The Henderson County Board of Commissioners met for a regularly scheduled meeting at 5:30 p.m. in the Commissioners' Meeting Room of the Historic Courthouse on Main Street, Hendersonville.

### PUBLIC HEARING – Canceled – Application Withdrawn

**Rezoning Application #R-2018-07C. Horseshoe Farms, Residential Two (R2) to Local Commercial Conditional District (LD-CD)**

The applicant for Horseshoe Farms Rezoning Application #R-2018-07-C had requested the application be withdrawn.

*The Chairman accepted the withdrawal request and the public hearing scheduled for March 4<sup>th</sup> was canceled.*

### INFORMAL PUBLIC COMMENT

1. Dennis Justice feels a dome is needed for emergency shelter. He discussed sports betting bills and feels legislature should kill the bills.
2. Phil Rasmussen feels a 3-lane road for Highway 191 would work better.
3. Bill Hogan feels a 3-lane road would work better on Highway 191 than a 4 lane. The biggest traffic issue is at the schools and could be resolved with turning lanes. More study should be done by the NC DOT.

**County Financial Report/Cash Balance Report – January 2019**

The January 2019 County Financial Report and Cash Balance Report were provided for the Board's review and approval.

The following are explanations for departments/programs with higher budget to actual percentages for the month of January:

- Dues/Non-Profit Contributions – payment of 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter Board approved contributions
- Elections – payment for Board approved capital purchases
- Garage – encumbrances for Board approved capital purchases, fuel costs to be allocated
- Emergency Medical Services – encumbrances for Board approved vehicle purchases
- Rescue Squad – payment of 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter Board approved contribution payment
- Agri-Business – excess operating expenditures that will be covered by membership fees
- Mental Health – payment of 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter Board approved maintenance of effort (MOE)
- Juvenile Justice Programs – budget adjustment pending final approval of total allocation amount
- Public Education – payment 7 of 10 of annual appropriation made to the public schools
- Non-departmental – workers compensation claims to be allocated; higher than budget occupancy taxes

The YTD deficit in the Oklawaha Greenway Project is due to the timing of the grantor's reimbursement of expenditures incurred.

**Request for Shuttle Bus Parking – 1995 Courthouse 4<sup>th</sup> Ave. Parking Lot**

The County has received a request from Sierra Nevada Brewing Co. (SNBCo) for the use of the 1995 Courthouse north parking lot, off of 4<sup>th</sup> Ave. This request is associated with SNBCo's 2019 Beer Camp on June 8, 2019.

SNBCo proposes to utilize the parking lot as "a central and safe location for residents to load/un-load" the SNBCo shuttle bus. During the event, the shuttle bus will provide safe and complementary transportation between Hendersonville and the brewery in Mills River.

Motion:

*I move that the Board approves the use of the 1995 Courthouse's parking lot on 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue by Sierra Nevada Brewing Company on Saturday, June 8, 2019.*

**Set Public Hearing for Rezoning Application #R-2018-08C, Haywood Park Estates, Residential Two (R2) to Residential One Conditional District (R1-CD)**

Rezoning Application #R-2018-08C was initiated on December 03, 2018 and requests that the County conditionally rezone approximately 18.35 acres of land from Residential Two to Residential One Conditional District. The acreage consists of 8 parcels (PIN: 9650-06-9662, 9650-17-5207, 9650-16-5805, 9650-16-4528, 9650-16-1443, 9650-16-3229, and 9650-16-4056). The property owner is Spano & Associates Haywood, LLC. Scott Burwell will be serving as agent.

The Planning Board reviewed this request at its February 21<sup>st</sup> meeting and voted 8-0 to send forth a favorable recommendation.

Motion:

**Library Board of Trustees Bylaws**

The Bylaws for the Library Board of Trustees have recently been reviewed and revised to ensure they are in-line with other Commissioner appointed boards and they fully comply with state statutes. The revised bylaws were approved by the Library Board of Trustees on February 14, 2019 and are presented for consideration.

Motion:

*I move the Board adopt the Bylaws of the Library Board of Trustees as presented.*

**Main Library Roof Replacement Bid Acceptance**

The adopted Henderson County North Carolina Budget Ordinance for fiscal year July 1, 2018 - June 30, 2019, includes the Main Library roof replacement as a part of the approved Facilities Services Planned Projects. Pursuant to the NC State statues 143-128 through 143- 135.9, the project was formally bid on January 31, 2019 resulting in a low bid of \$628,000.00 by AAR Roofing of Kernersville, NC. Henderson County Project Management and Facilities Services utilized the services of REI Engineers to develop specifications and plans for the roof replacement project at a cost of \$15,600.00. The total project cost will therefore be \$643,600.00. The total budgeted amount for the project was \$582,367.00.

As agreed upon by Facilities Services staff, the project engineering and bid overage (\$61,233.00) is being

offset and allowed by savings incurred (\$68,600.00) on the completed Facilities Services Planned Project for the Cooperative Extension roof Replacement.

Staff requests the Board authorize the execution of contract with AAR roofing so that staff can proceed with the roof replacement at the Main Library.

Motion:

*I move to accept low bid of \$628,000.00 by AAR Roofing for the Main Library Roof Replacement.*

**President George H. W. Bush Commemorative Plaque – Pulled for brief explanation by Commissioner McCall**

The Henderson County Heritage Museum has requested permission to place a plaque in the Historic Courthouse lobby, commemorating President George H. W. Bush's visit to Henderson County on September 5, 1992. President Bush and First Lady Barbara Bush celebrated the 46th Annual North Carolina Apple Festival with the people of Henderson County, and spoke at a public rally at the Historic Courthouse.

Commissioner McCall stated the Heritage Museum will provide the plaque, and will be included in the opening ceremony for the Apple Festival. The Heritage Museum will also have story boards describing the event on display during this year's Apple Festival.

Motion:

*I move the Board approves the Heritage Museum's request to place a plaque commemorating President Bush's visit in the lobby of the Historic Courthouse, and direct staff to work with the Museum on the location.*

**DISCUSSION/ADJUSTMENT OF DISCUSSION AGENDA**

*Chairman Hawkins made the motion to adopt the discussion agenda with the addition of a closed session for personnel, and addition of a discussion item, "Resolution – School Construction Bond 2019." All voted in favor and the motion carried.*

There were no nominations at this time and this item was rolled to the next meeting.

3. Home and Community Care Block Grant Advisory Committee –1 vac.

There were no nominations at this time and this item was rolled to the next meeting.

4. Juvenile Crime Prevention Council – 3 vac.

Commissioner McCall nominated Curtis Phylon for position #2, Lily Jenkins for position #4, and Angela Garner for position #6. *Chairman Hawkins made the motion to accept the appointments of Curtis Phylon to position #2, Lily Jenkins to position #4, and Angela Garner to position #6 by acclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried.*

5. Laurel Park Planning Board – 1 vac.

There were no nominations at this time and this item was rolled to the next meeting.

6. Mountain Area Workforce Development Authority – 1 vac.

Bob Williford of the Chamber of Commerce had nominated Graham Fields for position #5. *Chairman Hawkins made the motion to accept the appointment of Graham Fields to position #5 by acclamation. All voted in favor and the motion carried.*

Graham Fields is currently serving on two Board and will step down from the EMS Peer Review Committee effective with this appointment.

7. Nursing/Adult Care Home Community Advisory Committee – 5 vac.

There were no nominations at this time and this item was rolled to the next meeting.

8. Senior Volunteer Services Advisory Council – 3 vac.

There were no nominations at this time and this item was rolled to the next meeting.

**DSS UPDATE – FAMILY CENTERED RECOVERY / THE DUKE ENDOWMENT GRANT**

Dr. Jennifer Hensley, DSS Board Chair - Kevin Marino, Social Work Program Administrator, HC DSS

Jackie Latek, Executive Director SPARC Foundation (SPARC Foundation is a non-profit organization with the mission to keep people out of institutional care, jails, mental health hospitals, and foster care. They believe in second chances and feel that if education, resources and support are brought to people in the community, they can better serve and be more effective.)

The Department of Social Services provided informational updates to the Board of Commissioners regarding various Social Services issues. The March 2019 update, provided by DSS Board Chair Dr. Jennifer Hensley, provides an informational update regarding the Family Centered Treatment Program funded by the Duke Endowment Grant awarded to HC DSS in December 2017. HC DSS is working in partnership with The SPARC Foundation and The Family Centered Treatment Foundation to serve parents with substance use disorder who have been substantiated for abuse or neglect by HC DSS.

Dr. Jennifer Hensley stated the DSS Board provided information to the commissioners approximately one and a half years ago on a treatment program that Henderson County was pioneering along with SPARC Foundation. At the end of 2017, Henderson County was awarded a Duke Endowment (three year grant) of \$415,961.00. Since its inception in 1924 Duke Endowment has funded \$3.7 billion in grants with the main objective of strengthening the community, enriching children's lives, and enriching health and wellness. The grant is allowing Henderson County to do amazing things.

Kevin Marino stated DSS and their partner the SPARC Foundation, have been providing the Family Center Recovery program for about 4.5 years with funds from the grant. Many outcomes are seen with the intensive service that deals directly with family and family systems. With Family Center Recovery, it was determined early on that we need something more intensive that deals with the family system. What happens in today's substance abuse system is that the person effected by substance abuse issues is taken out of the family, they go to outpatient treatment and to intensive outpatient groups where they do all of their own work by themselves. Meanwhile the family system has learned all of these different behaviors that revolve around the

substance misuser. They also have to be in recovery. DSS has combined a lot of different services that intensively treats the entire family system. A licensed clinical addiction specialist is involved as well as a peer support specialist. A lot of evidence today shows that this combination is a more effective way to treat families.

One of the main reasons for this program is that families that are involved in child protection services have so many competing appointments that they must go to and they still have to work and balance family life. Even though they are not making great decisions in the moment, we must figure out how to condense the barriers to treatment with transportation being one of the key barriers. This service is provided in the home with the families and treating every member of the family. Thus far of the 6 families served (9 kids), 6 of those kids are home. DSS has a meeting coming up with VAYA, and VAYA is very interested in giving DSS a Medicaid service definition for this service.

Jackie Latek stated with this particular service we know that we are going to be in family's homes and working with them intensively anywhere from 9-12 months. They may come to us with their kids still in their custody in their homes or their children may have already been removed and are in foster care. Our goal is to work with those parents to get them to a place where DSS feels the safety of the children can be secured and the children returned to their homes with parents. Through that course of treatment we will typically spend 2-3 sessions per week with each session lasting a minimum of two hours, and lasting approximately 1 year. Over the course of treatment as families are becoming successful they will begin to step out and allow the families to move forward while keeping them connected with some of the supports.

Family Centered Recovery is a Collaboration between Henderson County Department of Social Services, The SPARC Foundation, the Family Centered Treatment Foundation, and the Duke Endowment.



#### What is Family Centered Recovery (FCR)?

1. An enhanced innovation that combines the successful Family Centered Treatment service with a stronger focus on Substance Misuse in parents that are involved with Child Protection and Foster Care Services
2. Treatment is provided by a Licensed Clinical Addiction Specialist/Licensed Therapist and a Peer Support Specialist
3. Targets Recovery in the Family System through high intensity and frequency of sessions
4. Includes SAMSA approved strategies to treat substance misuse and family dysfunction

#### Benefits of Family Centered Recovery

- Reduces multiple appointments with other providers.
- Focused on treating every person in the home (the whole family is affected by a parent's misuse) because all members of the family learn to "live with" addiction and must learn how to live without it.
- Recovery Coach through Peer Support Specialist

#### **JOINT SCHOOL FACILITIES COMMITTEE UPDATE**

The Joint School Facilities Committee met Friday, February 22, 2019 and reviewed Henderson County Public Schools 10 Year Strategic Conditions Assessment. Vice-Chairman Lapsley and Commissioner Edney provided an update from that meeting.

Commissioner Edney stated the committee met and the School Board provided a spreadsheet including \$149,900,000 of needs. Some of it is ongoing expense such as roofs and maintenance. Their plan called for \$44m the first year, and then spread items out over the next 10 years. We all agreed that this is not realistic and the spreadsheet was more of a presentation than factual. There is no way to do the planning for most projects in that amount of time. It will most likely take until FY20/21 for most of the major renovations to be ready. There will be a follow-up meeting in a couple of weeks to look at their priorities more on a timeline with our four-year plans, to see what we can do, when we can do it, and how it will fit into our budgeting and financing. Their number one priority is renovations at Upward Elementary. This presentation did not include the potential based on the development of Tap Root. There is no way of knowing right now what that project will do toward growth of schools, or if it will have any affect at all.

Commissioner Lapsley feels the School Board did an excellent job on the Assessment Report of all school buildings, with the help of an Architectural Firm and a General Contractor. He feels the report comes after a lot of work and is legitimate and well based. He trusts the numbers being shared. There are two categories of school related construction. There is maintenance or "Asset Preservation", work that involves maintaining an asset of the community. The community over the years has invested in over a half a billion dollars in assets owned by the taxpayer. It is incumbent upon the commission to do what we need to do to preserve that asset. We must step up and recognize that we must preserve and protect these assets where we have already invested. These numbers can be spilt into 1) asset preservation costs and 2) renovation or expansion costs with renovation or expansion being the more substantial part of the \$150m, which would require borrowing for a debt service. Asset preservation is ongoing with current monies being utilized each year.

County Manager Steve Wyatt stated that 1/3 of county taxes go toward schools, including the community college. The debt service schedule will be decreasing in the next couple of years which will allow the capacity to take on some of these projects. The money for these projects comes from the taxpayers.

Chairman Hawkins feels that in the future the Board may be looking at a dedicated tax stream for the ongoing maintenance at \$3-4m per year.

#### **2019-24 RESOLUTION – SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION BOND 2019 – ADD ON**

Steve Wyatt stated the North Carolina Senate and the North Carolina House of Representatives have legislation under consideration to assist North Carolina County Governments with the financing "for public school facilities through grants to counties for public school capital outlay projects and repairs and renovations."

The formula for distribution to Local Education Agencies (LEAs), though not specifically cited, includes funding for: Average Daily Membership (ADM), Low-Wealth County, ADM Growth, and an Adjustment Factor. Using the current formula, the total for Henderson County, with 13,316 students (17-18 ADM) is \$10,000,000. As a point of comparison, Jones County with 1,065 students, would also receive \$10,000,000.

*Chairman Hawkins made the motion that the Board adopt the Resolution in support of a distribution method that that appropriates funding on a per pupil (ADM) basis, and requires a local match to access the funding. All voted in favor and the motion carried.*

#### **CLOSED SESSION**

The Board is requested to go into closed session pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §143-318.11(a)(6) to consider the qualifications, competence, performance, character, fitness, conditions of appointment, or conditions of initial employment of an individual public officer or employee or prospective public officer or employee, or to hear or investigate a complaint, charge or grievance against an individual public officer or employee.

*Commissioner Edney made the motion that the Board go into closed session pursuant to N.C. Gen. Stat. §143-318.11(a)(6) to consider the qualifications, competence, performance, character, fitness, conditions of appointment, or conditions of initial employment of an individual public officer or employee or prospective public officer or employee, or to hear or investigate a complaint, charge or grievance against an individual public officer or employee. All voted in favor and the motion carried.*

*Chairman Hawkins made the motion to go out of closed session and adjourn at 7:00 p.m. All voted in favor and the motion carried.*

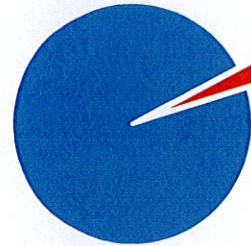

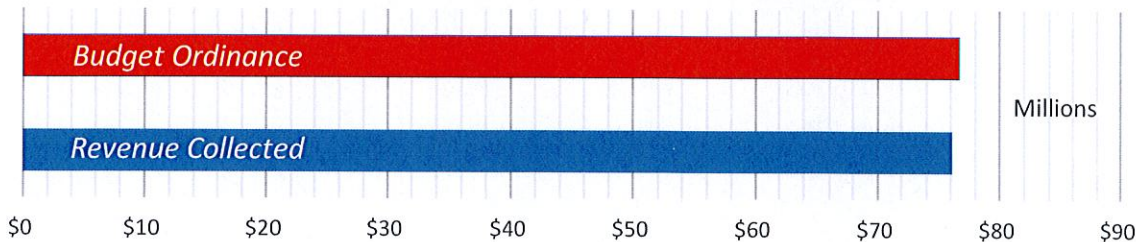

**HENDERSON COUNTY PUBLIC LIBRARY  
BYLAWS OF THE LIBRARY BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

The Henderson County Library Board of Trustees exercises the powers delegated to it by the Henderson County Board of Commissioners. The Board of Trustees performs the duties of an advisory board as outlined herein and serves as a liaison between the Library and County Government.

Responsibilities include:

1. Advising the Library Director and the Governing Body on library programs, policies, and regulations for the government of the library.
2. Providing recommendations to the Governing Body concerning the construction and improvement of buildings and other structure of the library system.
3. Otherwise advising the Board of Commissioners on library matters.

**Article I: Terms of Office**

1. The Library Board shall consist of eight (8) members appointed by the Board of County Commissioners as follows:
  - a. Seven at-large members who are residents of Henderson County.
  - b. The President of the Friends of the Henderson County Public Library shall serve on the Board of Trustees during his/her term of office.
  - c. The Board of County Commissioners may appoint one of its members as a trustee of the library for a term of one year subject to reappointment. The Commissioner shall be a non-voting member.
2. Terms of Service: The term of service shall be 3 years, or until such time as a replacement can be appointed. Trustees may not serve for more than 2 consecutive terms. Following a 12 month absence from the Library Board, an individual shall be eligible for reappointment. Newly appointed members will take office at the first meeting following their appointment by the Board of Commissioners. Notwithstanding the normal term of service, the Board of Commissioners may remove any trustee at any time for incapacity, unfitness, misconduct or neglect of duty.
3. In the event of a vacancy on the Library Board, the vacancy shall be filled by the Board of Commissioners for the unexpired term of the member creating the vacancy. The Library Director shall be responsible for notifying the Clerk to the Board of County Commissioners of any Library Board vacancies.
4. All actions of the Library Board shall be of the Board as a unit. No Library Board member shall act on behalf of the Board, on any matter, without prior approval of the Board. No Library Board member by virtue of their office shall exercise any administrative responsibility with respect to the library nor, as an individual, direct the services of any library employee.

## **Article II: Officers**

1. The officers of the Library Board shall consist of the Chair, Vice-Chair, and Secretary. The Chair shall be selected by the Board of Commissioners; however, prior to such selection they shall receive any recommendation of the Board of Trustees for such position. The remaining officers shall be elected at the annual meeting of the Library Board and serve for one year.
2. The Board Chair shall preside at all meetings of the Board, authorize calls for any special meetings, appoint all committees, execute all documents authorized by the Board, and generally perform all duties associated with that office.
3. The Vice-Chair, in the event of the absence or disability of the Chair, or of a vacancy in that office, shall assume and perform the duties and functions of the Chair.
4. The Board Secretary shall keep a true and accurate account of all proceedings of the Board meetings. A library staff member, designated by the Library Director, shall record such proceedings and prepare them for the Board Secretary's approval. The library staff member shall also, with the Board Secretary's approval issue notice of all regular and special meetings; have custody of the minutes and other records of the Board; and notify the appointing body of any vacancies on the Board.

## **Article III: Committees**

1. The Chair shall appoint committees of two or more members for such specific purposes as the business of the Board may require from time to time. The committee shall be considered to be discharged upon the completion of the purpose for which it was appointed and after the final report is made to the Board.

## **Article IV: Library Director**

1. The Library Director is the executive officer of the Library. The Director is appointed by and reports to the County Manager.
2. The Library Director shall have sole charge of administering the Library and shall consult with the Library Board regarding library policy and procedure, rules and regulations, library services, and the annual budget.

## **Article V: Meetings**

1. Regular meetings of the Library Board of Trustees shall be held every other month, or 6 times per year, on the second Thursday of the corresponding month at 9:00am at the Henderson County Main Library. A schedule of meetings shall be kept on file with the Clerk to the Henderson County Board of Commissioners. The Board shall have the authority to change the schedule of regular meetings, change the date of a regularly scheduled meeting, and/or change the meeting place without the necessity of approval of the Board of Commissioners.
2. The annual meeting shall be held at the time of the first regular meeting of each fiscal year. The business transacted at this meeting shall include the election of new officers.

3. A simple majority of the existing Library Board shall constitute a quorum for the conducting of all business.
4. Special meetings may be called by the Chair or upon the written request of three members for the transaction of business stated in the call for the meeting.


**Article VI: Procedures**

1. The rules of procedure for the conduct of business shall be those adopted by the Henderson County Board of Commissioners for the conduct of its business, excepting those sections that conflict with these Bylaws or are not applicable to this Board.
2. The order of business at the regular meetings shall be as follows:
  - a. Roll call
  - b. Disposition of minutes for previous meeting(s)
  - c. Public Comment
  - d. Communications
  - e. Director's report
  - f. Financial report
  - g. Committee report
  - h. Unfinished business
  - i. New business
  - j. Board Member comments
  - k. Adjournment


**Article VII: Amendments**

Amendments to these bylaws may be proposed at any regular meeting and shall be voted upon at the next regular meeting. Written notice of the proposed amendment(s) shall be sent to all members at least seven days prior to the voting session. A simple majority of the Library Board shall be sufficient for adoption of an amendment. Such an amendment would then be subject to approval by the Board of Commissioners. However, the Henderson County Board of Commissioners may repeal, amend or replace these bylaws at such times as they may determine.

## RESOLUTION

**WHEREAS,** both the North Carolina Senate and the North Carolina House of Representatives have legislation under consideration to assist North Carolina County Governments with the financing of local K-12 school capital projects; and

**WHEREAS,** the distribution of funding, whichever proposal is ultimately signed into law by the Governor of the State of North Carolina, is of critical concern to the Board of County Commissioners of Henderson County North Carolina and the taxpaying citizens we represent; and

**WHEREAS,** funding formulas for distribution that have been proposed greatly diminish the amount of funding that would be available to the Henderson County Board of Commissioners and our tax paying citizens; and


**WHEREAS,** legislation should be based upon the number of students enrolled in each county school system, and reward local efforts to fulfill county financial obligations to fund the construction and maintenance of local school capital projects, creating a partnership between the General Assembly and North Carolina Counties for the benefit of our students and educational facilities;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** that we, the Henderson County Board of Commissioners, hereby respectfully request that the General Assembly of the State of North Carolina distribute any available funding for the purpose of school capital projects on a per pupil allocation based upon Average Daily Membership (ADM), and, require a local match, dollar for dollar, in County funding to access those funds.
