NEW NC Cardinal Library Catalog– Coming Soon!

The Henderson County Library System has been awarded an NC Cardinal Migration Grant in the amount of \$58,189 to serve the residents of Henderson County. NC Cardinal is a growing consortium of public libraries in 27 counties across North Carolina dedicated to sharing resources and expanding opportunities through the use of a single online catalog.

In late January 2016, our library system will become the newest member of NC Cardinal and also make the switch to Evergreen as our online catalog. Both of these changes will dramatically increase the number of resources at your fingertips and greatly improve your overall catalog experience. What this means is that as a HCPL card holder, you will now have free access to over 5 million library items. In addition to borrowing items for free from our library system, NC Cardinal will allow you to place holds on items from any participating consortium library and materials will be sent to the pickup library of your choice. If you are traveling outside the county, your library card will be welcomed at any participating consortium member institution.

Visit one of our 6 library locations to learn more about this exciting new service that will be coming soon to a Henderson County Library near you.



NEW LIBRARY SERVICE: SELF-e JIL biblioboard

SELF-e, a collaboration between *Library Journal* and the *BiblioBoard* ebook service (accessible via *NCLive*), is a digital publishing platform designed to connect authors, libraries, and readers. The BiblioBoard site consists of several digital collections.

Local authors may submit work to be included in the Indie NC: Discover Local Authors collection, which is accessible to readers of all subscribing libraries in North Carolina. "Best of the best" (as judged by *Library Journal*) submissions will also appear in the LJ Self-e Select collection, which is accessible to readers of all subscribing libraries nationwide. SELF-e is intended to be a marketing tool for authors and to make an author's work available to library patrons in North Carolina and across the nation. Readers interested in borrowing ebooks from the *BiblioBoard* service can use their library card number to set up an account on any *BiblioBoard* Collections webpage. Digital titles can be read online or downloaded to your mobile device.

THE WORLD OF INFORMATION AT YOUR FINGERTIPS

The following two resources are free to library card holders to use anywhere in the world.

WORLD BOOK

World Book Online consists of five databases that can help researchers of all ages. Kindergarten and Elementary school age children can find useful subjects, Elementary and Middle School students can access project help, and High School, College, and adult students can find extra depth through the "Reference Center." Enciclopedia Estudiantil Hallazgos is for Spanish-speaking children and ESL students. All five databases are built around a digital version of the print World Book Encyclopedia with the addition of sound, video, and photos.



Credo Online Reference consists of digital versions of 600+ subject specific encyclopedias. The information contained in Credo is intended for adults and is generally of a deeper nature than that found in World Book Online.

Both databases allow for translation into foreign languages and have "read aloud" functions built in. They can both be accessed at home or in the library from the Research/Reference page on the Henderson County Public library website.


SIMON, WE THANK YOU FOR YOUR SERVICE ...
