LIBRARY DIGITIZING BACK ISSUES OF THE



In August, the library reached an agreement with Bill Moss of the *Hendersonville Lightning* to begin digitizing back issues of the paper. They will be hosted on the North Carolina Newspapers page of NewspaperArchive.com, courtesy of *World Archives*.

The intention is to eventually make all 10 previous years of the *Lightning* available to patrons through a link on the library's website. The back issues are color, full-text and fully searchable. This arrangement preserves a valuable source of local news for Henderson County and makes local news and history easily accessible for future research. So far Volumes 7-10, covering May 2018 - April 2022, have been uploaded to Newspaper Archive's North Carolina Newspapers webpage and are available to view. Volumes 1-6 should be uploaded and accessible in early 2023. Once the back issues are completed the library will digitize each 52-issue volume as it is completed. It is important to note that patrons looking for issues in the current volume of the Lightning will still need to go to the Lightning's website or the print version of the paper.

Patrons can access the back issues from Henderson County Public Library's Local History and genealogy webpage https://hendersonpl.libguides.com/GenealogyLocalHist/Home. You will need a valid library card if you are trying to access from home.

We will start off this edition with several new titles in a variety of genres recently published by North Carolina authors.

Matthew Quick, bestselling author of *The Silver Linings Playbook*, explores grief and love through a main character who believes his deceased wife visits him every night as an angel in his latest novel, We Are the Light.

The newest title from author Megan Shepherd is her first novel written for an adult audience and it promises to be a dark, complex, and creepy tale. Malice House follows a woman who encounters more than she expected when settling the estate of her late father, an acclaimed horror writer.

Another Young Adult author's newest novel is also her first written for adults. In Spells for Forgetting by Adrienne Young, strange things begin happening on a remote island when an accused murderer returns to bury his mother's ashes. Young has also recently published a prequel to the Young Adult Fable series titled **Saint**.

Fans of science fiction and time travel will enjoy Lost in Time by A.G. Riddle, where a father must travel back in time to exonerate his daughter who was falsely accused of murder.

If you enjoyed Razorblade Tears by S.A. Cosby, the author's first novel, My Darkest Prayer, is being newly republished, and it is another gritty, small-town thriller set in the south.

Moving along to other southern writers, Tennessee author Kevin Wilson's new title, Now is Not the Time to Panic, takes a woman back to her awkward teenage years when a journalist begins to investigate an incident that started as an artistic creation but quickly got out of hand.

Haints on Black Mountain is a new collection of haunted short stories by Ann Hite. These stories are connected by a young Cherokee woman and her relatives as they experience a series of ghostly encounters.

In Kate Clayborn's new romance, *Georgie, All Along*, busy personal assistant Georgie must return to her hometown where she discovers a new life path.


