SUMMARY OF REQUEST:

For the 2045 Comprehensive Plan to be an effective tool for guiding the County's land use vision for the next 20 years, it must be implemented in a deliberate manner with a focus toward achieving the three main outcomes: Intentional Land Use, Connectivity, and Opportunity. An implementation plan with an organized matrix is necessary for the County to utilize for measuring plan progress over the next 20 years. The implementation plan will provide guidance for specific action items and implementation roles and responsibilities for four, five-year periods. This phasing allows the implementation plan to be updated at regular intervals in response to unanticipated opportunities and challenges and to support the long-term vision and goals of the Comprehensive Plan.

- 1. INTENTIONAL LAND USE
- 2. CONNECTIVITY
- 3. OPPORTUNITY

Each outcome is accomplished through 2-3 plan goals.

- 2. Protect and conserve rural character and agriculture.
- 3. Improve resiliency of the natural and built environments.
- 4. Prioritize multi-modal transportation options and connectivity.
- 5. Create reliable, connected utility and communication network.
- 6. Stimulate innovative economic development initiatives, entrepreneurship, and local businesses.
- 7. Diversify housing choices and increase availability.
- 8. Promote healthy living, public safety, and access to education.

 - Target completion date may state ongoing until the Comprehensive Plan is rewritten in 2045.
