and Fletcher Libraries will focus on training exercises that support increased strength, mobility, and reduced fall risk. These classes are great for people just getting started with an exercise routine or looking to exercise with others. Hand weights will be provided, or you may bring your own.

PILATES MAT EXERCISE offered at the Mills River Library is whole body fitness! Strengthen your core, improve spinal flexibility and balance.

SIT STEP SING is a chair exercise program for seniors developed by Debra Saalfield. This program allows those with little or no mobility to enjoy fantastic, memorable music, easy movement, and the opportunity to sing-along! Sit Step Sing will be offered at the Main Library.

Registration is required for these free programs as space is limited. Check the program insert, the library's online event calendar, or call your preferred library location for dates and times of each session.



This column features recent and forthcoming titles from southeastern authors or books set in the region. Place any of these titles on hold online or call any Henderson County Library for assistance.

The latest thriller by North Carolina author Rachel Hawkins, *The Heiress*, centers around an adopted son who rejects his inheritance from North Carolina's richest woman and moves away. Years later he is drawn back to the family home after his uncle's death as old secrets are brought to light.

Set in 1960's North Carolina, *The Girls We Sent Away* by Meagan Church is a novel that tells the story of a pregnant teen who is sent to a maternity home for wayward girls and the decisions she must make in order to move on with her life.

North Carolina author Jill McCorkle presents a varied collection of complex short stories about crimes large and small in her latest titled *Old Crimes*.

In *Devout: A Memoir of Doubt*, Anna Gazmarian tells the story of her evangelical upbringing in North Carolina and her personal journey after being diagnosed with bipolar disorder.

Asheville chef and restaurant owner William Dissen shares recipes from the traditions of Appalachian community and agriculture in *Thoughtful Cooking: Recipes Rooted in the New South*.

Praisesong for the Kitchen Ghosts: Stories and Recipes from Five Generations of Black Country Cooks by Crystal Wilkinson is a collection of family recipes, stories, and photographs that highlight the history of Black Appalachians.

For fans of historical fiction with a local setting, *These Tangled Threads: A Novel of Biltmore* by Sarah Loudin Thomas follows the story of a Biltmore Industries master weaver who is commissioned to create an original design for Cornelia Vanderbilt's 1924 wedding.

Rednecks by Taylor Brown is a historical drama based on the 1920 events of the West Virginia Mine Wars that led up to the Battle of Blair Mountain, known as the largest labor uprising in American history.

The latest Reese's Book Club pick, *Redwood Court* by DéLana R. A. Dameron is the author's debut novel. This collection of stories is centered around a family in Columbia, South Carolina, starting in the 1960s.


