
We are blessed to have six locations to serve us in Henderson County."

like HeritageQuest, Ancestry.com, and our print collection of local history provide the tools needed to illuminate your heritage.

HeritageQuest is a great resource to help you discover your roots and unlike the library's subscription to Ancestry.com, it can be accessed from home using a library card. Its interface allows you to search for individuals using names, geographic locations, and timelines.

HeritageQuest's results can also be downloaded, printed, or emailed for safekeeping.

Available record types include U.S. Census records, immigration records, city directories, and military records. HeritageQuest also contains records not found in other databases including Revolutionary War pension files and Freedman's Bank records.

Whether you're looking to learn a new language, download audiobooks, or find trustworthy information on a topic of interest, NC Live is a great place to get started and the new user-friendly site makes it even easier to search.

**Reading Records for All Ages!**


**Preschool:** After completing 6 of the 8 early literacy activities, children will receive a free book and be entered into a drawing for the grand prize, a set of Duplo building blocks. Children may pick up another early literacy record, complete it, and turn it in for an additional chance at the prize.

**K-5<sup>th</sup>:** After reading 600 minutes, children will receive a free book and be entered into a drawing for the grand prize, a Kindle Fire Kid's Edition. Each library branch will draw for a grand prize. Children can continue reading for extra grand prize drawing entries.

**Teens (Grades 6<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup>):** Teens will read 750 minutes to receive a free book and an entry for a grand prize, a Kindle Fire HD. One middle school student and one high school student will receive a grand prize. Teens can also continue to read for extra grand prize entries.

**Adults:** Adults will read a total of 300 minutes. When the 300 minutes of reading is completed, they are entered into the grand prize drawing, a Kindle Fire (1 per branch); each subsequent completed log is another entry for the grand prize drawing.

**All reading records must be turned in no later than Saturday, August 5<sup>th</sup> to receive a book (children and teens) and be entered into the grand prize drawing (all).**

There are over 60 free special events scheduled across our 6 branches during the 8 weeks of summer fun. Programs include magic shows, musical performances, Hands On! Hendersonville experiments, experiential activities, STEAM programs and more.

# CALLING ALL APPLE USERS!

*Did you know the Main Library has a monthly program for you?*

In fact the library's Apple Users Group had its one-year anniversary in April. Hosted by Instructional Librarian Michele von Boeck, this group meets monthly to learn from each other and, on occasion, from a professional in the field. The group members choose the topic on a monthly basis, then come to the next meeting prepared with questions and answers. Knowledge levels range widely from novice iPhone users, to long-time Mac users, and if someone in the group doesn't have the answer, someone else will probably know of a resource to help. Most members bring their portable Apple devices for demonstration and practice.

Whether you're a novice, a seasoned Apple pro, or just deciding if Apple products are right for you, this group is a great resource. The group typically meets on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Tuesday of each month from 2-3:30pm in the Main Library's Kaplan Auditorium. Registration is not necessary.



# Once in a lifetime... **TOTAL ECLIPSE OF THE SUN**



**On Monday, August 21<sup>st</sup>, a total eclipse of the sun will be visible in parts of the United States for the first time in almost 40 years.**

Although Henderson County is just outside of the “path of totality,” the area that will witness a complete coverage of the sun by the moon, if the skies are clear a partial eclipse

will still be visible for over two minutes. Hotels and overlooks in the area have already sold out, but don’t worry, the library has events to help you learn about and witness the celestial wonder.

**On Wednesday, August 9<sup>th</sup>, Pisgah Astronomical Research Institute, a former NASA facility, will give a presentation on the eclipse at 4pm in the Main Library’s Kaplan Auditorium.**

**On eclipse day, Hands On! Hendersonville will have activities at the Main Library for all ages and viewing glasses will be available while supplies last.**

Looking at the eclipse without eye protection will damage your eyes so please make sure to pick up a pair of free viewing glasses and join us in the field adjacent to the Main Library’s parking lot to view this exciting event. Too cloudy to see the eclipse? Bummer, but NASA’s live stream of the eclipse will be showing in the Kaplan Auditorium.

The Green River Branch may be small in size, but it has a major impact for residents in the south side of our county. Nearly thirty years ago, the residents of the Green River area joined together to sponsor and build our branch located just off exit 3 on the 25 bypass. Patrons literally laid the foundation of our branch and today the library is staffed largely by an army of dedicated volunteers. We love our volunteers!

# HOMEBOUND SERVICES

The Homebound Services Program ensures that all county residents have access to library materials even if they are unable to visit the library due to their personal situations. In the last 6 years, the Homebound Program has grown from 225 to over 550 patrons.

Candis Killam, Homebound Services Coordinator, and her group of dedicated staff and volunteers deliver books, audiobooks, music, and DVDs each month to patrons in their homes as well as facilities such as assisted living, retirement homes, nursing homes, and rehabilitation facilities.






