




Congratulations to two library staff members graduating in December!



In this column we feature new titles at the library from local authors or books with a focus on Appalachia and the Southeast. Place any of these titles on hold through the online catalog or call the library for assistance.

There are a few notable nonfiction titles this time around. Anderson Cooper and Katherine Howe have penned a family history of America's wealthiest family in *Vanderbilt: The Rise and Fall of an American Dynasty*. Essayist Imani Perry takes readers on a multifaceted and personal tour in *South to America: A Journey Below the Mason-Dixon to Understand the Soul of a Nation*. A new history of a mountain ghost town is out with Christy A. Smith's *Lost Cove, North Carolina: Portrait of a Vanished Appalachian Community, 1864-1957*. Janisse Ray's book of essays, *Wild Spectacle: Seeking Wonders in a World Beyond Humans*, is a jumping off point to see what makes her one of the best nature writers in the Southeast. For true crime that reads like Savannah's acclaimed *Midnight in the Garden of Good and Evil*, read about eccentric Louisville in *A Dark Room in Glitter Ball City: Murder, Secrets, and Scandal in Old Louisville* by David Domine. For laughs, pick up *Bring Your Baggage and Don't Pack Light* by Helen Ellis, humorist and author of *Southern Lady Code*.

For short stories, check out Beth Gilstrap's Carolina storytelling in <u>Deadheading and Other Stories</u>, or stories based on Tennessee folk legends in Andrew Siegrist's <u>We Imagined it Was Rain</u>. Kentucky Poet Laureate Crystal Wilkinson's <u>Perfect Black</u> combines poetry, memoir, and illustrations portraying her life and work in Southern Appalachia.

Find a new author or genre with any of three first novels. Odie Lindsey's debut, <u>Some Go Home</u>, is a contemporary literary novel about family history in a small Southern town. Grieving the loss of her friend, a woman brings her ashes to her Blue Ridge Mountain home to find a touch of magic and a hint of mystery in <u>Wildwood</u> <u>Whispers</u> by Willa Reece. In Angel Khoury's <u>Between Tides</u>, a saga of romance and anguish spans two generations and coastlines from the Outer Banks to Cape Cod.

For mountain novels, the historical thriller *Fate Moreland's Widow* by John Lane has been republished, about mill barons, labor struggle, and tragedy in the Foothills, and Asheville author Sarah Loudin Thomas has a new Christian novel about a dowser in *The Finder of Forgotten Things*. In paranormal historical novels, the past comes back to haunt the North Carolina suburbs in local favorite Diane Chamberlain's *The Last House on the Street*, and ghosts hold the secret to the haunting conclusion of the popular Tradd Street series by Karen White in *The Attic on Queen Street*.

Perhaps the most buzzed about book is Janet Beard's novel about Appalachian women and their storytelling traditions in *The Ballad of Laurel Springs*. Suspenseful reads I am looking forward to include a near future dystopian science fiction novel called *Trashlands* by Alison Stine, and two thrillers set in remote mountain cabins, *A Fire in the Night* by Christopher Swann and *These Silent Woods* by Kimi Cunningham Grant.

APP GOING AWAY

The OverDrive company will be phasing out the OverDrive reading app in 2022. As of February 2022, the OverDrive app will no longer be available to download. If you are currently using the OverDrive app, you will be able to continue using it, however, it will eventually be phased out and the Libby app will be the only option. We know many of you enjoy checking out e-books, audiobooks, and magazines from the North Carolina Digital Library using the OverDrive or Libby app. If you are currently using Libby, you will be able to continue doing so with no interruption. Please note the Libby app is currently not available for Kindle devices. Kindle Fire users can access the digital library from ncdigital.overdrive.com in their internet browser. If you are using a Kindle e-reader, you can check out digital titles on a computer, smartphone, or tablet, then send the title to your e-reader.
